Once again, the year has passed quickly, but not without its share of successes, milestones, and changes. It has been a year of unprecedented growth for Dominican College.

Numbers alone (a record-breaking 1,100 students) cannot tell the whole story of this enthusiastic student body! Not only do you study and work hard in the classroom, you also understand the need to continually improve our society. More students than ever are now involved in community service projects, athletics and campus-life in general.

There are many examples of the community outreach of our student body. For example, the College's student government--ASDC--arranged for groups of students to work on Marin County habitat restoration, conducted a Valentine's Day Food Drive, organized volunteer assistance for the local Big Brothers/Big Sisters "Bowl for Kinds" and Campus Ministry's "Day at St. Anthony's," and coordinated activities with a food kitchen in San Francisco where students helped serve meals. Father Robert Haberman led the annual student trip to northern Mexico to offer health services and donations to barrio children. Further expanding the horizons of community, two Dominican students journeyed to El Salvador to establish a "sister community" for the College.

Here on campus, our own community is also being nurtured and improved. There have been forums to raise awareness of the more diverse 90's campus and a new Peer Support Program has been developed to provide counseling, referral and advocacy services to all students. Students, as well as faculty, staff and administration, all now benefit from our outstanding new food service, Bon Appetit and the expansion of Cafe Marron in Bertrand Hall. We have also continued our ambitious \$2,000,000 program of improvement projects by increasing parking and adding to and improving campus lighting for greater safety. New painting projects have spruced up the exterior of Caleruega Dining Hall and both the inside and outside of Pennafort Residence Hall.

Athletics took is an area in which we should take great pride. Our amazing Womens' Basketball team has continued to win games and honors. The team was selected as the top-ranked team in the country by the National Small College Athletic Association (NSCAA) and went on to win their second straight California Coastal Conference Championship. The team then was invited to participate in the NSCAA tournament in Illinois -- their first national tournament.

I have tremendous confidence in the College's ability to continue its impressive growth and to manage that growth intelligently. Our strength and stability grows perceptibly daily.

You, our students, play the most important role in the advances and plans for the College's future. We thank you for your involvement in the life of Dominican College.

I am proud to be the president of this growing and thriving college, with such a caring and dynamic student body. I salute you.

In the fall of 1989, on Shield Day, the seniors at Dominican College bestowed the shield depicted on the cover of this program on the Class of 1994. The shield consists of the Class of '94's motto--*Traditio Firma Perdurat*--and three symbols: an open book, a labyrinth and a green background. The book is meant to symbolize education and knowledge, the labyrinth represents the road of life that through education and knowledge we hope to understand, and the green of the background upon which the other two symbols rest, stands for hope. The motto translated means strong tradition endures.

Senior Hannah Joy Fernandez said this in the speech she gave at this year's Shield Day ceremony. "As a member of the Class of 1994, I feel privileged to have such a hopeful and inspiring motto. I challenge not only those in my class, but all who make up the Dominican College Community to remember it, to support it, and to join in keeping the Dominican tradition alive."

Isabel Allende **Doctor of Humane Letters** *honoris causa*

Isabel Allende's life and work exemplify the highest form of political, personal, and artistic courage. A native of Chile, Ms. Allende was a distinguished journalist, playwright, and author of documentary films in 1973 when her uncle, President Salvador Allende, was assassinated. She remained in Chile to fight the oppression of the new regime until her own life was directly threatened. Having fled with her family to Caracas, Venezuela, she wrote there her first novel, *The House of the Spirits*, a work that began as a letter to her dying grandfather and ended as a novel celebrating the resilience of the human spirit faced with personal and political oppression. In the mid-1980s, Isabel Allende moved to the United States. In the past twenty years she has published four novels, a short story collection, and several books for children. She has taught literature at Montclair College, the University of Virginia, and the University of California at Berkeley. Her work has been translated into twenty-seven languages and has received some of the most prestigious awards given to literature in Germany, Mexico, Italy, England, Portugal, and France, as well as the United States. She has recently been recognized with honorary doctorates from the University of Chile and the State University of New York, and induction into the Marin Women's Hall of Fame.

Marin County is proud to have Isabel Allende as a resident. She lives here not as literary recluse, but as active participant in fundraisers for causes such as the Marin AIDS Project, and as spokesperson for the new immigrants in our society. Her life exemplifies the dedicated commitment to community together with the artist's quest for truth and justice which are the highest ideals of academies of learning.



