Why is it difficult to discuss race relations with children?

- They are too young to understand race.
- I don't want to put racist thoughts in their heads.
- I don't want them to think white people are bad
- I don't want them to feel police officers are bad.
- What if I say the wrong thing?

Talking Race With Young Children

- Don't shush or shut them down if they mention race.
- Don't wait for kids to bring it up.
- Be proactive, helping them build a positive awareness of diversity.
- When a child experiences prejudice, grown-ups need to both address the feelings and fight the prejudices.
- You don't have to avoid topics like slavery. Instead, give the facts and focus on resistance and allies.

How to Talk to Kids about Race and Racism

- Actually talk about it.
- Set the example.
- Navigate their curiosity.
- Make it relatable.
- Address mistakes.
- Be an advocate.


