#### The Carolinian

The Carolinian, a weekly student newspaper for the North Carolina College for Women (now The University of North Carolina at Greensboro), was <u>first published</u> on May 19, 1919. The paper was started to create a "living, pulsing publication which recorded our activities at short intervals, while they were still new and vivid" (The Carolinian 1919).

New issues of *The Carolinian* were usually published between September and May for an average of twenty-eight issues per year. During the summers of 1922 and 1923, *The Summer Carolinian* was published to cover the months of June and July. Each of these short runs was comprised of five issues. Currently, all available issues through 1976 are online. Newer issues will be added to the online archive over the next few weeks and should be complete by the summer of 2012.

As an ongoing student publication, *The Carolinian* is still published weekly as a physical newspaper and is also available online at <u>carolinianonline.com</u>.