Rosemary Figone Faucette '67 **Doctor of Humane Letters** *honoris causa*

Rosemary Figone Faucette graduated from Dominican College as an English major with a minor in Psychology in 1967. In 1968, after receiving her Elementary Teaching Credential from the Education Program of Dominican College, she taught for six years in the Dixie School District in Terra Linda and pursued further graduate work at San Francisco State University, the University of San Francisco, and the University of California at Berkeley. Since 1980, when she began teaching in the Fayetteville School District in Arkansas, she has been teacher, scholar, and tireless advocate for the creative reform of educational structures and programs for faculty development. Through her teaching she has, by the testimony of her students, given them inspired direction that has changed their lives; through her public statements she has awakened the profession to complex reasons that good teachers leave the profession and the ways in which teachers can be renewed and saved. Her speeches and articles compel attention through clarity, wit, and passion, the same qualities that have made her admired and beloved by students in the classroom.

Among the awards Rosemary Faucette has received are the Phi Beta Kappa Award for Excellence in Teaching from the University of Arkansas, the Milken National Teacher Award, selection as Arkansas' Teacher of the Year in 1993, and selection as one of four national finalists for National Teacher of the Year.

Rosemary Faucette's career as an educator embodies the quest for excellence and truth that should characterize all institutions of learning. Children represent our society's future; through her creative, insightful work with children and those who teach children she has immeasurably enriched both their present and our future.

After she broke a finger and missed the volleyball season, Rogers recovered in time to make the women's basketball team as a walk-on.

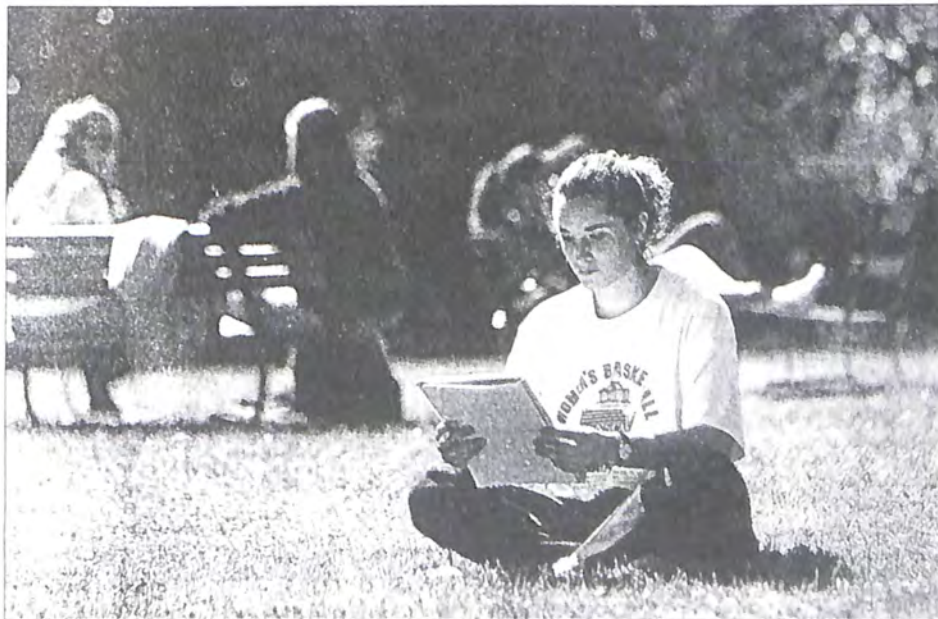
The rest is hoops history.

