Indiana High School Standout Signs With Lady Eagles

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- Megan Hupfer, a 5-11 forward from Pendleton Heights High School in Pendleton, Ind., has signed a national letter-of-intent to play basketball for the Morehead State Lady Eagles.

Hupfer, who was recently named to the Indiana squad for the Kentucky-Indiana All-Star Series, averaged 21.7 points and 12 rebounds as a senior. She owns the Pendleton Heights' records for career points (1,074), career rebounds (638), points in season (463), points in a game (38), rebounds in a game (22) and career field goal percentage (.563).

"We're extremely excited to be able to sign someone with Megan's ability this late in the recruiting year," said new MSU Lady Eagle Coach Janet Gabriel. "She is one of the top post players in Indiana, and is obviously among the top 12 seniors in the state, having been named to the Indiana All-Star Team. We expect her to be a great player at Morehead State."

Hupfer is MSU's first signee of the spring signing period. Heather Reed, a 5-11 guard-forward from Haines City High School in Haines City, Fla., signed with MSU during last November's early signing period.

Fick Names 1992-93 Eagle Basketball Captains

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- A top returnee and two newcomers have been named tri-captains of the 1992-93 Morehead State Eagle basketball team by Head Coach Dick Fick.

Eagle captains for MSU's second season under Fick are senior Doug Bentz and sophomore transfers Kelly Wells and Johnnie Williams. Bentz led the 1991-92 Eagles in rebounding and ranked second in scoring to national scoring champion Brett Roberts. Wells, a former all-stater at Morehead's Rowan County High School, is a transfer from Tulsa. Williams, a former standout at Marion, Ind., High School, is a transfer from Creighton. Both Wells and Williams practiced with the squad last season while sitting out under the NCAA's transfer guidelines.

"With a young team like we'll have next year, I thought it was imperative that we established some early leadership for our basketball team," Fick said. "Captains are named for three reasons. First, because they deserve it. Second, that person can be good for the team in a leadership role. And, third, it makes someone become a leader and become a better overall player.

"These three guys will fit the role and will give us steady leadership, not just for next year, but in the case of Kelly and Johnnie, for three years."

Fick and the 1992-93 Eagles will face another challenging schedule. Though not ready for official release, most games and gametimes have been firmed up contractually, and the schedule will include trips to Michigan State, Kentucky and Ball State's Cardinal Varsity Club Classic.

Morehead State to Dedicate the George A. Sadler Tennis Courts on Wednesday

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- The Morehead State University tennis courts will become the George A. Sadler Courts in public dedication ceremonies honoring the former Eagle and Lady Eagle tennis coach at 2 p.m. on Wednesday (May 13) at the courts.

Sadler, a Mercer County native, came to MSU in 1968 as a faculty member in health, physical education and recreation. He compiled a 181-41 record in 15 seasons as men's tennis coach, retiring in 1983. He later returned to the University on a part-time basis and served two years as women's tennis coach.

Sadler and his wife, Elizabeth, a retired public school teacher, have served as missionaries overseas and in rural America.

A top tennis player himself, he has held top state rankings for decades. He currently is tied for the top ranking for men over 70 years of age.

The recommendation to name the courts in honor of Sadler came unanimously endorsed by the University's Intercollegiate Athletics Committee and was approved by MSU's Board of Regents in November.

All friends of Sadler and the University are invited to attend the Wednesday dedication ceremony.

Belfry All-Stater J.J. Hylton Signs With Morehead State

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- J.J. Hylton, a 6-3, 185-pound guard from Belfry, Ky., and Belfry High School has signed a national letter-of-intent to play basketball at Morehead State University.

Hylton, Belfry's all-time leading scorer, was named first team all-state by both the Lexington Herald-Leader and the Louisville Courier-Journal. He averaged 27.8 points per game as a senior.

A four-year starter, he led the Pirates to three consecutive Kentucky Sweet 16's. He earned all-tournament honors in the Kentucky State Tournament, the King of the Bluegrass, the Louisville Invitational and the Clay County Invitational.

"J.J. Hylton is a terrific scorer and has been over an extended period of time in leading Belfry to three straight state tournaments," said MSU Coach Dick Fick. "He is a proven winner, and I really like the fact that it's a great match, a kid from Eastern Kentucky that really fits the style we like to play.

"J.J. also fits the mold of the player we have been able to attract in that he's an outstanding student who will fit in with John Brannen and Marty Cline as outstanding players from the Kentucky high school ranks who chose Morehead State."

