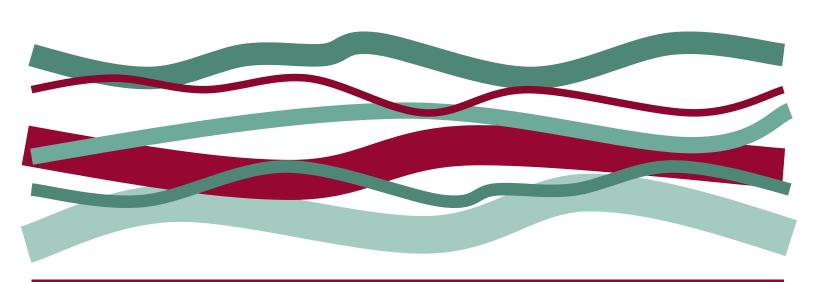


Health Service Executive September 2012 Performance Report National Service Plan 2012



Finance

The financial report for the HSE for September shows a deficit of €399m (4.4%) against a spend year to date of €9,543m. The main components of this are community schemes €180m, hospitals €207m and community services €22m. Further analysis is included in this report.

September is the first month in which there has been a reduction in the deficit reported. There are indications that the cost containment measures in place are reducing spend rates. The community based schemes continue to run significant deficits which increased by an additional €29m in the month of September.

The vote deficit reported in the October vote issues report was €318m on gross current expenditure and €404m on net vote expenditure. The detailed vote report for October is attached to the back of this Performance Report. A range of measures are in place to reduce the year end deficit.

Key Improvements

- €5m reduction in the deficit compared with the previous month.
- In the first nine months of this year, the number of people on trolleys was reduced by 23.6% or 16,659 persons over the same period last year.
- 70% of hospitals fully achieved the target of having nobody waiting for more than nine months for treatment. The number waiting over 9 months has reduced from 5,119 people in January to 415 in September, a drop of 91%.
- 99.7% of people whose referrals for breast cancer were triaged as urgent were seen within 2 weeks against a target of 95%
- The uptake rate for the 6 in 1 vaccine has been at 95% for the past year. This compares very favourably internationally and is primarily as a result of a focused campaign by the healthcare professionals involved in this service.
- MRSA rates have declined from 0.11 per 1000 bed days in 2008 to 0.063 in the first half of 2012 which is significant.
- In September 100% of complete NHSS applications were processed within four weeks.
- As at the 8 October 2012, 95.36% of properly completed medical card applications have been processed within the 15 day turnaround.