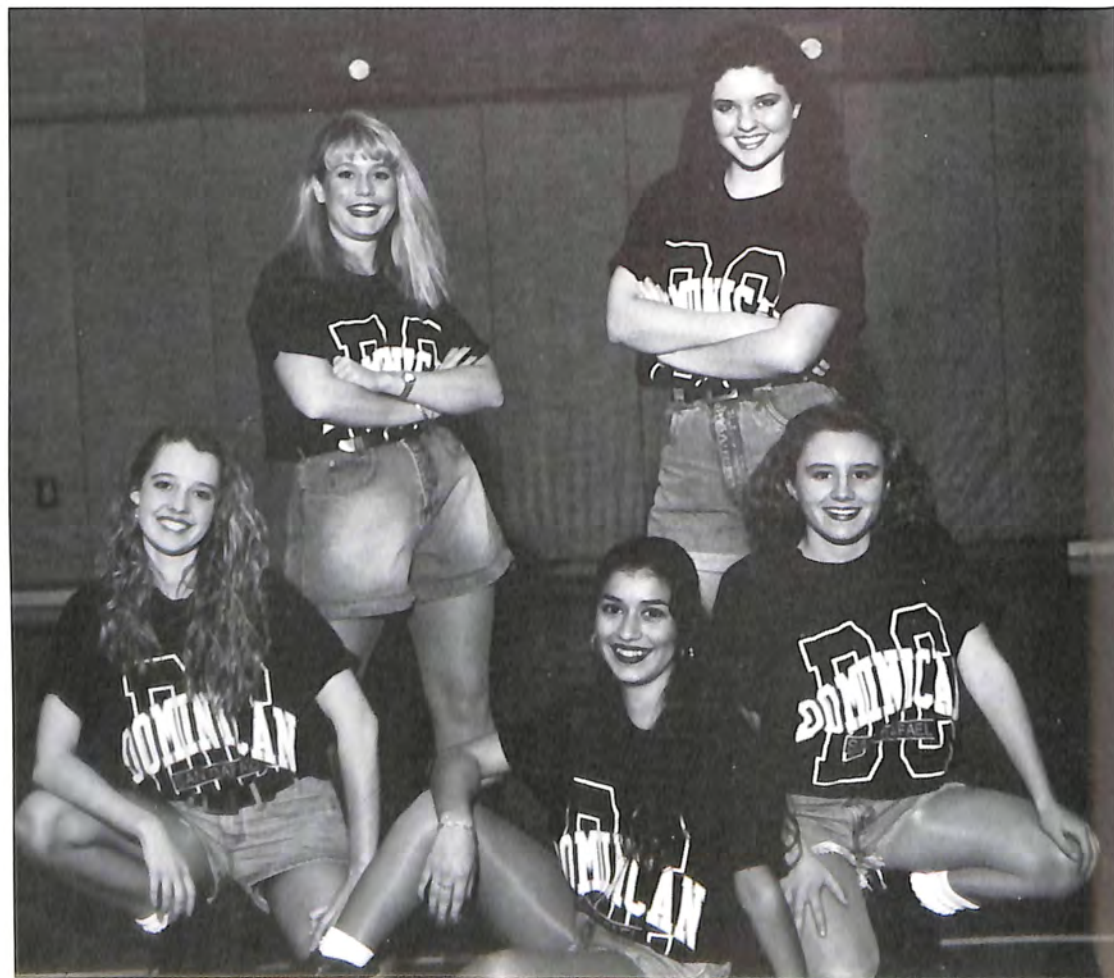

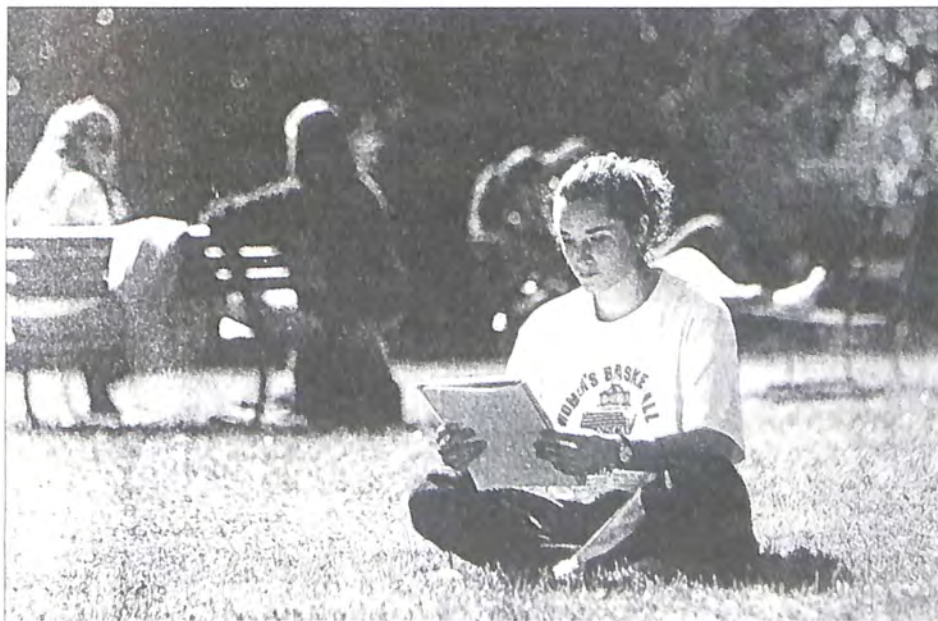

Dominican team ranked No. 1 in nation

Wins and championships have come in bunches for the Dominican College women's basketball team, and now this. The Penguins were selected this week as the top-ranked team in the country by the National Small College Athletic Association.