Brannen, a 6-7, 185-pound forward from Newport Central Catholic, earned first team all-state honors and Cline, a 6-2, 175-pound guard from Hopkinsville's University Heights Academy, was named second team all-state. Brannen earned a spot on the Kentucky All-Star team that will play the Indiana All-Stars, and Cline is an alternate to that squad. Both Brannen and Cline signed national letters during the November signing period.

MSU also signed guard Joel Frakes of Stevensville, Mich., and Maine Central Institute and forward Jason McCain of Marion, Ind., and Kaskaskia Junior College in November.

New faces but not a new style will be the order of the day for Coach Dick Fick's second Morehead State University basketball squad. The Eagles were 14-15 last season in the animated coach's first season.

Kelly Wells, a former standout at Morehead's Rowan County High School, heads a long list of newcomers the 1992-93 Eagle basketball roster. At least nine newcomers are expected to be on hand for the coming season.

Four individuals sat out last season while attending MSU. They are Wells, a transfer from Tulsa, Creighton transfers Johnnie Williams and Todd Geyer and Louisville native Vic Saunders, who attended MSU last year while meeting NCAA eligibility requirements.

Five outstanding signees will join the squad. Kentucky all-stars John Brannen (Newport Central Catholic), Marty Cline (University Heights) and J.J. Hylton (Belfry) are the high school signees. Prep schooler Joel Frakes from Stevensville, Mich., is a strong candidate for a guard spot. Junior college big man Jason McCain will be a big addition underneath.

Back from last season will be starters Doug Bentz and former Bullitt Central standout Martez Ballard. Bentz earned second-team All-Ohio Valley Conference honors while leading the Eagles in rebounding.

Of the 11 individuals sure to be on this year's roster, six are Kentuckians.

MSU will miss Brett Roberts, who led the nation in scoring last season, and helped the Eagles rank among the nation's leaders in scoring and three-point field goals. But, Fick promises more of the exciting, run-and-gun, shoot-the-three-pointer type of offense and pressure defense this season.

The much improved home schedule includes eight exciting OVC games, along with games against Division I opponents Wright State, Missouri-Kansas City and Western Michigan. The Eagles will play at Michigan State and Kentucky and in Ball State's Cardinal Varsity Club Classic.

Three More High School Baseball Standouts Sign With Morehead State

MOREHEAD, Ky.-- Three more high school baseball standouts have signed national letters-of-intent with Morehead State University, bringing to eight the number of prep stars who will join the Baseball Eagles this fall.

The newest Eagles are John Dowdy, a 6-4, 175-pound first baseman from Rowan County High School in Morehead, Todd Gutermuth, a 6-2, 180-pound pitcher from DeSales High School in Louisville, and Mike Hall, a 5-11, 165-pound outfielder from Southern High School in Louisville.

Dowdy hit .467 and set school records for hits (57) and runs batted in (46) in a season as a senior at Rowan County. Gutermuth was 7-2 with a 1.66 earned run average and 57 strikeouts in 61 innings pitched his final season at DeSales. Hall participated in both the Kentucky East-West All-Star Game and in the Louisville area all-star contest following his career at Southern.

MSU's five other signees are: Brad Allison, a catcher from Harrison County High School in Cynthiana, Ky.; Scott Hacker, a pitcher from Boone County High School in Florence, Ky.; Brian Milam, a shortstop from Butler High School in Louisville; Brian Smith, a pitcher from Hamilton Southeastern High School and Fishers, Ind., and Chris Wright, a second baseman from Gar-Field High School in Woodbridge, Va.

CINCINNATI, Ohio -- Former Morehead State University and Post 126 standout pitcher Willie Blair received a rough introduction to Riverfront Stadium Tuesday night when he picked up the loss as the starting pitcher for the Houston Astros in their 10-6 loss to the Cincinnati Reds.

But, Blair, whose boyhood dream was to pitch for the Reds, was not totally at fault. As in his first National League decision, a 5-0 loss to San Diego on June 17, he was victimized by sloppy Astro fielding. In the game against the Padres, none of the five runs were earned. Tuesday evening against the Reds, he gave up seven runs, three of which were unearned. In three games since being recalled from Tucson of the Pacific Coast League (AAA) on June 12, he is 0-2 with a 5.25 earned run average.

The Paintsville native, who provided tickets for nearly 70 friends from Paintsville and around the area, was philosophical about pitching in Riverfront Stadium and about his teammates' defensive blunders.

"They'll pick me up more than they'll let me down," Blair said. "That's just part of the game. I made some mistakes, and every time I made one, they took advantage of it and hit the ball hard.

