USING THE GUIDE

The <u>1994 Consumer's Guide to Fruits and Vegetables</u> lists Missouri farm operators who sell farm fresh products directly to consumers. While each operation is unique, these operators take great pride in providing nutritious, quality produce and products, along with personalized friendly service. A trip to the country can be more than a pleasant drive; it can be an educational and fun family outing. You will see how Missouri agricultural products are grown and harvested and meet the people involved.

There are four primary types of operators:


- <u>Pick-your-own</u> operations are located on the individual farm. You, the consumer, are able to select and harvest your own produce at its peak freshness.
- Roadside stands may be located at or away from the farm. The stands sell picked produce and offer a wide variety of other related goods.
- Greenhouses sell crops that need protection from winter cold such as bedding plants, vegetable transplants, house plants, cut flowers, potted plants and many others. Most greenhouses have plants and/or produce available for sale year round.

Farmers' Markets enable farmers to bring their produce and other products to sell at a common location. The variety of produce and goods is often very diverse. Because the produce available is determined solely by the growers participating, individual commodities are not listed. At many Farmers' Markets, the demand is high, so plan to arrive early. A special section highlighting Farmers' Markets located throughout the state begins on page 91.

The Consumer's Guide divides the state into eight regions. The counties within each region, along with the businesses within each county, are listed alphabetically. Also, each entry contains the name of the business, the contact person, mailing address, telephone number, directions to the operation, type of business, days and hours of operation as well as a list of produce sold.

A state map is located on page 3 to help you locate a particular county or region. If you want to know what is available locally, look under your region of the state and read through the entries in local counties.

NET WEIGHTS AND YIELDS OF FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

The fresh fruits and vegetables listed are grown in Missouri and are sold at roadside stands, farmers' markets and pick-your-own farms. Common retails units, their equivalent weights and approximate yields for canning and freezing are tabulated for use in this section.

RETAIL CONTAINERS

Many different kinds and sizes of containers are available for retail selling. Some of the more common ones are listed below.

Wood Baskets - round wooden baskets in sizes of 1/4 peck, 1/2 peck, 1 peck, 1/2 bushel and 1 bushel.

Boxes, shipping cartons and hampers - usually made of corrugated paper, often waxed and ranging in size from 1/2 peck to 1 bushel.

Trays - shallow corrugated paper trays are often used on pick-your-own berry farms. Common sizes hold 6 to 8 dry quarts (10 to 15 pounds).

Fruit and vegetable baskets - often made of corrugated paper in sizes from 2 to 8 dry quarts with carrying handles.

Fruit tills or cups - small containers of 1/2 dry pint to 4 dry quarts. They are made of several materials: pulp, cardboard, corrugated paper, plastic and wood. Quart berry cups are familiar in most markets.

DEFINITIONS AND CONVERSIONS

Bushel = 32 dry quarts, 64 dry pints or 2,150 cubic inches.

Peck = 1/4 bushel, 8 dry quarts or 538 cubic inches.

Gallon = 4 quarts or 231 cubic inches (liquid measure).

Quart = 58 dry cubic inches.