Key Service Issues

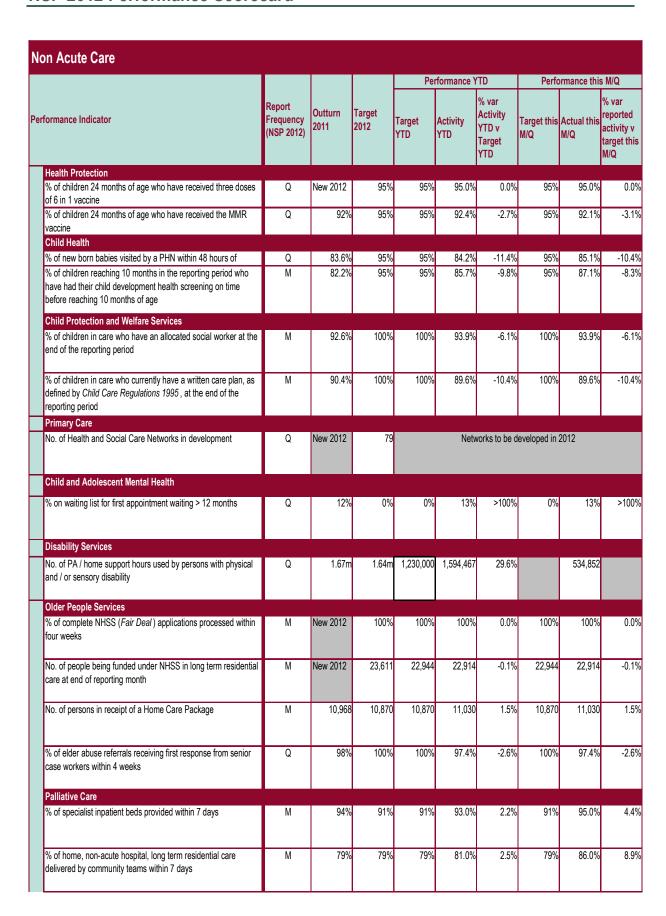
- 286,472 people were admitted as emergencies in our acute hospitals that provide an Emergency Care service. This is 7,091 greater than during the same period in 2011. Overall 68.9% of all admissions are reported as 'emergency'.
- 451,808 inpatients have been treated in publicly funded acute and specialist hospitals between January and September 2012. This is 10,260, 2.3% more than in the same period in 2011 and 7.6% above the service plan target.
- 623,550 day cases have been treated in publicly funded acute and specialist hospitals between January and September 2012. This is 11,257, 1.8% more than in the same period in 2011 and 5% above target..
- The total number of patients waiting for a first time outpatient appointment, as of 18th October is 385,462, 71.1% of whom are waiting less than 12 months.
- As at the end of September, 1.59m personal assistant / home support hours have been used by people with a physical and / or sensory disability. This activity is 364,080 (29.6%) in excess of the target of 1.23m hours. 4,161 people have benefited from a personal assistant / home support service so far this year which is 3% over the annual target of 4,038.
- Lung cancer rapid access: The percentage of people who attended or were offered an appointment within 10 working days was 89.5% (605 patients). The national target is 95%.
- Prostate Cancer rapid access: The total number of attendances nationally at prostate cancer rapid access clinics for third quarter was 635. The percentage of these patients who attended or were offered an appointment within 20 working days was 40.6% (258 patients). The national target is 90% of patients. This area is now the subject of particular focus.

Human Resources

- The health sector is 1,193 WTEs below the current approved employment ceiling of 102,936 and 219 WTEs below the end of 2012 ceiling target of 101,962.
- September employment census shows a fall of 93 WTEs from August and compares with a decrease of 224 WTEs for the same month last year.

National Clinical Programmes update

The implementation of the clinical programmes continues with benefits being achieved, examples of which are outlined here.

Heart Failure

The percentage of people diagnosed with Acute Decompensated Heart Failure (ADHF) patients being seen in the eight acute hospitals providing structured Heart Failure programme is now at 92.7%.

The three month readmission rate in these eight hospitals is 7.5%. This is based on small numbers as many of the units are only operational for a number of months. While extremely encouraging this is likely to increase as number of centres increases. While baseline readmission rates prior to establishment of heart failure units are not available they are estimated at 28% based on international data and data from St Vincent's University. Best international practice is 12 – 15% three month readmission rate.

Acute Coronary Syndrome

65% of eligible patients presenting with ST Segment Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) are now receiving Primary Percutaneous Coronary Intervention (PPCI), this is up from 44%.

Asthma

An adult education programme in primary and secondary care supported by an online e-learning programme is now in place. As of May 684 staff had registered for the online learning programme and 262 have completed the programme. The programme contributes to the work underway to reduce asthma deaths by 90% in ten years and Emergency Department visits by 10% (2,000) over three years.

Epilepsy

The Regional Epilepsy Centres in Galway, Beaumont, Limerick and St James's are now providing services and new patients are being seen within two weeks of referral. Work is complete on the two bedded Epilepsy Monitoring Units in Cork University Hospital and the four bedded unit in Beaumont, these will be operational, subject to availability of resources, in 2013.

Diabetes Footcare

A number of additional podiatrists have been appointed to support the diabetes programme. In services where podiatrists are in place patients with active foot disease are seen within 24 to 48 hours and medium to high risk feet seen within four weeks.

Obstetrics & Gynaecology

New high specification ultrasound machines have been installed in all early pregnancy services in the 19 Maternity Hospitals nationally.

There are 19 Early Pregnancy Clinics now providing services. Following a clinical audit undertaken by the programme in 2011 no cases of miscarriage misdiagnosis were confirmed. This compares with 18 cases in the five years audited by the Miscarriage Misdiagnosis Report. This audit will be ongoing.