"It felt a little different here on the mound. When I was younger and playing ball in the back yard, it was the Reds players that I copied. They were my heroes. But, after you get started, you remember that this is your job"

For the Reds, the win snapped a four-game losing streak and enabled them to remain one game in front of second place Atlanta going into a Wednesday night game against the Astros. Atlanta will invade Riverfront Stadium for a three-game series this weekend.

Lou Pinella's club got a needed shot of momentum in the top of the first inning Tuesday evening. Astro lead-off hitter Craig Biggio opened the game with a line shot to the gap in left centerfield, but Cincinnati centerfielder Dave Martinez ran it down, making a diving catch. Then, after a walk to Houston centerfielder Steve Finley, first baseman Jeff Bagwell struck out swinging and Finley was cut down at second base on the tail end of a strike'em out-throw'em out double play.

Reds second baseman Bip Roberts opened the bottom of the first by working the count to three balls, one strike, then fouling off seven pitches before bouncing a single up the middle. Shortstop Barry Larkin lined a 1-2 pitch off the glove of Biggio that the official scorer ruled a single. First baseman Hal Morris then hit the first pitch thrown to him into rightfield for an RBI single, giving Cincinnati a 1-0 lead. That left runners on first and third with still no one out. Blair bore down at that point, striking out centerfielder Reggie Sanders and inducing rightfielder Paul O'Neill to ground into an inning-ending double play.

Astro leftfielder Luis Gonzales tied the game with a home run on the first pitch of the second inning. Third baseman Ken Caminiti fisted a double down the left field line and came home on a single by veteran rightfielder Pete Incaviglia to give Houston a short-lived 2-1 lead.

With one out in the bottom of the second, Martinez stroked a double down the rightfield line. Then, catcher Joe Oliver deposited a Blair pitch that was high in the strike zone high into the green, plaza-level seats in leftfield for a 3-2 Reds lead.

Doubles by Finley and Gonzalez in the third inning tied the game at three, and Blair settled down to retire nine of 10 hitters entering the fateful home half of the fifth inning. Roberts opened the frame by reaching on a throwing error by Caminiti. Roberts stole second and moved to third on a wild pitch. Larkin then hit a routine ground ball that Rafael Ramirez booted at shortstop with Roberts scoring on the play. Morris singled to centerfield putting runners on the corners. Rookie left fielder then tripled to right centerfield scoring Larkin and Morris and signalling the end of the evening for Blair.

Despite the two losses in three appearances, the outlook remains bright for the former Eagle. In 11 appearances at Tucson before his call-up, Blair was 4-4 with a 2.39 earned run average.

"He was our best pitcher at Tucson, and that's why he was called up," said Houston Manager Art Howe. "He probably should have made the team in the spring. But, we have several contract and option problems with pitchers, and he was the victim of circumstances.

"He throws the ball well, and I believe he's got something in here (pointing to his abdomen), guts."

The latest Astro news release lists Blair as the probable starter on Sunday in Los Angeles against Bob Ojeda (3-4) and the Dodgers. His role on the Astro staff is going to be dictated by the progress made by righthanded starter Mark Portugal, who has been on the disabled list with shoulder tendinitis and is due to come off the list soon. When Portugal returns, Blair may move to the bullpen.

"Another thing I like about Willie is his versatility," Howe said. "He has shown he can be effective as both a starter and reliever, and we'll probably take advantage of that versatility."

If Blair remains with the Astros for an extended period of time, he had better get a big suitcase. Because of the Astrodome's commitment to the Republican National Convention, Houston will begin a 28-day road trip on July 27 and will not play again at home until August 25.

1992 Morehead State University Football Outlook

Key individuals return on both sides of the line of scrimmage for Morehead State University Football Coach Cole Proctor as he begins his third season at the helm of the Eagle football program.

Heading the list of 34 lettermen and 15 starters returning from last season's team that finished 4-7 overall and 3-4 in the Ohio Valley Conference are running backs Darrin Harris and Anthony Jerdine, tight end Jesse Olverson, outside linebacker Fred Johnson, defensive lineman Richard Shadwick and defensive backs Tyrone Fisher and Lawrence Gore.

The biggest holes to fill will be on the offensive and defensive lines and in the defensive backfield. Two-time Academic All-American offensive guard Jim Appel, offensive tackle Mike Gildea, nose guard Anthony Cox and defensive backs Carlos Tuck and Jerod Thomas are gone.

