The History of FIU's Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine

Florida International University Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine arose from a community need for access to medical education and a projected critical shortage of physicians in the state and nationwide. In March 2006, the Florida Board of Governors of the State University System of Florida approved FIU's plans for establishing a college of medicine. In May 2006, the state legislature of Florida authorized the creation of the new college and immediately thereafter FIU began to develop an innovative, 21st century approach to health care and medical education. In the fall of 2006, FIU selected John A. Rock, M.D., MSPH, as founding dean and senior vice president for medical affairs of its new college of medicine.

In April 2007, the college submitted its application for preliminary accreditation to the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME). The application described a four-year curriculum plan that forgoes the traditional pattern of two years of basic science followed by two years of clinical training and instead integrates clinical and basic science over the entire four-year medical education experience. The program is anchored by a set of competency expectations with core clinical conditions and clinical skills required for every student. The program is a continuum of advancing complexity of study with a formal curriculum in professional development and one-on-one student-physician interaction in a variety of health care settings throughout South Florida. A required research component fosters a spirit of inquiry and supports the missions of the college and its parent university. A service-learning program, Green Family Foundation NeighborhoodHELP[™] fosters cultural competence and interdisciplinary teamwork, immersing medical students and students from other disciplines into select South Florida neighborhoods to advance individual and community health. In 2012, HWCOM launched a NeighborhoodHELP[™] Mobile Health Center that provides primary and preventive health care services to NeighborhoodHELP[™] household members in our communities. The college received preliminary accreditation from the LCME in February 2008, allowing the school to prepare to accept its inaugural class of students in the fall of 2009.

Since its inception, the college has completed each step of the accreditation process in the shortest time possible, achieving full accreditation from the LCME in February 2013. The college is on target to reach full capacity of 480 students in August 2015. In 2011, the university's faculty group practice, FIU Health, opened a state-of-the-art facility on the FIU Modesto A. Maidique Campus, expanding FIU Health's services and hours of operation to serve the health care needs of the community. A second FIU Health facility opened at Broward Health Medical Center in February 2013. The college employs a highly diverse faculty and staff, creating learning environments that foster the development of culturally competent physicians prepared to improve the quality of patient care.

On March 15, 2013, Florida International University Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine celebrated its first Match Day, with all graduating medical students matching to one of their chosen residencies. On April 29, 2013, convocation ceremonies for the inaugural class marked the culmination of the first full cycle of the Doctor of Medicine degree program at Florida International University.



Dr. Herbert A. Wertheim is an inventor, educator, scientist, eye physician, clinician, entrepreneur, philanthropist and community leader. Wertheim's enduring discoveries and contributions in eye care and other scientific fields have touched millions during his forty years of patient care and eye research. He and his research team have been granted more than 100 patents, copyrights and trademarks.

Wertheim founded Brain Power Incorporated (BPI) more than 40 years ago. BPI is the world's largest manufacturer of ophthalmic instruments and chemicals for eye care professionals and optical laboratories, with extensive research and manufacturing facilities in the United States and Europe. For many years, he had a clinical practice specializing in Visual Neurology and Optometry at the University Eye and Medical Center in Coral Gables, Florida. Wertheim was a distinguished lecturer in Physiological Optics and Optometry at the world-renowned Bascom Palmer Eye Institute and adjunct professor of physics in the graduate program at the University of Miami. He also served as director of the University of Tennessee Medical School Computer Center, directing more than 40 programmers and researchers.

Wertheim is a graduate of Brevard Community College and the University of Florida, where he studied electrical and computer engineering. He also received a B.S. in optical engineering and a Doctor of Optometry degree from the Southern College of Optometry in association with the University of Tennessee Medical School. Wertheim was awarded the Doctor of Science, honoris causa, from FIU for his distinguished scientific and clinical discoveries. He has completed post graduate studies at Stanford University, London School of Economics, Northwestern University, Harvard and IMD in Switzerland. He is also a member of University of Florida Blue Key.

More than 35 years ago, Wertheim was the first to publicize and stress to eye care professionals the prevention of cataracts and the management of other retinal pathology. He emphasized the fact that UV light was a contributing cause of cataracts and retinal deterioration. Wertheim's invention of UV-400 absorbers for eyeglasses as well as other discoveries have been beneficial in reducing cataracts and other eye pathologies.

Wertheim has served as chairman of the Board of Directors and board member of the FIU Foundation from 1988 through 2001. He is a founding member of the FIU Board of Trustees and served as chairman and vice chairman of the university's most successful capital campaign, which raised more than \$200 million.

As chairman of FIU's Academic Affairs Committee, he conceived, initiated and won the approval of the university's trustees for the College of Medicine and was asked to chair the Medical College Initiative. In May 2009, he and the Dr. Herbert and Nicole Wertheim Family Foundation made a \$20 million contribution that became \$40 million with state matching funds to establish multiple endowments. They support student scholarships, research fellows, leadership lectures, medical community advancement, and eight endowed chairs for the College of Medicine. In June 2009, the FIU Board of Trustees named the college the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine in his honor and named him founding chairman of the College of Medicine and trustee emeritus of the university.

In 2011, he was awarded the Horatio Alger Distinguished American Medal of Honor for his lifetime accomplishments in business and philanthropy.

The La Jolla Institute of Allergies and Immunology Board elected Wertheim to serve as a director and research advisor. This will give each institution the ability to benefit from shared educational, research and clinical knowledge and resources in the future.

Wertheim has served as chairman of the Dr. Herbert and Nicole Wertheim Family Foundation since 1977. It has supported hundreds of local and international educational, sporting and community health care organizations around the world with millions of dollars in financial aid grants.