Dominican has a 5-1 record this season,

and they have won with style — averaging 80.7 points a game and holding opponents to just 49.3 points.

Last year the Penguins went 24-4 and won the Pacific Coastal Conference championship.

The team returned all of its starters from a year ago — but still, the current squad is young, with no seniors. And that bodes well for future seasons.

"The team is stronger this year, we have a

lot more depth than ever before," said Dominican athletic director Bill Fusco.

"Our recruiting efforts really paid off, we have a super crop of freshmen come in this semester. I think this is the main difference from last season."

Then Fusco even went a little further in his praise. "I believe that we could possibly start five of our freshmen in most games," he said, "and still be competitive."

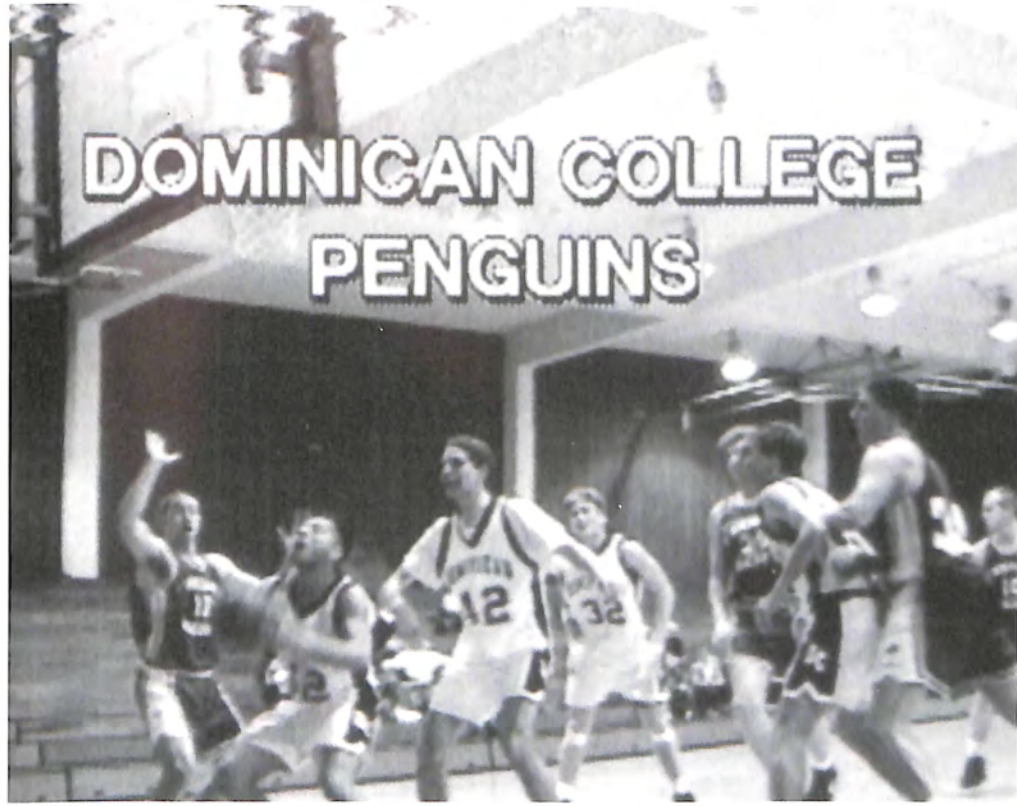
Junior center Jennifer Rogers leads the

The next Penguin home game is Jan. 19, hosting Mills College at Marin Catholic High at 7:30 p.m.