Darrin Harris was the leading rusher and receiver on last year's team, rushing for 896 yards on 185 carries and catching 35 passes for 368 yards. Jerdine was the second leading rusher with 486 yards on 117 carries, and he scored six touchdowns. Rodney Harris, who caught 12 passes for 130 yards, Pruitt Petty, who caught 11 passes for 129 yards, and John Dziedzic, who caught 11 passes for 209 yards, are the top returning wide receivers, and Rodney Harris may also see action at runningback in MSU's new option offense. Olverson caught 11 passes his freshman season and is considered an outstanding prospect. Tight end Brandon Ford, who had 80 catches his first two seasons, was injured in the second game last season, had knee surgery and received a medical red-shirt. He was not able to participate in spring drills.

The starting quarterback position is expected to be a battle between red-shirts Matt Bloemer (Fr.) and Jeremy Holbrook (So.), both of whom can run the option offense that Proctor prefers. Drop-back specialist Steve Donato is a senior who started last season as a junior and completed 134 of 273 passes for 1,578 yards and 12 touchdowns.

Guards Tom Svobodny (6-6, 330, Sr.) and Glen Boykin (6-4, 270, Sr.) and center Larry Maggard (6-6, 275, Sr.) are veterans on the offensive line.

Defensively, Johnson (6-2, 240, Jr.) and Shadwick (6-4, 240, Sr.) are candidates for postseason honors. Johnson made 70 defensive plays, including 13 tackles for losses, last season. Shadwick, who led the OVC in tackles for losses in 1990, was slowed by injuries last season, but still managed 10 tackles for losses.

Freshmen Donnie Matthews (6-1, 225, So.) and Jamie Phillips (6-0, 210, So.) were pressed into service at linebacker spots last season and exhibited flashes of brilliance. Veteran linebackers Darrell Elliott (5-10, 210, Sr.), Tom Cohan (6-1, 225, Sr.) and Mike Duvall (6-2, 220, Sr.) also return.

Fisher, an all-conference cornerback, led the team with three interceptions last season. Gore will move from strong to free safety and should be a standout.

Placekicker Craig Bere and punter Brian Flynn return. Red-shirt freshman Atle Larsen is expected to battle Bere for the placekicking chores.

The Coaches

Cole Proctor **Head Football Coach, Morehead State University**

Cole Proctor enters his third season as head football coach at Morehead State with his system firmly in place and the results of his recruiting efforts bringing excitement and enthusiasm back to Eagle football.

In his first season at MSU in 1990, he shared the Ohio Valley Conference's Coach of the Year Award after leading the Eagles to a 5-6-0 record and to the University's best Ohio Valley Conference record (3-3-0) since 1979. Included were back-to-back wins over conference rivals Murray State and Eastern Kentucky to end the season. Last season's team was effected by several key injuries and finished 4-7-0. The 1991 Eagles had a four-game winning streak in the middle of the season that included three conference victories and a nonconference win over Liberty which inflicted a loss on eventual national champion Youngstown State.

A two-time graduate of MSU, the 49-year old Proctor was named his alma mater's 12th head football coach on Dec. 14, 1989. He is a native of Wallingford, Conn., and returned to MSU from the position of assistant coach at Utah, a position he had held since Dec., 1986. Prior to joining the Utah staff, he spent one season as an assistant coach at Iowa State.

He spent five seasons as an assistant coach at San Diego State (1981-85). For two seasons (1979-80), he was an assistant coach at East Tennessee.

Proctor had a successful tenure as head football coach and athletic director at Lees-McRae College for three years (1976-78). Prior to assuming the helm of the Lees-McRae program, he spent three years (1973-75) as head football coach at Keene (N.H.) High School, and he was named New Jersey Coach of the Year by the Newark Star Ledger while the head coach at Chatham Township High School in 1972.

He was an assistant coach at Gardner-Webb for three seasons (1969-71). Prior to that, he had spent one season (1968) as an assistant coach at Lees-McRae.

During the 1967-68 academic year, he served as a graduate assistant at MSU.

Proctor graduated from Lyman Hall High School in Wallingford, Conn., and also attended Bridgton Academy in North Bridgton, Me., and State College of Iowa, now the University of Northern Iowa, before coming to MSU.

He earned a bachelor's degree with an area of concentration in health, physical education and recreation from MSU in 1967. He earned a master's degree in physical education from MSU in 1968. He has done additional graduate work at the University of South Carolina and Fairleigh Dickinson University.

Proctor and his wife, Marti, have two children, Susan and Tom, and one grandson, Joshua Cole.

