 - Module: more focused on a specific topic or skill (like identifying peer-reviewed articles)

Template and script requirements



- ◎ Shorter text areas are encouraged
- ◎ Each script page should include at least one visual element (video, image, infographic, etc.)
- ◎ Each module must have be 5-10 pages and a quiz
- ◎ Aim for no more than 300 words for page
- ◎ Each page in the module must include a quick check of some kind (a quick multiple choice (multi or single answer), true or false, drag or drop, fill in the blank, matching, etc that the Online Learning Librarian will make in [H5P](#))
