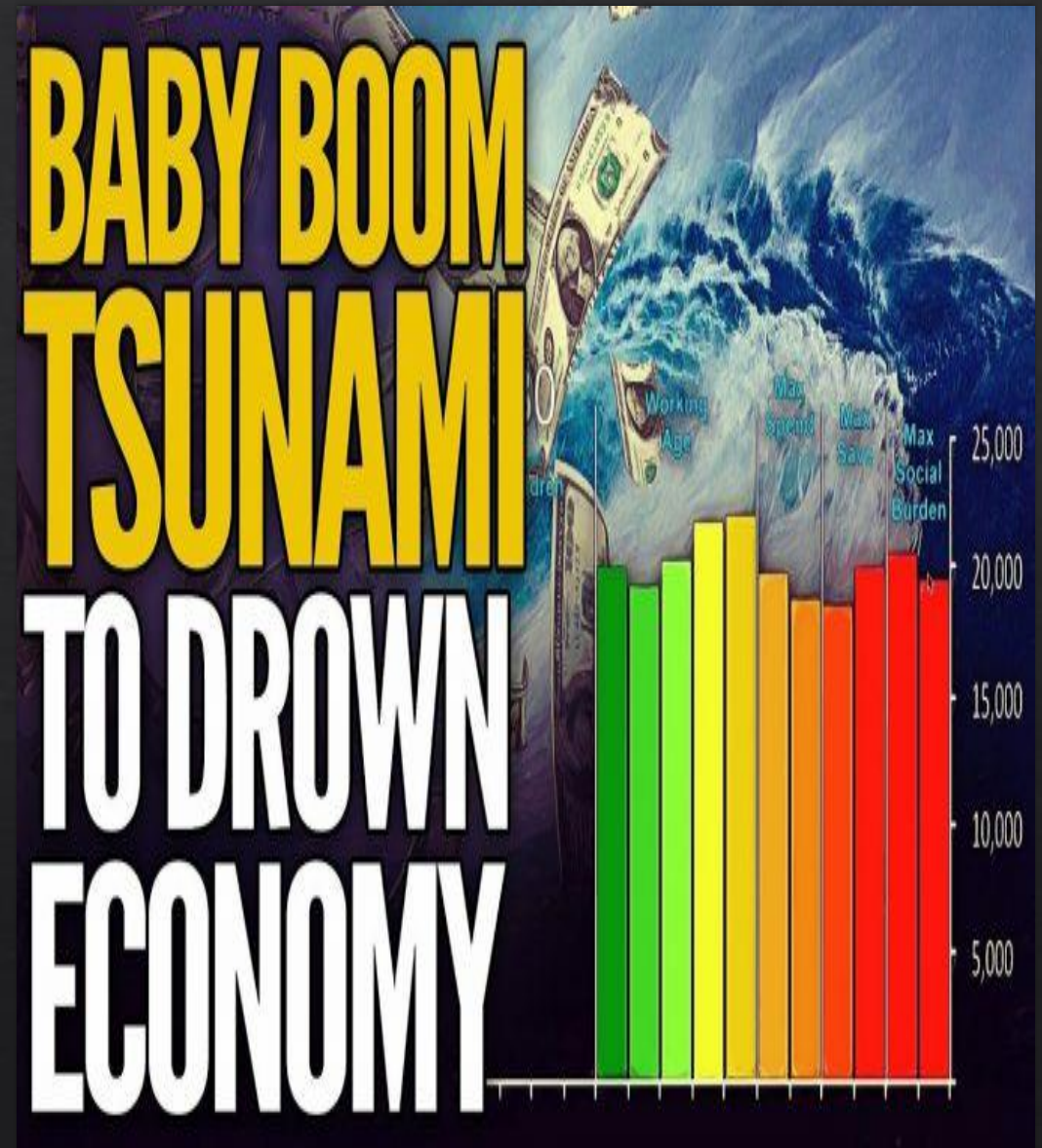
Participatory Citizenship

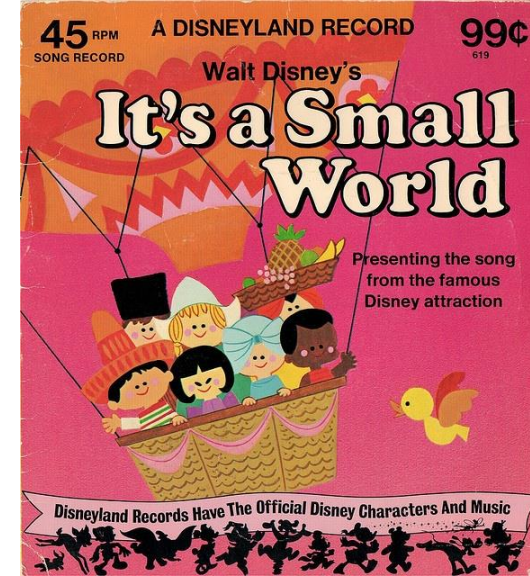

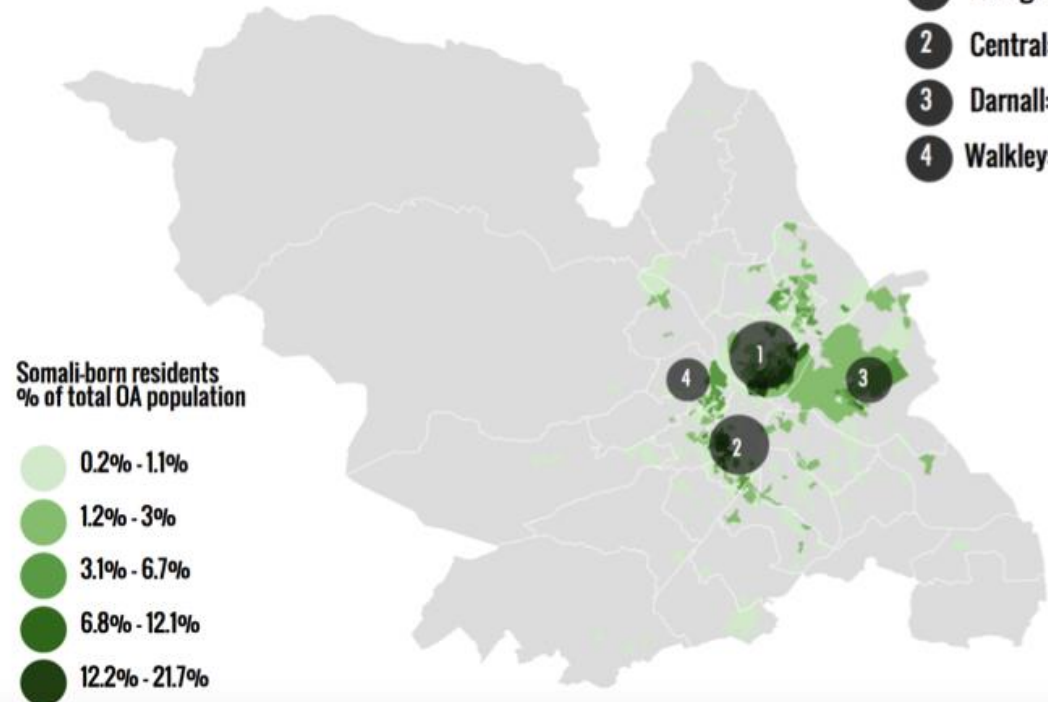


