Digital Citizenship/Technology Resources:

- Teens, Technology, and Sleep Patterns Many parents have kids or teens with devices in their room during bedtime, and many of have fought to change that and felt defeated. Parents may hathings like: "I go to bed before my teens, so there is no way famake sure they turn them in, so I have given up." Or, "They screens, so why even try." Or "They have to do homework lat night, so why even have a rule about this?" Do any of those source familiar? Today it is all about answers. We are sharing with you rules and solutions other families have come up with around how to keep devices out of the bedroom during sleep hours.

- Myths and Truths About Kids' Internet Safety If you believe everything you hear about kids online, you might think pedophiles and cyberbullies are around every cyber-corner. Yes, there is bad stuff out there. But the truth is, there's a lot of good, and some experts are arguing against a "techno-panic mindset" that worries parents unnecessarily. The bottom line is that we can't keep our kids safe if we don't know the facts. Read on for the five most popular myths about Internet safety -- and the truths that can set your worries free.

- Social Media Red Flags Parents Should Know About It can be hard to keep up with the latest apps that kids are using. Just when you've figured out how to talk to your kids about <u>Instagram</u>, they're begging to download <u>Snapchat</u> and <u>TikTok</u>. But here's the deal: Even when new apps come along, adding new features such as the ability to disappear or track your location, they're often not that different from other apps. And if you know what to look for, you can help your kid avoid some common social media pitfalls such as <u>drama</u>, <u>cyberbullying</u>, and <u>oversharing</u>.
- Technology Integration Tool Our staff is piloting a new tool to help us manage and monitor student technology use at OMS. Relay Classroom is a tool to help teachers facilitate and manage students' Internet activity during class. With Relay Classroom, teachers can monitor web traffic, respond to the students who need help, and so much more. The Relay Classroom layout is comprised of three sections that make it easy to manage students' web activity during class. These sections include: Sharing access to classroom resources, supporting and responding to student progress, and monitoring students web activity at school. The Classroom Relay support tool will help us administer the RSU 26 Computer Acceptable Use Policy and use technology resources in the classroom to enhance the value in the learning process and prepare students for future success.