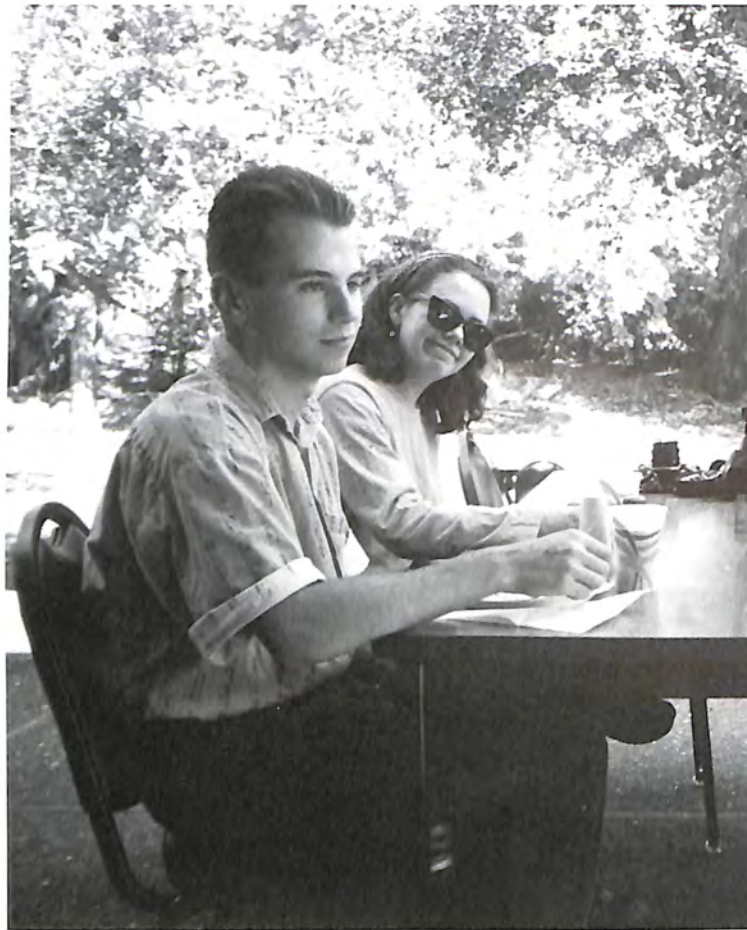

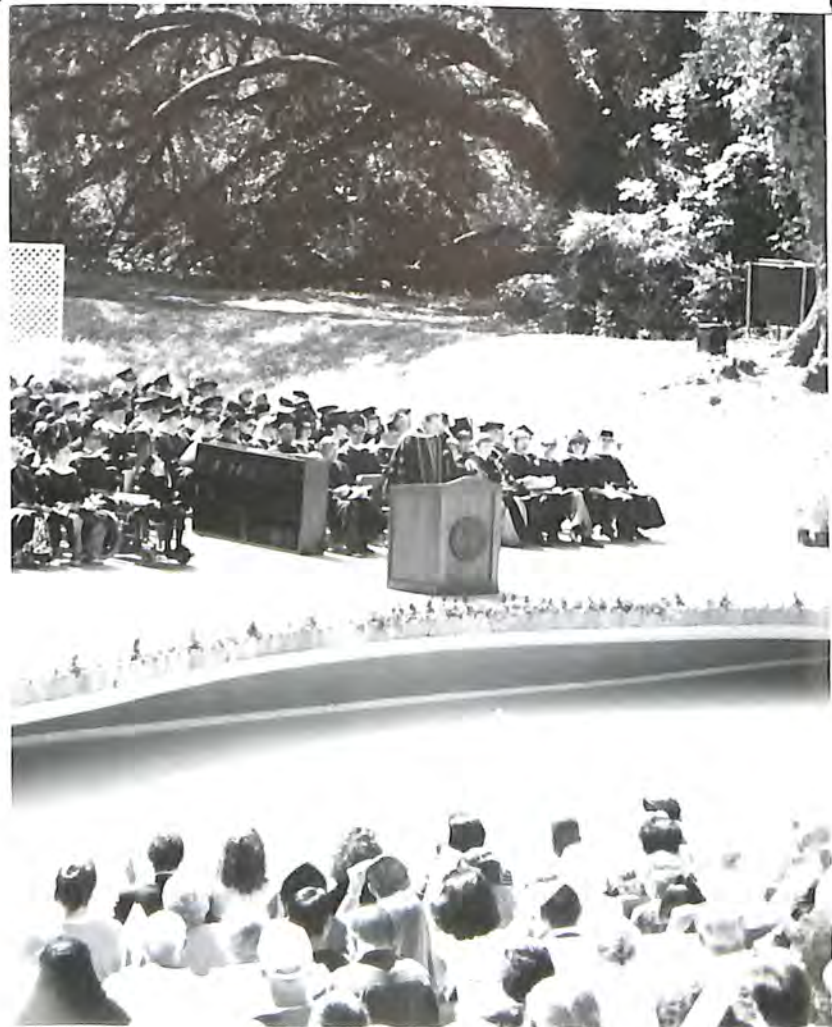