Jeff Judge **Offensive Coordinator, Quarterbacks and Fullbacks**

Jeff Judge enters his third season on the MSU staff, his second as offensive coordinator.

In addition to his coordinator duties, he will coach the Eagle quarterbacks and fullbacks.

Judge followed Cole Proctor from Utah, where he served as recruiting coordinator during his tenure with the Ute program. He was also involved in administrative and NCAA compliance areas.

Prior to joining the staff at Utah, Judge spent two seasons as a graduate assistant at Purdue. He was a member of the staff at Iowa State from 1982 through 1986. Judge began his career as an assistant coach at Hudson (Iowa) High School.

He earned a bachelor's degree from Iowa State in 1987 and a master's degree from Purdue in 1989.

He is married to the former Laurie Mechem of Clarion, Iowa.

Rex Ryan **Defensive Coordinator, Linebackers**

Rex Ryan, the son of former Philadelphia Eagle head coach and Chicago Bear defensive coordinator Buddy Ryan, is in his third season on the MSU staff, his second as defensive coordinator. He will also coach the Eagle linebackers.

He came to MSU from New Mexico Highlands where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

Ryan earned a bachelor's degree from Southwestern Oklahoma State and a master's degree from Eastern Kentucky, where he also served as a graduate assistant for the Colonel football team.



MOREHEAD, Ky. -- More than 110 candidates for the 1992 Morehead State University football team have made their way to campus for the start of fall practice.

Thirty-nine newcomers were the first to arrive on Sunday (Aug. 9). They have gone through physical examinations and various orientation meetings and will have one practice session on Wednesday (Aug. 12) before being joined by the veterans for practice on Thursday (Aug. 13).

The veterans arrived a day later than the rookies and were scheduled for physical examinations and the orientation meetings on Wednesday and Thursday (Aug. 11-12).

The squad will have its mandatory three days of no-contact workouts Thursday, Friday and Saturday (Aug. 13-15). After taking Sunday (Aug. 16) off, contact work will begin on Monday (Aug. 17). The season opener takes place Sept. 5 at Marshall.

Three Eagles were named to the 1992 Preseason All-OVC Football Team. They were seniors Tyrone Fisher, a defensive back from Coraopolis, Pa., Larry Maggard, a center from Whitesburg, Ky., and Richard Shadwick, a defensive lineman from Nicholasville, Ky. Jesse Olverson, a sophomore tight end from Cincinnati, Ohio, received honorable mention on the preseason honor squad.

Also on conference media day, Commissioner Dan Beebe announced that SportSouth, a regional sports cable network, will televise three games in 1992 involving OVC schools. MSU's season opener at Marshall on Sept. 5 is the first of the three. Other games to be televised are the Eastern Kentucky at Middle Tennessee game on Oct. 17 and the Tennessee Tech at Marshall game on Nov. 14.

SportSouth currently reaches 1.9 million viewers in Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina.

Laughlin Inducted Into Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame

MOREHEAD, Ky.--Former Morehead State University Athletic Director and Head Basketball Coach Bobby Laughlin was among eight individuals inducted into the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame during induction ceremonies at Louisville's Executive West on Aug. 24.

Laughlin, who died Aug. 8, 1985, at age 74, served as MSU's athletic director for 20 years, retiring on July 1, 1973. He coached the Eagle basketball team for 12 seasons (1953-65), compiling a 166-120 record and leading MSU to four Ohio Valley Conference championships and three appearances in the NCAA Tournament. He earned OVC Coach of the Year honors in 1960-61.

In the Induction Banquet program, current Eagle Athletic Director Steve Hamilton, himself a 1991 Hall of Fame inductee, was quoted concerning his former coach. He said, "(Laughlin) taught you how to compete. After I graduated, I wrote him a letter and thanked him. I told him he taught me how to be a competitor. He did a lot for Morehead and a lot for me."

Former Eagle baseball coach and assistant athletic director John "Sonny" Allen said, "Coach Laughlin was a great disciplinarian. He got 100 percent out of everybody, and everybody played hard and practiced hard. He coached the fast break as well as anybody I've ever seen."

Along with Laughlin, the other 1992 inductees were longtime sportswriter Mike Barry, former University of Louisville and NBA standout Junior Bridgeman, thoroughbred racing's Breeders' Cup founder John Gaines, University of Kentucky three-time basketball All-American Alex Groza, Eastern Kentucky University athletic director and football coach Roy Kidd, former University of Kentucky and Atlanta Falcon football standout Jeff Van Note and Louisville native Susan Shields White who swam to a bronze medal in the 1968 Mexico City Olympics.