An on line teaching module on early pregnancy ultrasound for all trainees in obstetrics has been developed. A diploma in early pregnancy ultrasound has been established in UCD. The first successful graduates completed the course in December 2011.

Rehabilitation Medicine

Public Consultation into Prosthetic and Orthotics/Specialist Footwear services in Ireland is underway and engagement with Prosthetic and Orthotics stakeholders is complete.

In September the first of a number of 'World Cafés' were held. The World Café provides an opportunity for the users to meet in a social/relaxed environment to get to know other users of the service and to give open feedback on the service they are receiving. There was a very good attendance at this first open café session and it is planned to have a number of these on an ongoing basis.

Palliative Care

A competency framework is being developed for all staff involved in Palliative care.

A rapid discharge protocol has been developed for patients who wish to die at home.

A national review is in progress on the use of palliative care support beds in order to improve patient flow from acute hospitals and improve quality of care.

No hospital reached the target of 95% of all attendees at ED being discharged or admitted within 6 hours, or 100% of people admitted within 9 hours of registration in September.

The **top performing hospitals**, those who reached a performance level of 80% or above for all attendees being seen within 6 hours are Tullamore, St Luke's Kilkenny, Letterkenny, Portiuncula and St John's. Hospitals who reached 90% or above in relation to those who were admitted within 9 hours were St Luke's Kilkenny, Letterkenny, Portiuncula and St John's Hospital in Limerick.

No **hospital** reported a performance of 50% or under in reaching the 6 hour target for all attendees.

The **hospital which faced the greatest challenge** in reaching the 9 hour target for people admitted (reporting a performance at 30% or under) was Beaumont (26.3%).

Elective Waiting Time

Percentage of Adults waiting greater than 9 months for an elective procedure (M)

At the beginning of the year it was intended that no adults would be waiting greater than 9 months for an elective procedure by 30 September 2012. All Hospitals have actively worked to reach the September target.

At the end of September, there were 415 (Inpatients 235 + Day Case 180) adults waiting greater than 9 months for an elective procedure. This represents 0.9% of the adult waiting list for elective procedures and shows a decrease of 1,791 patients compared to the position at the end of August and a decrease of 4,263 patients from the end of January. 27 hospitals (69.2%) currently have no adults waiting greater than 9 months.

Percentage of Children waiting greater than 20 weeks for an elective procedure (M)

In January it was intended that no children would be waiting greater than 20 weeks for an elective procedure by 30 September 2012 and throughout the year hospitals have been actively working to reach this target.

At the end of September, 276 (Inpatients 150 + Day Case 126) children were waiting greater than 20 weeks for an elective procedure. This represents 9.0% of the child waiting list for elective procedures and shows a decrease of 394 patients compared to the position at the end of August and a decrease of 1,436 children from the end of January.

Colonoscopy / Gastrointestinal Service

No. of people waiting more than 4 weeks for an urgent colonoscopy (M)

Census week ending 30th September reports 2 patients waiting >28 days, from referral, for an urgent (priority 1) colonoscopy. These 2 cases were reported in CUH and have since both received their treatment.

Number of patients waiting greater than 3 months following a referral for a Gastrointestinal Endoscopy (M)

At the beginning of the year it was intended that no patients will be waiting greater than 3 months following a referral for a GI Endoscopy by 30 September 2012.

At the end of September, there were 743 patients waiting greater than 3 months for a GI Endoscopy. This represents 9.4% of all patients currently waiting and shows a decrease of 968 patients compared to the position at the end of August and a decrease of 4,372 patients from the end of January.

Other Acute performance indicators and activity data

Time to surgery: % of emergency hip fracture surgery carried out within 48 hours (pre-op LOS: 0, 1 or 2) (M)

83% of emergency hip fracture surgery was carried out within 48 hours (pre-op LOS: 0, 1 or 2 days) in September against a targe of 95%

This is reported through HIPE and is based on a rolling 12 month period from October 2011 to September 2012.

Admission on day of procedure: % elective inpatients who had principle procedure conducted on day of admission(M)

54% of patients had their principle procedure on the same day as they were admitted against a target of 75%. This compares to 49% for the equivalent reporting period in 2011.

