Dear Nursery Plant Source List User:

This Nursery Plant Source List for South Dakota has been prepared as a guide for locating specific nursery items that may be available from South Dakota nurseries and garden centers. The list is intended for use in locating plants primarily by Nurserymen, Horticulturists, Foresters, Conservationists, Cooperative Extension Service Personnel and other Advisors. The list is not intended for distribution to, or for use by individual homeowners.


Much of the credit for the preparation of this list goes to Dr. James E. Klett, Associate Professor of Horticulture at South Dakota State University and Mr. Bruce Gabel, Horticulture Major Student at South Dakota State University. The assistance of State Plant Quarantine Officer, Stan Rhoads, is also acknowledged.

The information for the list was secured by sending a survey to South Dakota Nurserymen, Garden Center Operators and other Plant Dealers. They were asked to indicate on a master form all the plants they offer for sale. Each enterprise which returned the survey form was assigned an identification number. A list of the enterprises and their identifying number is a part of this report. This number is used following the various plants which would be available from this source. It is planned that the list will be revised as necessary.

The nursery plants included in the list are arranged alphabetically by the generally used common name. This is followed by the botanical genus and species name for the plant according to Hortus III, a concise dictionary of gardening and general horticulture. If cultivated varieties (cultivars), are available they are also listed.

It is hoped that this Nursery Stock Plant List for South Dakota will serve a useful purpose. It is somewhat of a nursery stock inventory and a buyer's guide. Its wise use should help to bring buyers and sellers together and also promote consumer education.

Restricted Plant List

The following "Restricted Plant List" of nursery stock was prepared primarily to assist the nursery dealer who might not be entirely knowledgeable about the true hardiness of these woody plants in South Dakota. It is intended to be of assistance in alerting this person of woody plants that generally lack sufficient hardiness to merit general recommendations for South Dakota.

The majority of plants on this list simply are not hardy in most of South Dakota. However, some vary in their degree of hardiness from those which fail to establish and overwinter the first winter to those that will perform satisfactorily if grown in sheltered protected spots. Other cultural factors besides hardiness also play a major factor in the survival of these plants including rainfall, humidity, wind exposure and soil conditions. Also, a few of the listed plants require special transplanting skills to survive and become established.

This "Restricted Plant List" is reviewed regularly and the involvement of any responsible individual is solicited. This list is published by the South Dakota Department of Agriculture and is reviewed annually at the South Dakota Nurserymen's Association meeting. The list no way precludes possible future introductions with these genera or species that might prove adaptable and/or hardy to South Dakota.

Every person has the right to buy any plant on this list if they wish to and each dealer has the right to sell it to them. However, any exploitation of any individual in the sale of this material, or promotion of this material as anything other than what it is, and without the complete disclosure of its limitations, inabilities or special requirements, plus any other pertinent information about these woody plants that the customer should be entitled to know, could be considered as nothing less than a serious lack of good business ethics. A fact that must be considered each time a nursery license comes up for renewal.

South Dakota Nursery Regulations

Summary of General Nursery Stock Requirements (South Dakota Rev. Code of 1939, Ch. 4.14 as amended 1955)

Definition of Nursery Stock. The term "nursery stock" shall include trees, shrubs, and other plants having a persistent woody stem; all herbaceous perennials; and parts of either of those which are capable of propagation, but shall not include forced plants of whatever nature while in bloom.

The term "hardy herbaceous perennial" shall mean a perennial plant used for ornamental purposes and generally considered adapted to South Dakota or a perennial plant used for other horticultural purposes and generally considered adapted to South Dakota, except bulbs.

General Shipping Requirements. Any nonresident nurseryman may obtain a certificate to sell nursery stock in South Dakota by filing with the South Dakota Secretary of Agriculture a certified copy of his State inspection certificate, together with a fee of \$2.50. The Secretary of Agriculture may waive the fee in case the applicant's State requires no fee from a South Dakota applicant for a like certificate in such other State. An agent's certificate will be issued upon request of his principal, for a fee of \$2.50. A dealer's certificate will be issued only to an individual obtaining his stock from a certified nursery and upon payment of a fee of \$15 to the Secretary of Agriculture. All certificates and permits expire annually on September 15 following date of issue.

It is unlawful to move or sell nursery stock which has not been officially inspected and for the sale of which a certificate or permit has not been granted. Each carload lot or container of nursery stock moved into South Dakota must bear an inspection certificate of the State-of-origin. It is unlawful for carriers to accept uncertified nursery stock for shipment. Uncertified nursery stock moving into the State must be reported to the Secretary of Agriculture by the carrier.

RESTRICTIONS ON INDOOR DECORATIVE HOUSE PLANTS
DESTINED TO CALIFORNIA AND ARIZONA¹

1. Privately owned, indoor, decorative houseplants (other than prime hosts of burrowing nematode*) are admissible to California, subject to border or destination county inspection for freedom from serious pests. No state of origin inspection certificate is required.
2. Privately owned, indoor, decorative houseplants that are prime hosts of burrowing nematode:

- (a) Must be in the owner's possession for one year.
- (b) Must be in at least a 4" diameter pot 4" deep to allow soil sampling.
- (c) Owner must provide a California address, and agree to surrender plant for destruction if it is found through laboratory analysis to be infected with burrowing nematode.
- (d) Prime host plants of burrowing nematode include:

Anthurium spp. - Anthurium

Calathea spp. - Calathea

Chamaedorea elegans (Collinia elegans) - parlor palm or Neanthebella palm

Citrus spp. - (prohibited by other quarantines)

Dieffenbachia spp. - Dieffenbachia or tuffroot

Hedychium spp. - ginger lily, garland flower or butterfly lily

Maranta spp. - prayer plant

Monstera spp. - Monstera or Ceriman

Musa spp. - banana

Nepthytis spp. - Nepthytis (sometimes labeled Syngonium)
