K. DALLAS PAPERS

Kenneth McKenzie Dallas (1902-1988) B.Com was lecturer in Economics 1933 - 1967 (Senior Lecturer from 1951), except while on active service in the Navy 1941-45, and he was Director of Tutorial Classes from 1933 to c 1940. He was educated at Launceston High School 1916-1920 and at the Teachers' College, Hobart, 1920-24. He entered the University of Tasmania in 1921, studying commerce under D.B. Copland, J.B. Brigden and T. Hytten and graduated in 1928. He taught in school and the W.E.A. in Launceston and was president of the Launceston W.E.A. From 1931 to 1932 he was lecturer to the W.E.A. in Newcastle but in 1932 he was appointed to the University of Tasmania as lecturer in economics.

Correspondence 1933 - 1987

Correspondence relating to research, publications, study leave etc and news from colleagues. Subjects include old mills, water power and early turbines, etc including correspondence from works in Europe, America and Tasmania; horse power; trade routes and shipping, etc. Correspondents include Prof. T. Hytten, A.L. Meston (1934), C.S. King, Prof. Gerald Firth especially while K.D. was on study leave 1955-6 and when Firth returned to Europe in 1965, Daniel Byrnes, G. Blainey (1981) and many other colleagues, historians and engineers about mills, turbines, hydro-electric power and study leave visits and publications. Alan Marshall wrote about books, horse power, his grandfather a friend of the Henty family, the Czech film of his book "I can jump puddles" and said that K.D. was "the only person I know who looks at the Australian scene and the Australian people with the same eyes as myself". Frances Canning the Assistant Librarian wrote during the War, 1941-1944, with news of the University and staff and students. For example she reported that: Mr Preshaw was navigating officer on a destroyer, K. O. Shatwell was home on leave, Dr Walker dashed back and forth to Canberra, Doug. Anderson was trying for a commission as an engineer, while at the University Prof. Dunbabin was digging the caretaker's garden for vegetables, shelter trenches had been dug and extra huts had appeared, the library was well used but keeping order difficult, and books sent by K.D. much appreciated. She also wrote of the new Hobart bridge and the young engineer, A.W. Knight, who was doing economics I, the site for the new university and the meager funds allowed to build it. There is also correspondence with the Government Immigration department with reference to Dr Polya and G. Walker and the approval of K.D.'s passport, and correspondence with publishers and also with *Walkabout* magazine about an article on aboriginal carvings.

WORKERS' EDUCATIONAL ASSOCIATION

Ken Dallas was connected with the W.E.A for most of his life, as lecturer, branch president or secretary, and as University Director of Tutorial Classes 1933 to 1940

The University undertook the conduct of tutorial classes for the W.E.A, first through an Extension Lectures Board and then from 1920 classes and meetings were managed conjointly by the University and the W.E.A through a Tutorial Classes Committee consisting of 4 members appointed by the University Council and 4 nominated by the W.E.A. A member of the University teaching staff was appointed as both Director of Tutorial Classes and secretary to the Committee. Herbert Heaton was the first extension lecturer appointed in 1914 and lectured in economics and history. Professor Torleiv Hytten was appointed first Director of Tutorial Classes in 1920. In 1933 K.M. Dallas became Director and lecturer in economics and history. E.W. Turner was Chairman of the Committee. In 1944 the Government appointed a Board of Inquiry into adult education, chaired by Sir John Morris, and following its report a State Adult Education Board was established with Sir John as its first chairman.

Reports of the Tutorial Classes Committee were included with or annexed to the University Council's Annual Reports (bound with the *Calendars*), some more detailed reports and other papers are in the University's archives (UT 19) and some W.E.A secretary's correspondence (UT390) but no minutes of the Tutorial Classes Committee.

22 May 1941

Thank you for the two books about the Maoris . . . we have placed a [donor's] plate inside the cover I would have liked to have worded it more explicitly but was afraid of the fifth column. . . .

I am insisting that poor old Hickman [the caretaker not the biologist] be made to take a bath occasionally and change his clothes. Prof Taylor and Morrie [Prof. E. Morris Miller the Librarian] are arguing and wriggling not liking the job much, but I am determined that something shall be done for the poor old chap does st-- so.

. . . Today [Mr Dixon and Mr Dowsett] stood at the bottom of a ladder and discussed whether I would make a better burglar than detective, all this because I had found a book they could not locate. Dr Walker dashes back and forth to Canberra . . . Professor Hytten spoke about Norway on the wireless . . .

19 Sept. 1941

Just fancy Mr Preshaw [Registrar] a navigating officer on a destroyer, personally I expect her to be piled up any minute . . .

I sent you a small tin of toffee . . .

Dr McAuley just rushed in for a Dutch Dictionary. He has a Dutchman who does not speak English, coming over for a week on this glass polishing business [ie the Optics research undertaken by the University for the Ministry of Munitions].

27 Oct. 1941

Poor old Prof. Dumbabin . . . [digs] . . . in the caretaker's garden.

Tell Mr Preshaw he is much missed. The place is dirty and the garden almost squalid, new little buildings are springing up like mushrooms about the grounds.

20 Jan 1942

New buildings being rushed up at great speed and L. McAuley in charge of a new Department, more or less connected with the University. He has crowds of women of all ages there.

A bit of a skirmish here lately when Morrie decided to start a Professor's time book, the gossip goes that Taylor headed him off.

We have all laughed about the ships whaler, the painting of it by yourself.

