KUALA LUMPUR: Diver Cheong Jun Hoong will not be defending her 10m platform individual title at the World Aquatics Championships in Gwangju, South Korea, from July 12-28.

The 29-year-old is still on the mend after undergoing surgery on her right knee in August.

But the good news is, according to Amateur Swimming Union of Malaysia (Asum) secretary Mae Chen, the diver is now back in train-



"She has a bit of a twitch in her lower back which is why she stayed back," said Mae.

"We want her to focus on the World Championships which is more important. She'll be fine then."

Leong Mun Yee, Wendy Ng, Nur Dhabitah Sabri and Kimberly Bong will also be flying to Gwangju.

The men will be represented by Jellson Jabillin, Chew Yiwei, Muhd Syafiq Puteh, Hanis Nazirul Jaya Surya and Ooi Tze Liang.

The divers will undergo a training camp in Wuhan, China in June before departing for the world

meet.
