CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

During the last four decades many changes have taken place in public education in this country. Greatly increased enrolments have brought more and more pupils into our schools who in former times would have not been permitted to remain. Children of various capacities and aptitudes now fill our schools to overflowing; the bright and the slow, the academic and the non academic, the large and the small, the rich and the poor, the emotionally stable and those who lack balance. This wide variation of traits in the new student enrolment has necessitated a new look at the whole educational picture.

The New Aims of Education -- This new look has resulted in an entirely new set of aims over those of four decades ago. Then teachers and schools were concerned about academic things. Teaching the three R's in an efficient manner constituted the chief work of the classroom. With changes in enrolment causing such wide variations in the student body, with changes in family life reducing home attention to the needs of the child, with changing economic patterns bringing increased leisure - with all of these came a broadening of the demands on education and a broadening of our views regarding the aims and obligations of the schools. Now for the first time the schools were asked to train for Worthy Home Membership, for Ethical Character, for Making a Living and for other broad programs of a like nature.

Training for Leisure -- One of the new fields to be given much attention in the new Aims of four decades ago was that of training for leisure time activities. It had become evident even then that the work-week was being reduced and it was thought the trend would continue. The correctness of the prediction is seen in the recent platforms of labor organizations calling for a thirty hour week. If the work week is reduced the leisure week will be increased and it may well be that problems of delinquency and other forms of social unrest depend for solution largely on what the schools are able to do in training for leisure time activities. Before training for leisure can be effectively performed, much information must be collected regarding what pupils normally do in their leisure time so that the schools can build on that base. For this reason, as well as for aid in motivation and other teaching devices, many studies of interests and hobbies have been made and the picture is rather complete. That is, it was complete until television came to the United States.

Television and Leisure Time -- Perhaps no ther entertainment medium has had such a sudden and wide-spread adoption in any country as has television in this decade in the
United States. So sudden has been the adoption that educators are still pondering on the ultimate effects in terms of
lasting changes in leisure time activities and pondering on
the changes in habits of children of school age. What effect
has it had upon their interests, their hobbies, their reading,
their health, their school attitudes, their homework?

This Problem -- This problem was undertaken in an attempt to get an answer to some of these questions. It was thought that considerable light might be shed on the problem if information could be obtained on the leisure time of pupils in a town where very little television could be found and, later on, further information could be obtained in the same town when television became more general. This before and after method has obvious weaknesses but even with these weaknesses it was felt the information would be of sufficient validity to be of much value. This study concerns itself with the first part of the problem - the "before television" phase.

CHAPTER II

THE PROBLEM

This study is a survey of the leisure-time interests and activities of a number of children whose homes have no television sets.

Subjects in the Study -- The subjects in the study were those fourth, fifth and sixth grade pupils in the public schools of Greenfield, Massachusetts who have no television in their homes. The numbers of pupils are as follows:

Grade IV 138 pupile

Grade V 111 pupils

Grade VI 114 pupils

It is of interest to note that at the time the atudy was made the number of pupils who had television in the three grades was respectively 60, 125, and 92. Only the results from homes having no television are used in this study.

The Questionnaire -- Previous to making out the questionnaire used in this survey, numerous reading books were checked
to find the areas of greatest interest among children in the
intermediate grades. The teachers in grades four, five and
six checked the books used in their classrooms for areas most
frequently written about in the reading texts used in the
Greenfield Schools. Weekly papers, namely, My Weekly Reader
and Current Events were also checked for children's interests.
A survey of the reading workbooks which accompanied the readers was also made in order to gain further information con-

cerning leisure time activities. Bulletins on English and Reading which are issued frequently by the various teacher committees in the school system were studied carefully before deciding on the most important areas.

Personal observation over a period of three months helped to find the subjects in which children were interested in writing about in their English composition work.

Twelve fields of interest were finally chosen. These areas which it was felt would most attract the greatest number of students were the family, friends, pets and toys, leisure time reading, radio, movies, sports, hobbies, clubs, money, music and vacation interests.