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- Five individuals who made outstanding contributions to the Eagle athletic program will be inducted into the Morehead State University Athletic Hall of Fame at Induction Ceremonies on Oct. 16, 1992, during the University's Homecoming '91 activities.

The newest members of the Hall of Fame are Bobby Jones (track and field), Gordon "Red" Moore (publicist), Bill Spannum (golf), Beverly "Jug" Varney (football) and Myron "Granny" Williams (basketball).

Jones, a native of Lexington, Ky., earned All-America honors during a brilliant career as a track and field athlete (1975-78). He became MSU's first Ohio Valley Conference Trackman of the Year and represented the University in the NCAA championship meet in 1976 and 1977.

He was among the nation's best in sprinting events and in the long jump and was named the outstanding individual performer in numerous dual and all-comers meets. During his career, he broke numerous MSU and OVC records.

Moore served MSU in both an official and unofficial capacity. He spent a short time as an assistant in the University's public relations office where he provided information on the Eagle athletic teams. As a contributing writer, he authored hundreds of articles for newspapers such as the Louisville Courier-Journal, the Lexington Herald, the Lexington Leader, the Ashland Daily Independent and the Huntington Herald-Dispatch.

A retired school administrator, Moore served as a principle, athletic director, coach and teacher in Floyd County and other school systems. He earned a bachelor's degree from MSU in 1947 and a master's degree in 1949.

Spannum is arguably the most successful golfer in collegiate tournaments in the history of Eagle golf. A two-time OVC Golfer of the Year, he lettered four years and made three appearances in the NCAA Golf Championships.

He finished 12th in the 1970 NCAA tournament, and his round of 67 in the 1971 tournament tied Texas' Ben Crenshaw for the first round lead. He was the OVC individual champion in 1970 and finished third in 1972. He set the MSU course record with a nine-under-par 61 and won three consecutive MSU Invitational Championships while a student at the University.

Varney was a three-year football letterman and earned Honorable Mention All-America honors in 1938. A halfback from Williamson, W.Va., he made his mark on the Eagle football record book.

He still holds seven MSU records: Rushing Yardage-Game (252), Points-Game (30), Points-Season (90), Touchdowns-Game (5), Touchdowns-Season (15), Rushing Touchdowns-Game (5) and Rushing Touchdowns-Season (12).

Williams became one of the most prolific scorers in Eagle basketball history during his career (1959-62). He currently ranks seventh on MSU's all-time scoring list, having scored 1,637 points in three varsity seasons. He led MSU in scoring in 1960-61 (22.7) and 1961-62 (26.0).

His is one of only three Eagles to score more than 700 points in a season (705 in 1960-61). A two-time All-OVC selection, he still holds MSU records for field goal attempts in a game (37) and career (1544) and field goals made in a game (22). The 48 points he scored against Miami (Fla.) in 1961-62 ranks as MSU's fourth highest single game.

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- Quarterback James Wade passed for 221 yards and two touchdowns to lead Tennessee State to a 24-14 Ohio Valley Conference victory over homestanding Morehead State Saturday afternoon.

After a scoreless first quarter, Tennessee State, 1-4 overall and 1-1 in the conference, got on the board first on a five-yard pass from Wade to tight end Charles Hunter. The Tigers took a 10-0 halftime lead on a 35-yard field goal by Adi Sarieh with only 23 seconds left before intermission.

TSU built the lead to 17-0 when Tiger defensive back Cedric Davis intercepted a Jeremy Holbrook pass and returned it 30 yards for a touchdown with 13:34 to go in the third quarter.

On its next possession, Morehead State, 0-5 overall and 0-2 in the OVC, drove 84 yards on 10 plays to cut the lead to 17-7 with 8:22 left in the third quarter. Fullback Phil Dinn, who rushed for a career-high 139 yards on 18 carries, carried the ball seven times on the drive for 60 yards. Holbrook hit tight end Brandon Ford on a 16-yard pass for the score.

TSU went up 24-7 with 14:50 left in the game when Wade hit wide receiver John Frierson on a 60-yard touchdown bomb. Wade hit 10 of 22 with one interception in the game, and Frierson caught four passes for 137 yards.

MSU scored the game's final points on a seven-yard run by Darrin Harris with 7:19 remaining.