This is reported through HIPE and is based on a rolling 12 month period from October 2011 to September 2012.

% day case surgeries as a % of day case + inpatient for specified basket of procedures (General Surgery, ENT, Ophthalmology) (M)

75% of the chosen basket of procedures were carried out on a day care basis against a target of 75%. This compares to 74% for the equivalent reporting period in 2011.

This is reported through HIPE and is based on a rolling 12 month period from October 2011 to September 2012.

Medical patient average length of stay (ALOS) (M)

The National figure for medical inpatient average length of stay (ALOS) in September 2012 is 6.9 days. This shows an improved performance when compared to 8.3 days in 2011. The target set for the programme post full implementation for ALOS is 5.8 days. The Acute Medicine Programme reviews hospitals according to where they are in the 3 year improvement programme. The timely placement of medical inpatients from Hospitals and the availability of services such as Home Care Packages effects performance in this area.

NOTE: This is reported through HIPE and is based on September 2012 data.

Re-admission: % of emergency re-admissions for acute medical conditions to the same hospital within 28 days of discharge (M)

There was a re-admission rate of 11% for acute medical conditions, to the same hospital within 28 days of discharge. The target for 2012 is 9.6%.

This is reported through HIPE and is based on a rolling 12 month period from October 2011 to September 2012.

Inpatient Discharges (M)

48,489 inpatient discharges were reported in September 2012 (based on 49 of 49 returns). Year to date to end of September 451,808 inpatients have been discharged.

Analysis shows that inpatient discharges are 7.6% above target and 2.3% above last years levels at the end of September.

Day Case Discharges(M)

66,883 day cases were reported as discharged in September 2012 (based on 50/50 returns). Year to date to end of September 623,550 day cases have been reported as discharged.

Analysis shows that day cases are 5.0% above target and 1.8% above last years levels at the end of September.

Delayed discharges: Number of Delayed Discharges and Reduction in bed days lost through delayed discharges (M)

At the end of September there were 693 people who had completed their acute phase of care and were medically fit for discharge. This is a marginal increase on the number of 690 reported at the end of August.

An estimated 18,452 bed days were deemed to have been unavailable in September for patients who had completed their acute phase of care and were medically fit for discharge.

Bed Closures

Nationally there were 872 beds reported closed for the week ending 30th September 2012, an overall decrease on the position in August.

Outpatient Waiting Times

The total number of patients waiting for a first time OP appointment, as of 18th October is 385,462, 52% of whom are waiting less than 6 months and 71.1% are waiting less than 12 months. These figures are now based on patient-level waiting time data from individual hospitals which is timelier than previous data and allows individual hospitals to better understand and manage their OP waiting lists. The data includes all but 2 hospitals.

Volume of OP activity remains high with 55,992 new patients seen in September and 142,302 return patients. An additional 51,629 new referrals were reported received by 36 of the 42 hospitals in September.

Considerable work has been ongoing to better understand demand, capacity, patient throughput and most especially the length of time people must wait for a first time outpatient appointment. There is increasingly more detailed information available on differentials between demand (new referrals) and capacity (numbers of new appointments offered) at individual speciality level.

A data rich environment will allow hospitals to proactively manage and realign their available capacity accordingly with the aim of shortening the maximum wait times that people must wait for an appointment. An incremental reduction in the maximum wait time for a first time OP appointment will be a key measure of success over the next 12 months.

As is currently underway with reducing waiting times for inpatient or daycase surgery a systematic and standardised approach will be undertaken to improve access to OP services. This will involve a radical restructuring of the delivery of OP services to ensure a more patient centred approach including the introduction of advanced booking and scheduling of appointments. The approach will also require hospitals to focus on ensuring that patients are seen in order of clinical acuity with urgent referrals seen first followed by the strict chronological management of non-urgent or routine referrals.

It is anticipated that this reform programme will require a particular focus on a small number of specialties which currently have the greatest mismatch between capacity and demand and as a result contribute to currently unacceptably long waiting times for many patients.