Each area selected contained several sub headings which would give much more information about the child's life outside of school. In many cases it was impossible to get correct information by checking yes and no. Favorite books, toys, pets, radio programs, etc. were so numerous that the pupil was asked to write in the various names. Under the twelve main headings one hundred twenty blanks were left to be filled in.

<u>Items Covered in the Questionnaire</u> -- The items in the questionnaire were divided into areas as follows:

Area I. Family. Under this area were nine items to be filled in by the pupil. His initials, grade, age, sex and number of brothers and sisters come first. Activities enjoyed with the family in summer and winter come under this

heading. Next were spaces to be filled in stating what the pupil does to help his father and mother.

Area II dealt with Friends and under this heading come the number of close friends and what the pupil liked to do best with his friends in summer and winter.

Area III which inquired about pets and toys, checked the number of pupils who had pets and the number who took care of the pets themselves. Also under this heading came the child's bedtime, some things that he owned and the one he liked best. In this area the child checked whether or not he played out of doors every day. He also told what he would like to own for himself as well as for his family.

Area IV dealt with reading. Under this heading the pupil checked whether or not he liked to read, what type of book he liked best, his favorite part of the newspaper and any magazines he read each month. Also in this area the pupil told how much time he spent reading each day, whether or not he took library books and how often he reads them. The number of books owned was checked as well as the child's favorite type of book and where he obtained them.

Area V. Radio. Here the pupil checked whether or not he listened to the radio, how long he listened and which were his favorite programs with the time they were on. The favorite programs were also named.

Area VI. An area covering movies was included. This told whether the child attends movies and if so, how often and which type of movie was most popular with him.

Parorite actors and actresses, as well as favorite movies were named.

Area VII. The sports area included blanks for checking on a liking for sports. Favorite sports were to be maked as well as games played in summer and winter. A space was provided for best-liked indoor sports and games. A space was also provided for games the child went to see and how often he attended these games.

Area VIII. Under hobbies was space for checking whether or not the pupil had a hobby and is so, what it was. Spaces were left for collections made and things made with his hands.

Area IX. Spaces were left under Clubs for Scouts and other clubs, for meeting days, how often meetings were attended and whether these meetings occured at night or after school.

Area X concerned money. Under this section were spaces to check if the pupil saves money in a bank and also if he earned any each week. Space is provided to show how money is earned. The pupil checks whether or not he keeps all of his money for himself, whether he has an allowance and if so, what he spends money for each week.

Area XI. Under music, spaces were provided for checking if music lessons are taken, what instrument is played and how much time is devoted to practice each day. If records are owned by the pupil he checks that space and tells how often he plays them.

Area XII. The last area dealt with vacation interests. Here the pupil told if he goes away for vacation and if so, for how long. Blanks were left to be checked as to whether the vacation is spent in the mountains, seashore, country or camp. Family trips in the car were checked as well as travel by bus, car, train, boat and plane. In conclusion, the pupil states the most distant place to which he has traveled and his favorite vacation interest.

The Procedure -- The preliminary questionnaire having been prepared a trial run was made on a few teachers and the necessary changes made to correct ambiguous and misleading items. The final questionnaire was printed by the printing department of the Greenfield High School.

The questionnaire was sent to all fourth, fifth and sixth grade teachers in Greenfield accompanied by a letter of instruction for its administration. In order to avoid confusion all pupils were given the questionnaire. When completed by the pupils, the teachers were asked to mark TV on the front of each questionnaire completed by a pupil having a television in his home so that these could be easily eliminated. Complete cooperation was given by the nineteen class-room teachers.

The results of the questionnaire were checked and tabulated and may be found in summary in the following chapters.

A more complete tabulation of results may be found in the Appendix.

CHAPTER III

THE QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS

The more pertinent results of the questionnaire are shown in this chapter. For more complete results in each area one should consult the Appendix.

General Items -- The 363 children upon whose activities this study was based, came from families which consisted of parents and two or three children. The computed average was 2.5 brothers and sisters per family.

