Y.; practiced in Mobile, Ala. for many years before the Civil War; was also interested in mercantile business there; became part owner and manager of a line of steamers running between Mobile and New York, and removed to the latter city before the War.

Member House of Representatives, Ala., 1847-53, and on its Judiciary Committee; introduced the First Charter of Mobile and Ohio R. R.; Whig

nominee for XXXIII U.S. Congress.
