The Lasting Impact of Trauma

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Purpose of Proposal:

- To develop education for parents and caregivers of children who have been traumatized.
- Traumatized children are considered to be at a high risk for developing delinquent behaviors related to the lasting effects of trauma.
- Education for parents and caregivers aimed at providing assessment and proper care with early intervention can improve outcomes for at risk children.

Background:

- Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE)
 cause permanent changes to the brain and
 impact future physical and mental health.
- Delinquent behaviors are often punished rather than identified as the result of traumatic events and treated with trauma informed care.
- Educating the families of children with an ACE in trauma informed care has been proven effective in Foster Families.



ACE Questionnaire

- Physical Abuse
- Sexual Abuse
- Emotional Abuse
- Physical Neglect
- Family Mental Illness
- Mother treated Violently
- Divorce
- Incarcerated Relative
- Substance Abuse

Methods:

- Offering the ACE questionnaire to parents allows for the identification of childhood traumas.
- Participants must be residents of specified geographical area, ages 4-17 and the parents must be able to read.
- Participants must be hospitalized in the Psychiatric Department of a large full service midwestern pediatric hospital and academic medical center.

Outcomes:

- Findings will contribute to the development of an educational program about Trauma Informed Care directed at parents and caregivers.
- The findings will also be shared with the leadership team at the participating hospital.

Relevance to the Profession:

- Identification and treatment of trauma can decrease medical expenses in the future and improve outcomes for patients.
- The findings will provide framework for future research and can be incorporated into a multi-disciplinary educational program.