The Somali community: one of the oldest minority ethnic communities in Sheffield

- 4 Walkley: 172 (0.8%)



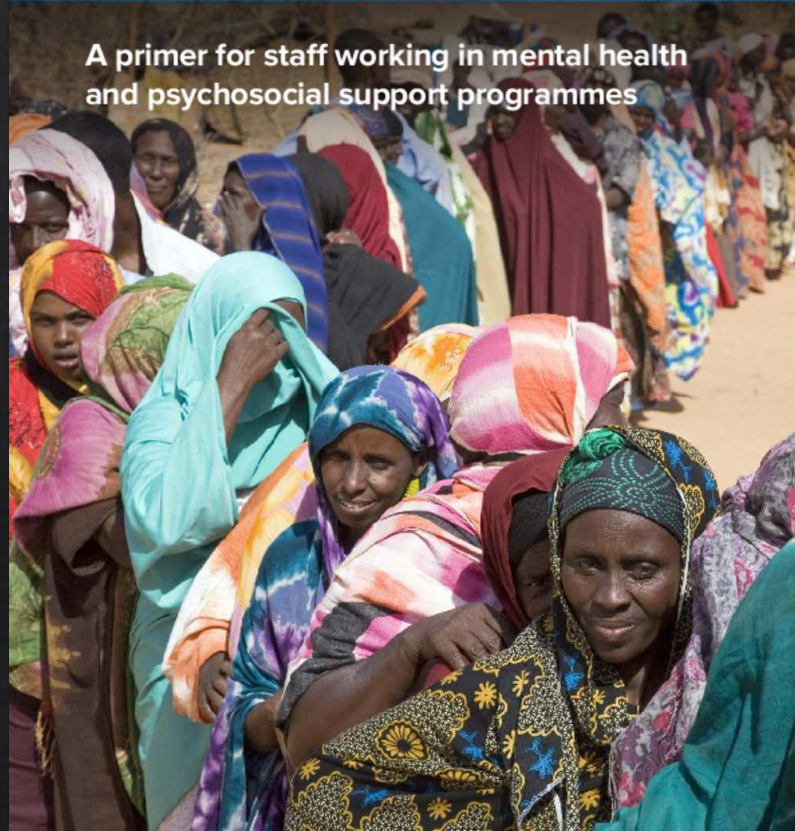