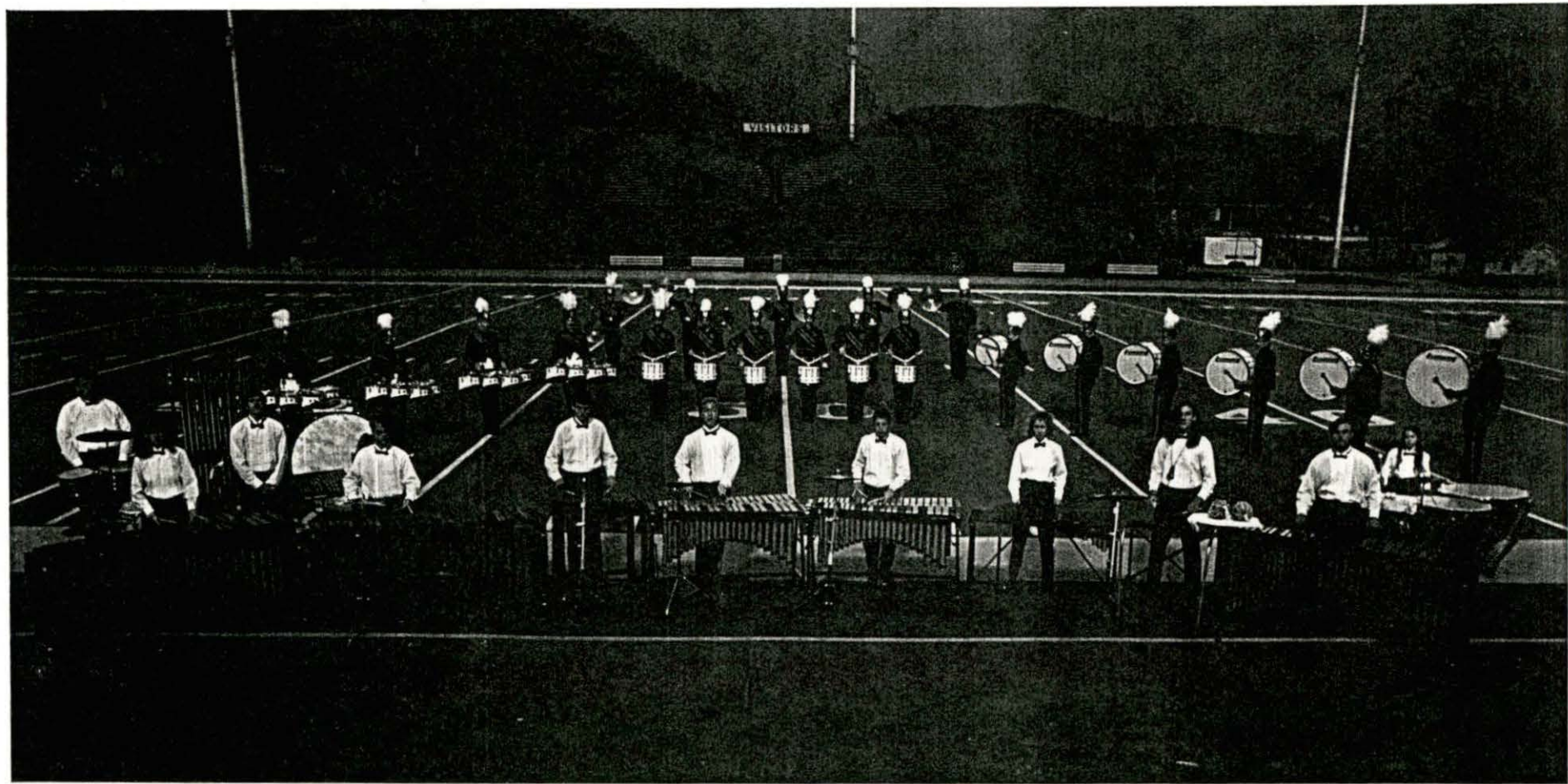
In addition to Wade's and Frierson's offensive heroics, TSU got 134 rushing yards on 21 carries from halfback Darron Davis.

MOREHEAD, Ky. -- A defensive effort featuring four pass interceptions, three fumble recoveries, five quarterback sacks, nine total tackles for losses and a blocked punt led Morehead State to a 31-7 Ohio Valley Conference victory over Murray State Saturday afternoon in front of a Homecoming crowd of 7,200 at Jayne Stadium/Jacobs Field.