16 Mar. 1942

Dumbabin . . . is getting a nice figure through digging the caretaker's garden. This is not the only disturbed earth about the grounds. I have never envied the mole and hope I shall not have to imitate one.

29 Sept 1942

They would not let us have our little break at Xmas.

Getting ready for degree exams and the Library is full with worried little people. . . I sit at my desk all day making sympathetic sounds.

The University is getting into a horrid mess. Dr. M. is getting past administration and poor Taylor mixes up efficiency with officiousness to such a degree that the result is chaos. . . . the place is plastered with typewritten notices . . . no student will read any notice.

4 Dec. 1942

Pamphlets and book being turned over with a great deal of interest . . . Prof King walked off with the one on India, would not wait until I had got it on the records.

K. O. Shatwell on leave from Africa.

Mr Preshaw used to enrage us all by saying no woman was worth more than £2. 10. a week.

Blighter.

Maida Williams in Una's old job in [Economics] Department. . . . an offer of £6 a week from the Hydro.

Have been handling some of the Dumbabin Library lately, many of them very weighty books printed in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries, and they are heavy to handle . . . never was much good at lifting weights, it does make me feel so ill.

Such a row going on here between Taylor and the students . . . through the little Discussion Group leaving a gas fire burning in the Women's Common Room. . . . no meetings were allowed to be held here at all and they were not allowed to have the Library for their dances. Dr. Miller tried to keep friends with everyone (?) by saying the dust caused by the dances gave me a sore throat anyway.

You can imagine my resentment at this remark.

21 May 1943

Regarding the digging of trenches, I am far from popular with "them" as I made such fun of it all last year. We had regular rehearsals at first and the first one I went into the deep trench with the caretaker's cat's two kittens. Was grumbled at and told I had turned the rehearsal into a farce. Two weeks later they had another and I decided I had had enough and stayed in the library much to the annoyance of the Chief Warden (here) Prof. Elliott. He cross examined me backwards and forwards as to why I was not in a trench, and I suddenly remembered that I had not received any instructions as to my movements on these momentous occasions and so his case broke down. . . The A.R.P. came and made them do the things I had been advising.

Numbers have increased considerably. The help the Commonwealth government is giving to Univ. students is of course a factor, then I think some kids are dodging the manpower people. and they are working so hard. It is quite a common thing for every chair to be taken in the Library for many hours a day, they are there when we open and rarely clear out before six in the evening. But I have found it so hard to keep order . . . They were labouring under a great sense of injustice through the row over the Gas Fire with Taylor last year and took it out of everyone in authority they could. . . I have had to turn into something resembling a meat axe, and I don't enjoy it at all . . . their friendship meant such a lot to me.

Believe Mr Preshaw is ashore, poor man, did not get over his seasickness. [sometimes written Pressure],

Dear little Dr Triebel gets more and more dreamy. . . all the other men on the staff are very busy with their own work, with reduced staffs, and outside work as well. Poor old Dr Miller always seems in a hurry and it is hard to get him to stay with you long enough to hear any facts. Miss Bell [clerk Registrar's office] and I are planning to nail his coat-tails to a log of wood next term.

28 June 1943

Binns report on State libraries.

Books sent by K.D. from Morocco and Algiers.

10 Sept. 1943

Thanks for books.

Miss Bell killed - car run into by train at level crossing.

Snow storm in Hobart.

Peter [Canning] skiing with a young German, Dr McAuley's responsibility. Peter had to sign up for poor Hans with the police, as if he was a bundle of furs. Peter promised to see that he did not poison the lakes at National Park or kill all the snakes. The policeman on duty looked so puzzled at Peter's humour.

Our students are very young, younger than usual, and very noisy. I have to be very stern to keep any sort of order in the Library. Peter Sprent, Peter Burbury and Robert Flach outstanding.

Old lady Montgomery [in Ireland introducing] my friend Miss Mary Sharland from Tasmania. One man looked surprised and said "is Tasmania really a place, I always thought it was a disease sheep suffered from".

The stock route my father-in-law surveyed in another state early in this century is now used extensively, but not for the purposes for which he was sent to try and make a route.

18 Nov. 1943

Mr Preshaw back . . . They had a morning tea-party for him one day last week; I was livid with rage, fancy giving a man a "tea party" after being away for three years on active service. So prepare yourself to be met by the Vice-Chancellor carrying a teapot on your return.

A great deal of talk about the new University . . . [on the rifle range site] . . . we are troubled to hear that they expect to get between fifty and sixty thousand pounds only to build the new University, and as Chemistry alone say they will need a sixty thousand pound building we feel it is pretty hopeless.

12 Dec. 1943

Degree exams . . . went off without a hitch thanks to Miss Clarke. The staff are grumbly at their side of her work being neglected . . . it is time men began to realise that even a woman cannot do everything at once.

New Hobart Bridge . . . stiff blow from the south . . . pontoons almost broke away . . . and waves washed over bridge.

[Dallas visiting] Australian ship [met] Bill Hodgeman.

Received several parcels of books . . . American negro, Gandhi's Indian Home Rule.

Am alone again, we do not have any luck with assistants here.

23 June 1944

Ken Shatwell back, but on sick leave.

Megan Griffiths arrived as assistant.

McAuley's had a big party . . . typical McA. party. The hostess arriving long after army of the guests . . . Prof wandering about the sitting room with an axe ready to cut out the cars from the undergrowth as they slipped because of the frost.

We want a staff of four here now at least and I have had seven months alone.
