Bowl Berths And Conference Championships At Stake In College Football Over The Nation

Bowl berths and conference championships were at stake in every section of the nation today as college football's regular season neared the end of the road.

The major pairings, including many time-honored backyard battles, were Penn State vs. Pittsburgh, Duke vs. North Carolina, Oklahoma vs. Nebraska, Missouri vs. Kansas, Wisconsin vs. Minnesota, and Southern California vs. UCLA.

And then there was "the game" — Harvard vs. Yale at Cambridge, Mass.

President John F. Kennedy planned to attend the 79th meeting between the Cantata and Elis. The Chief Executive, who played freshman and junior varsity football at Harvard in the late 30's, was to travel by helicopter from Cape Cod to Cambridge and then by motorcade to Harvard Stadium.

Harvard was a 10-point favorite to whip the Elis and sew up the Big Three title for the second straight year.

Penn State hoped to sew up the mythical Eastern championship and a berth in the Gator Bowl by beating Pittsburgh on the Panthers' home grounds.

Duke, another leading Gator Bowl candidate, can clinch its third straight Atlantic Coast Conference title by beating North Carolina. The Blue Devils were favored by 13 points.

In another traditional southern clash, Louisiana State was a hefty 29-point pick to knock off arch-rival Tulane and earn a possible berth opposite Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

Mississippi and Alabama, two other major bowl candidates, were idle this weekend.

Alabama needed a tie or a victory over Nebraska to gain the Big Eight title and a berth in the Orange Bowl. Oklahoma is 5-0 in the conference and Nebraska is 5-1.

USC Considered "in". Although unbeaten and untied, Southern California is considered "in" as the best team in the Rose Bowl, the Big Six Conference representatives are delaying their selection at least until after the Trojans' meeting with UCLA.

Southern Cal carried a similar eight-game victory streak into this game in 1959 UCLA scored a 10-3 upset. For this latest renewal be-

tween the crosstown Los Angeles vs. SMU, Iowa vs. Notre Dame, Michigan State vs. Illinois, Purdue vs. Indiana, Rice vs. TCU, Tennessee vs. Kentucky, Stanford vs. California, and Washington vs. Washington State.

Fullback Steve Murphy plunged for a pair of touchdowns and Pete Shamson accounted for 11 points on two conversion boots, a field goal and a touchdown in pacing Northwestern to a 29-7 victory over Miami (Fla.) Friday night before 60,341 in the Orange Bowl.

It was the final game of the season for once-mighty Northwestern, which finished with a 7-2 record. Miami, now 6-3, remains a candidate for the Gotham Auburn vs. Florida State, Baylor and Gator bowls.

More Colors, Fragrance, Seen For Rose

NEW YORK, N. Y. — The Garden rose, which has undergone great change since 1945, can look forward to even more innovations and scientific achievements in the next ten years.

Scientists have produced temperatures within a thousandth of a degree of absolute zero or 459.7 degrees below zero Fahrenheit, according to the National Geographic Society. In theory this is the temperature at which all molecular motion ceases.

Selective crosses with the newer, highly disease-resistant strains will lead, they feel, to an even greater inbred capacity by plants to ward-off attacks by common garden diseases and pests.

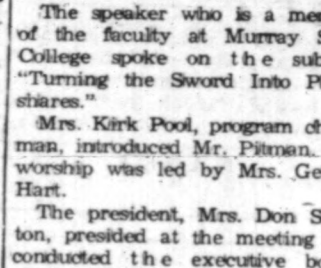