Morehead State broke an eight game losing streak dating to last season and is now 1-5 overall and 1-2 in the OVC. Murray State lost for the ninth consecutive time on the road and is now 2-5 overall and 1-4 in the league

The Eagles scored first when senior running back Darrin Harris scored from 10 yards out with 8:54 left in the first quarter. A 12-yard scoring run by Harris with five seconds left in the first quarter gave Morehead State a 14-0 lead.

Senior running back Ken Carter gave the Eagles a 21-0 halftime lead when he scored from 13 yards out with 2:51 left before intermission.

The lead ballooned to 31-0 after three quarters. Sophomore quarterback Jeremy Holbrook had a six-yard touchdown run with 12:24 left in the third, and freshman placekicker Atle Larsen kicked a 29-yard field goal, the first of his college career, with 2:41 left in the stanza.

Murray State's only score came with 10:32 left in the game on an 11-yard run by halfback Wayne McGowan.

The Eagles rolled up 304 yards in total offense to 231 yards for the Racers. Harris led all rushers with 74 yards on 17 carries. Holbrook rushed for 63 yards on 11 carries and hit seven of nine passes for 88 yards. Tight end Brandon Ford caught four passes for 64 yards.

Defensively, Morehead State free safety Lawrence Gore intercepted two passes. Strong safety Barry Clark and cornerback Tyrone Fisher had one each. Inside linebacker Jaime Phillips recovered two fumbles.

MSU's offensive woes continued in a 20-7 OVC loss at UT-Martin. The Eagles' only touchdown came on a 70-yard interception return by safety Lawrence Gore. East Tennessee lost 38-14 at Appalachian State.

Back in 1978

The 1978 football game between Morehead State and East Tennessee featured an Eagle coach that was about to resign, an Eagle quarterback that was about to become a National Football League first round draft choice and enough excitement to last the 14 years between MSU-ETSU games. MSU won the game 31-30...somehow. The Buccaneers rallied with two touchdowns early in the fourth quarter to tie the score at 24, where it remained until 48 seconds were left in the game when MSU scored to take a 31-24 lead. ETSU took the ensuing kickoff and drove to the MSU 32 yard line, where with 10 seconds remaining in the game, Buccaneer quarterback Mark Hutsell fumbled and Eagle linebacker Rodney Jefferson recovered. But, on the next play, MSU fumbled giving ETSU one last chance. Hutsell then hit wide receiver Arnold Thomas with a scoring strike, to bring ETSU to within one point with no time remaining on the clock. Going for the win instead of the tie, ETSU's two-point pass attempt fell incomplete. MSU controlled the football and kept the ball away from Hutsell for much of the game. The Eagles rushed for 322 yards, including 133 yards by freshman Dwight Yarn and 131 yards by junior Bernard McIntosh. MSU Coach Wayne Chapman submitted his resignation effective at the end of the season on Nov. 6, the Monday following the ETSU game. The MSU quarterback in the game was current New York Giants standout Phil Simms.

MSU and the National Statistics

As a team MSU ranks 17th nationally and 1st in the Ohio Valley Conference in rushing defense (112.3 ypg.) and 24th nationally and 6th in the OVC in pass efficiency defense.

Senior cornerback Tyrone Fisher is tied for third nationally in interceptions per game (1.0).



Last Season

The Eagles rallied from a 17-7 halftime deficit, then held on for a 21-20 victory on a warm October 26th evening at Jayne Stadium/Jacobs Field. Tech turned the ball over in MSU territory on its final two possessions, with Eagle cornerback Tyrone Fisher stopping the final drive with a pass interception with 1:17 remaining. MSU running back Darrin Harris rushed for 160 yards on 29 carries. Tech freshman quarterback Mike Jones, making his first collegiate start, was sacked on five occasions, three times by Eagle linebacker Fred Johnson. Golden Eagle freshman running back Willie Queen rushed for 112 yards on 16 carries.

Morehead State broke an eight game losing streak, dating to last season, by defeating Murray State 31-7 in front of a Homecoming '92 crowd at Jayne Stadium/Jacobs Field. Darrin Harris rushed for 74 yards and scored two touchdowns. Quarterback Jeremy Holbrook rushed for 63 yards and a touchdown and hit seven of nine passes for 88 yards and was named the Ashland Oil/MSU Alumni Association Player of the Game. Defensively, linebacker Jaime Phillips was credited with 12 total plays, 2.5 tackles for loss, two fumbles recovered and one fumble forced and earned Ohio Valley Conference Defensive Player of the Week honors. Safety Lawrence Gore intercepted two passes. Freshman placekicker Atle Larsen was perfect on four extra point kicks and also booted the first field goal of his college career.