Convocation Speaker



James Patrick O'Leary, M.D., FACS Founding Executive Associate Dean for Clinical Affairs Assistant Vice President for Strategic Planning, Office of Clinical Affairs Professor, Surgery FIU Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine

Dr. James Patrick O'Leary was born in New York City but quickly found his way to the South where he has remained. He graduated from high school in Winter Haven, Florida. He then matriculated at Belmont Abbey College in North Carolina where he graduated as Salutatorian of his class and was selected for the Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities. His medical school and residency

years were spent at the University of Florida where he was elected to Alpha Omega Alpha, the National Honor Society. He then served on the faculty at the University of Florida and in 1977 received the Hippocratic Award as the Outstanding Teacher in the college of medicine. Later, while serving as chief of the surgical service at the Nashville Veterans Administration Medical Center and professor of surgery at Vanderbilt University, O'Leary received the Shovel Award as the Outstanding Teacher at that institution. In 1984, he was appointed as the Seeger Chair in Surgery at Baylor University Medical Center in Dallas, Texas and as clinical professor at the University of Texas, Southwestern. In 1989, O'Leary accepted the position as the Isidore Cohn, Jr. Professor and Chairman of the Department of Surgery at Louisiana State University's Health Sciences Center in New Orleans, Louisiana. Subsequently, he served as the associate dean for Clinical Affairs from 2001-2006 and in 2002 and 2003 as interim dean of the medical school. Following in the tradition of his two previous academic appointments, O'Leary received the Outstanding Faculty Teaching Award from the Aesculapian Society in 1990 and 1995. He was also honored by both the Medical School at the University of Florida and Belmont Abbey College by being inducted to each of the school's Wall of Fame, honoring outstanding achievement by their graduates. An Honorary Doctorate Degree in Humane Letters was awarded by the Bradley Institute also at his Alma Mater. In 2001, he was appointed first vice-president of the Southern Surgical Association. In 2003, he received the Distinguished Service Award from the Southern Medical Association and in 2013 the Distinguished Service Award of the Southeastern Surgical Congress.

In addition to having authored more than 200 peer reviewed scientific publications O'Leary has been the editor of four editions of the Physiologic Basis of Surgery Textbook dealing with the basic sciences as they are applied to surgery.

As an authority in the field of surgical gastroenterology, O'Leary is an accomplished and sought after lecturer. In addition to his academic positions, O'Leary has been active in a number of regional and national professional organizations. He has held several positions with the National Board of Medical Examiners, including chairman of the Clinical Chairmen's Committee. He has served as president of the New Orleans Surgical Society (NOSS), American Society of Bariatric Surgery (now the American Society of Metabolic & Bariatric Surgery), the Southeastern Surgical Congress (SESC), the Association of Program Directors in Surgery (APDS), and the Louisiana Chapter of the American College of Surgeons (ACS). At the ACS, he has served on multiple committees—including but not limited to the seven SESAP Committees, as the director of SESAP X Audio Companion, as a governor of the College, and then chairman of the Executive Committee of the Board of Governors. He has served as vice-chair of the Advisory Council for General Surgery and as the first vice-president of the ACS from 2005-2006.

O'Leary retired from the Louisiana State University in July of 2007, but continued as Professor Emeritus and Chairman of the Department Emeritus of Surgery. Since July 1, 2007, O'Leary has been serving as the founding executive associate dean for Clinical Affairs and the assistant vice president for Strategic Planning of the Florida International University Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine.

Senior Class Gift Dedication of the Ceremonial Mace

The FIU Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine Class of 2015 would like to present our Founding Dean Dr. John A. Rock with this year's class gift: the ceremonial mace. Historically, the mace is a symbol of authority dating from medieval times when knights carried them during processions with their kings. Through the centuries, it has become a symbol of authority at academic institutions. A senior member of the faculty carries the mace during formal ceremonies, and it signifies that the proceedings have official sanction. As the third graduating class at the college of medicine, we have been invested in the growth of the college and have had wonderful opportunities to initiate many of its traditions. Our intention is to initiate this tradition as a final symbol of our legacy.

The FIU Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine mace stands 42" and is carved out of cherry wood. Atop the mace are bronze medals, on both sides of a cherry wood disc, portraying the college of medicine logo etched onto a scroll. The university letters are colored in FIU blue to represent the importance of the interaction and collaboration of our college with the rest of the university community. Beside the scroll, the serpent-entwined staff of Asclepius symbolizes the ancient Greek god of medicine and healing. This mace reminds us that the college is custodian both of the enduring traditions of medical education and of the power it bestows upon the students. For the student physicians, it will serve as a reminder of the long and arduous journey of our medical school career.

We proudly present the FIU Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine Ceremonial Mace to Dr. Rock and the faculty of the college of medicine with immense gratitude for their dedication to our education and training. GRATITUDE



Physician's Oath

(Patterned after the Oath of Hippocrates)

I do solemnly swear by that which I hold most sacred;

That I will be loyal to the profession of medicine and just and generous to all;

That I will lead my life and practice my art in uprightness and honor;

That into whatsoever house I shall enter, it shall be for the good of the sick to the utmost of my power, I, myself aloof from wrong, from corruption, and from the temptation of others to vice;

That I will exercise my art solely for the cure of patients, and will give no drug, perform no operation for criminal purpose, even if solicited, and far less suggest such a thing.

That whatsoever I shall see or hear of the lives of others which is not fitting to be spoken, I will keep inviolably secret.

These things I do promise, and in proportion as I am faithful to this, my oath, may happiness and good repute be ever mine – the opposite if I shall be forsworn.