The average age of pupils in grade four was nine years and four months, while the reading age was ten years and one month. This shows the average reading age to be nine months above the average chronological age in this grade.

In grade five, the average age was ten years and five months, while the reading age was eleven years and four months. In this grade the reading age averages eleven months above the chronological age.

In grade six the average age was eleven years and five months while the reading age was eleven years and seven months, or two months above the chronological age.

The average reading age in all three grades was seven and one-third months above the average chronological age.

Summer Activities -- The results on Summer Activities are found in Tables I and II.

From Table I it is evident that American boys and girls enjoy swimming above all else in summer with baseball, fishing and other games tagging far behind. Table II shows the activities enjoyed most with their own friends in summer. It is to be noted that the same interests in such the same order are found as in Table I. Evidently these interests are paramount whether vacation is spent with family or friends.

<u>Winter Activities</u> -- The results on winter activities liked best are found in Tables III and IV.

From Tables III and IV it is evident that much the same sports and interests are enjoyed in winter whether the pupil is with family or friends. Skating, sliding, skiing are high on the list in each case. Snowballing is evidently a family favorite as is building forts. The development of an interest in basketball was to be expected. Of more interest is the sudden growth in the reading interest.

Helping at Home -- A section of the questionnaire was devoted to discovering what the pupils liked to do most in helping their mothers and fathers at home. A narrower

wariety of responses was obtained as was to be expected. The most frequent responses are given in Tables V and VI.

From Table V it is evident that the American mother most appreciates and the children have most interest in washing dishes, with doing housework a poor second. The gradual increase in an interest in doing nothing for mother is significant. Most of the preferred activities are ones such as dish washing that can be done in a relatively short time. The ones not preferred are those where the pupil is on call all his spare time, such as errand running. Table VI gives the results on activities to help father.

From Table VI it would appear that so far as helping father is concerned mowing the lawn, working in the garden and washing the family car are the most frequent and best liked occupations. It is to be noted that practically all such activities are of the out-of-doors variety.

Bed Time -- Of interest to educators is the time at which pupils retire. The question has been asked if television is keeping children up longer in the evening than was formerly the case. Table VII gives the results for these three hundred and sixty-three children of non-television homes.

From Table VII the median time of retiring for the various grades would appear to be between eight and nine o'clock for all three grades with the hour advanced a small degree for the upper two grades. A surprisingly large number are still up after nine o'clock.

Things Owned -- The possessions listed by children are a very good indication of interest and of leisure time activities because usually only those are listed which are liked and used frequently. A section of the questionnaire was devoted to gaining information on this phase. The results are found in Table VIII.

From Table VIII it is evident the great American sport is still baseball and the young people's dearest possession is his bicycle. Note the increased interest in fishing and planes and the decreased interest in dolls in the upper intermediate grades. In another section of the questionnaire the question was asked: What I would like for my family? It is interesting to note that in all three grades the response was television by a large margin followed in order by car and house - a very good indication it would seem of the high standard of living in this country.

Reading Interests -- Table IX gives the results of various questions on reading interests.

Very little evidence appears in Table IX to show any great divergences in reading interests in the three grades. All of those who like to read choose comics and funnies first with books and magazines equally in favor as second choice. There is some little evidence of a gradual decline in interest in comics and a gradual increase in interest in newspaper accounts of sports. This may be the beginning of interest in spectator sports so common in American adults.

The pupils were also asked to estimate the number of hours spent in reading each week. Although such estimates are usually far from accurate they do give some indication of interest in reading. The results are found in Table X.

The median hours spent in reading each day were approximately 1.5 for Grade IV, 2.4 for Grade V and 2.4 for Grade VI. This would appear to be high if only recreational reading is considered but it does at least indicate that the pupils like reading and spend considerable time in so doing. It will be interesting to discover if the increase in television viewing will decrease attention to recreational reading as some authorities fear or will the time be taken from

something else. Also it has been suggested that some of the great increase in cartoon stories and comics may be due in part to the childs search for stories that can be read rapidly and portrayed vividly.

