ELIHU LOCKWOOD

Son of Peter and Betsey (Kirby) Lockwood.
Born in Stamford, Conn.

Was a lawyer of considerable eminence; removed
to Mobile, Alabama, where he practiced his profession
with distinction. He was unmarried.

Was returned to the House of Representatives of
Alabama in 1847. Was a lawyer and a member of the
Judiciary Committee, and introduced the first charter
of the Mobile & Ohio R. R. He was re-elected in 1849,
and in 1853 was the nominee of the Whig party for
Congress, but was defeated by Col. Philips.

*ELIHU LOCKWOOD. 1829

Born in Stamford, Conn.; Died July 5, 1883, at Castleton, N. Y.

Entered from Charlton, N. Y. . . . A. B. 1831; A. M. 1834; Φ B K.

Counselor at Law. Admitted to the Bar at Rochester, N. Y.; practiced in Mobile, Ala. for many years before the Civil War; was also interested in mercantile business there; became part owner and manager of a line of steamers running between Mobile and New York, and removed to the latter city before the War.

Member House of Representatives, Ala., 1847-53, and on its Judiciary Committee; introduced the First Charter of Mobile and Ohio R. R.; Whig nominee for XXXIII U. S. Congress.
