Assessment Measures

Examples of connecting stats to impact:

- Comparing LC#s of new pieces or circ stats to curriculum
- □ Comparing diversity of subject headings, publishers, or languages in the collection to a desired level
- Showing the variety of areas of study that use "subject specific" databases (from parsed user data) to demonstrate broad value

Mission

Personal Mission or Vocation

"One's vocation is one's calling in life – not simply what one "wants" to do or "is expected" to do, but that toward which one is drawn, and which (it is hoped) will provide one's life with meaning, purpose, and a sense of genuine fulfillment." *Hearing Vocation Differently* (p.8)

"when our work expresses gratitude for our continuous receiving from others and for the gifts from God. ... embrace of a concern for the flourishing of all." (p. 149)

Vocational mission means: We live out our theology (or life philosophy) in our work

We bring our whole selves to our work (#wholeheartedlibrarian)

challenges students to grow spiritually, intellectually, and professionally in order to lead God's people

transforms lives, communities, and the world by providing opportunities ... through excellence in learning, discovery, healthcare, and engagement

to educate men and women for worldwide leadership and service by integrating academic excellence and Christian commitment within a caring community

a center for **scholarly research**, informed and creative teaching, and service to the community and society at large. ...uphold the highest standards and be a leader in the **quest for new knowledge** through scholarship, dissemination of knowledge through teaching and outreach, **creative experimentation of ideas and concepts**. ...values most highly intellectual freedom that supports **open inquiry**, equality, compassion, and excellence in all endeavors

Transferable skills - Acquisitions

- Finding the best price and best access to content needed by patrons
 - Negotiation skills
 - Data analysis
 - Technological skills
 - Mathematical abilities
 - Familiarity with publishing industry
 - Clarity of communication



Transferable skills - Cataloging

- Facilitate access to intellectual content
 - Attention to detail
 - Data analysis
 - Pattern seeking: user, publisher, provider
 - Technological skills
 - Project management
 - Familiarity with ontologies and



taxonomies

Transferable skills - Electronic Resources Management

- Maintaining discovery and linking technologies for maximum access
 - Data analysis
 - User need assessment
 - Technological skills
 - Troubleshooting
 - Pattern seeking