The pupils were also asked if they obtained books from the town library with the following affirmations: Grade IV, 103; Grade V, 83 and Grade VI, 90 indicating a rather active children's division in the library.

Radio Listening -- Since radio listening was the forerunner of television, questions were asked regarding listening habits. The results are shown in Table XI.

The figures in Table XI are very interesting and rather disconcerting to the educator. On the average Grade IV pupils tend to spend from two to three hours listening to the radio with Grades V and VI indicating even more attention to this medium. Since the more vivid television would seem to be even more facinating to young people the number of hours spent viewing is likely to be even greater. The importance of this in leisure time education is obvious but no so obvious is its implication.

CHAPTER IV

STATEMENT OF PROBLEM AND CONCLUSIONS

CHAPTER IV

STATEMENT OF PROBLEM AND CONCLUSIONS

The Problem -- This study concerned the interests and leisure-time activities of those pupils in the intermediate grades of Greenfield, Massachusetts who had no television in their homes.

The Conclusions -- The major conclusions of the study were:

- (1) The students studied were average in chronological age but considerably higher in reading age in terms of national norms.
- (2) The summer activities most frequently enjoyed with the family were swimming, baseball, fishing with picnics, hiking and camping listed by lesser numbers.
- (3) The most frequent activities enjoyed with friends in summer were swimming, baseball, hiking, biking and games.
- (4) The winter activities most frequently enjoyed with the family were skating, sliding, skiing, and building forts.
- (5) The most frequent activities enjoyed with friends in winter were skating, sliding, skiing and other games.
- (6) There was noted a development of interest in basketball during the fifth and sixth grade.
- (7) There was noted a decided increase in interest in reading during the fifth and sixth grades.
- (8) The most frequent interests listed in helping mother were doing dishes and doing housework with a few mentioning emptying rubbish and baby sitting.


- (9) The most frequent interests in helping father were mowing the lawn, gardening, washing the car.
- (10) Interest in and possession of a doll dropped rapidly in the fifth and sixth grades, interest in animals remained constant, and possession of fishing equipment increased considerably.
- (11) In listing the possessions they desired most for their familes the three most frequently listed by all were television, car and house.
- (12) Of the three hundred and sixty-three pupils, three hundred and fourteen indicated a liking for reading while only forty-nine indicated a dislike.
- (13) In indicating reading interests the majority listed comics, newspaper funnies, books, newspapers and magazines.
- (14) The pupils estimates of time spent in reading were ranged from one hour to five hours with a median of approximately two hours.
- (15) Approximately seventy-five per cent of the pupils made rather active use of the library as a source for reading materials.
- (16) Only six of the three hundred sixty three pupils indicated a dislike for radio.
- (17) The pupils estimates of time spent in listening to the radio ranged from one hour to four hours with a median of approximately three hours.
 - (18) Bed-time in the intermediate grades ranged from

six-thirty to ten-thirty with a median of approximately eight-thirty.

- (19) There seemed to be no well established magazine of general interest. Life, Colliers, Saturday Evening Post, Jack and Jill and Boy's Life were listed by many.
- (20) The favorite books were about mystery, adventure, animals and inventions. There was some indications of a drop in interest in mystery and an increase in inventions.
- (21) The favorite radio shows were Cisco Kid, The Shadow and Sky King.
- (22) Practically all of the pupils go to the movies on an average of once a week.
- (23) Many other items were included in the questionnaire covering such things as favorite actors, actresses and travel. For the results of these and more detailed results on the above twenty-three items the reader should consult the Appendix.

Evaluation -- As stated in the introduction this study was to be the before part of a before-after study of the effect of television on the interests and activities of intermediate grade pupils. It would appear at this time that the study was made too late. Although many of the pupils had no television it is true also that over two hundred and fifty pupils in the same grades did have television and it is very likely that already much visiting of neighbors to view television was taking place. This would cause some change in interests and activities although the amount and direction would

be difficult to measure. However, even with this limitation the study did serve as a good survey of the subject and as such it should prove of interest to all elementary school teachers.
