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### MASTER OF SCIENCE IN OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT

The **Operations Management Master of Science** program at the University of Arkansas focuses on the essential concepts, methods and tools needed to successfully manage work processes and people in a wide spectrum of organizations, including business/industry, military, government and non-profit. Geared toward the working student who typically holds a professional or management position in an organizational setting, the program offers live evening classes that meet in five 8-week terms per year. Courses are also available in DVD/CD, online and independent study formats.

The Operations Management curriculum emphasizes practical knowledge in such areas as project planning, quality management, economic decision-making, supply chain management, human behavior analysis, operations research, and many other areas of importance to today's manager. In addition to taking a core of four required courses, students are able to select from over 20 courses to make up the ten required to complete the degree. Through course selection students can also specialize in focus areas such as **Industrial Management**, **Business Management**, **Human Resource Management**, or **Health & Safety Management**. The University of Arkansas is accredited as a graduate degree granting institution by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

# <u> Meet Your Professor: Leonard Nethercutt</u>

Leonard Nethercutt has been teaching as a distance learning instructor for the University of Arkansas for more than 10 years, but also teaches live OMGT courses at the Little Rock Air Force Base site. In addition to our Accounting and Statistics undergraduate courses, he frequently teaches 5003 Introduction to Operations Management and 4873 Principles of Operations Research.

His assigned classes generally include Finance, Economics, quantitative methods and analysis, cost estimation, project analysis,

sis, and cost analysis. His education includes a BS in Accounting and MBA from UALR (Arkansas -Little Rock) and he also completed coursework toward a PhD in Business Administration with a concentration in Finance and minor in Economics from the University of Memphis. His dissertation is still in progress however, he has been published twice in academic journals due to his dissertation efforts.

His business background and experience includes several closely held business ventures



that run the gamut from management consulting services, multi-state retail operations in partnership with major oil companies, and wholesale petroleum distributor. He is from Mayflower, AR and is married with one daughter. He and his family enjoy activities with horses, golf, snow skiing, and fishing.

# MSOM vs. MBA: How They Differ

While our degree focuses on management skills for individuals who manage work processes, projects and people at various levels of any kind of organization, the MBA tends to deal more with high-finance, starting or acquiring companies, floating stock issues, and other matters of interest to top management or to entrepreneurs. There are always going to be more general management jobs than CEO-level positions. So while our degree will always be more practical and marketable for those wishing to advance in management, it compares particularly well now given the current financial crisis.
