Take-Down Policies

Given our commitment to preserving the authenticity and integrity of the scholarly and historical record, it is unlikely that we will correct errors or inaccuracies present in original items; redact digital content or indices; or otherwise remove access to materials except in cases where there are legal concerns

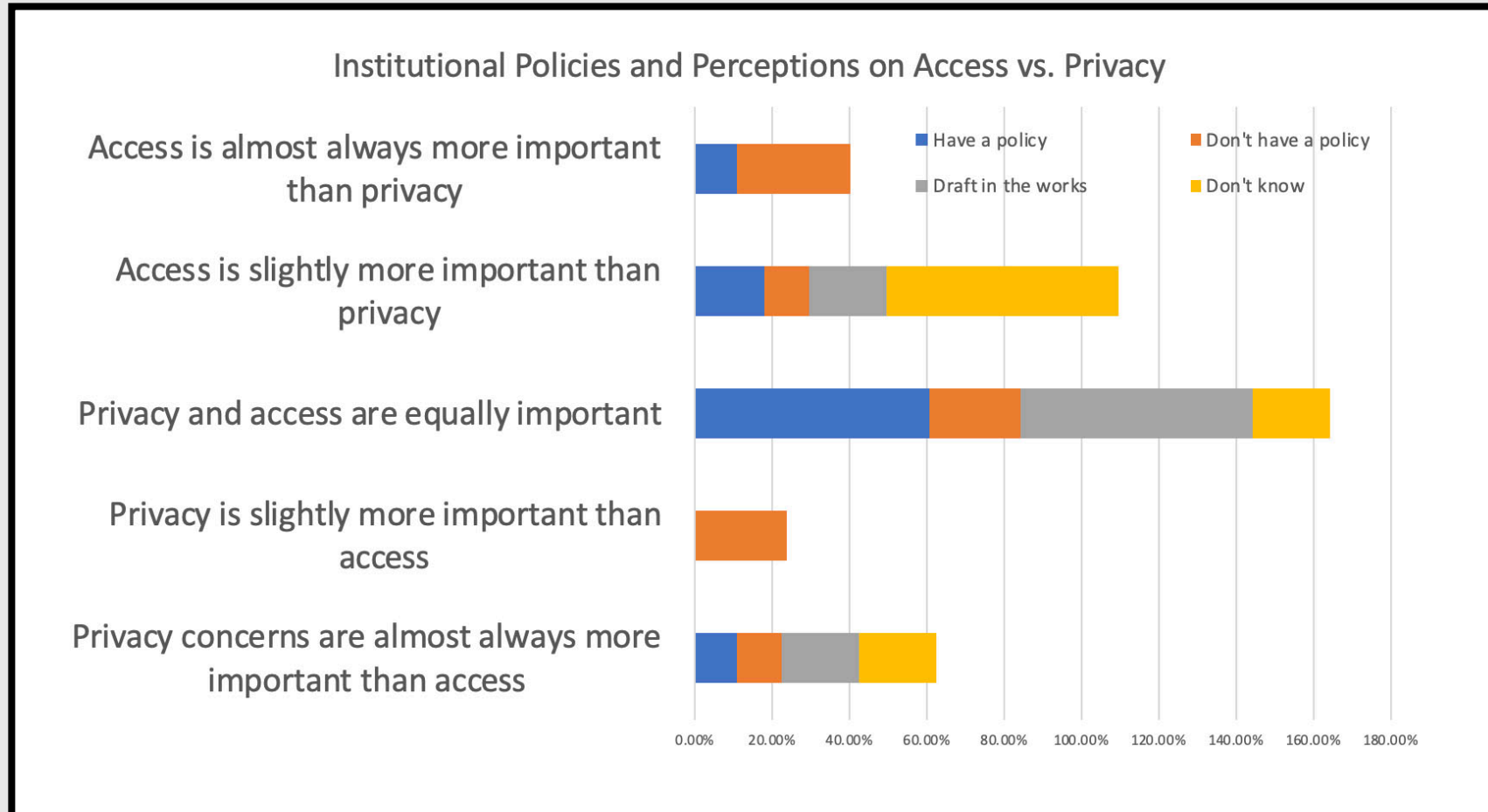

- **2014 Spanish court rules against Google**
- **RTBF = delisting**
 - Sensitive information
 - Information about minors
 - Served crimes
 - Does not serve public interest
- **95% of requests were to protect privacy**
 - Financial crimes served
 - Sex crimes – both victims and perpetrators

RTBF & GDPR

- Does not infringe on preservation & the historical record
- Is not the same as the Right to Privacy
- Freedom of Speech in the U.S. represents the greatest tension with this directive
- Move to make the GDPR an international human right

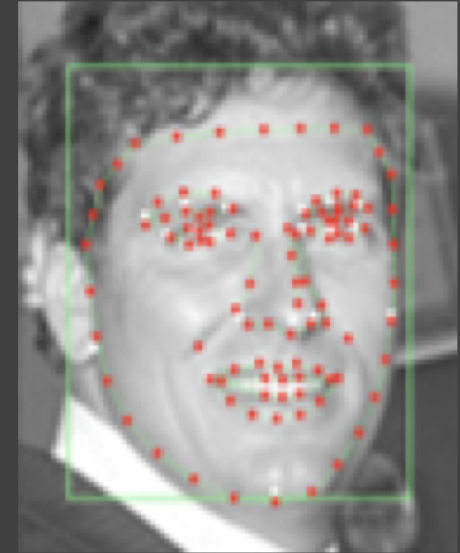