Lung Cancer: % of patients attending lung cancer rapid access clinic who attended or were offered an appointment within 10 working days of receipt of referral (Q)

Total number of attendances nationally at lung cancer rapid access clinics for third quarter was 676. The percentage of these patients who attended or offered an appointment within 10 working days was 89.5% (605 patients). The national target is 95% of patients to be seen or offered an appointment. Lung attendances nationally are slightly below target as one cancer centre (CUH) has limited access to CT scanning which is a pre-requisite for attendance at the clinic. Additional CT imaging capacity is being sourced and clinics are being restructured to increase capacity for new patients.

Prostate Cancer: % of patients attending prostate cancer rapid access clinics who attended or were offered an appointment within 20 working days of receipt of referral (Q)

Total number of attendances nationally at prostate cancer rapid access clinics for third quarter was 635. The percentage of these patients who attended or offered an appointment within 20 working days was 40.6% (258 patients). The national target is 90% of patients to be seen or offered an appointment. There has been an ongoing high rate of referrals to prostate cancer RACs which exceeds the capacity of the clinics. This is particularly applicable for HSE West.

There are 8 rapid access prostate cancer clinics however the CUH rapid access prostate clinic has not yet officially commenced. Plans for transfer of appropriate newly referred patients from MUH to the Rapid Access Clinic at CUH are at an advanced stage and this is a prerequisite for the full opening of the CUH unit.

Prostate cancer surgery is currently undertaken in 8 hospitals. There will ultimately be 7 prostate cancer centres nationally with two centres in DML (rather than one as originally envisaged). No further consolidation of capacity is expected in 2012.

Rectal Cancers: No. of centres providing services for rectal cancers (Q)

There are 13 centres providing rectal cancer surgery. An agreement was recently reached to transfer rectal cancer surgery from AMNCH (Tallaght Hospital) to the designated cancer centre in St. James's. This will take effect in January 2013. As series of meetings are ongoing in HSE West to centralise rectal cancer surgery into UCHG.

Radiotherapy (Q)

No. of patients who completed radiotherapy treatment for breast, lung, rectal or prostate cancer in the proceeding quarter.

A total of 648 patients completed their radiotherapy treatment in the preceding quarter, this bring the annual total patients to 1.835.

No. and % of patients undergoing radiotherapy treatment for breast, lung, rectal or prostate cancer who commenced treatment within 15 working days of being deemed ready to treat by the Radiation Oncologist.

A total of 501(77.3%) patients commenced treatment within 15 working days of being deemed ready to treat.

There are two factors impacting achievement the National KPI target of 90% for radiotherapy. There is a lack of capacity in both Cork and Galway University Hospitals, which is resulting in some delays. However this is being addressed by the new developments in both hospitals, under the National Plan for Radiation Oncology. In Dublin work is underway to expand capacity. A number of initiatives have recently been put in place that has improved access and these improvements are expected to continue in the coming months."

MRSA: The MRSA bloodstream infection rate has been decreasing since 2006. While the rate appears to be levelling in the past year, the overall reduction is still ahead of national targets.

Clostridium difficile: The national rate has decreased for the first half of 2012, though some of the increase in cases seen in 2011 was due to the introduction of improved laboratory diagnostic methods in many hospitals. For the second quarter of 2012 17.8% of cases were community-associated, which is a similar proportion to previous quarters.

Antibiotic Consumption Community: Community antibiotic consumption normally increases during the winter months, which may explain the deviation from national targets seen for the first half of 2012. Decreases in consumption were found for some antibiotic classes, which may reflect the impact of the 2011 public information campaign and primary care prescribing guidelines. Further national promotion in this area is planned for Q4 2012.

Antibiotic Consumption Hospitals: Hospital antibiotic consumption continues to increase nationally, despite the success of antibiotic stewardship programmes in some hospitals. Some of the increase seen this year may be related to changes in hospital activity, acuity and staffing levels.

Alcohol Hand Rub: Alcohol hand rub consumption is a surrogate marker of hand hygiene activity in hospitals. The median national consumption has since doubled since 2006. There was a slight increase for the first half of 2012 (compared to the overall median for 2011), but this fell short of the target. However, this reflects consumption prior to the annual WHO World Hand Hygiene Day, and the associated HSE poster campaign, in May 2012.

Hand Hygiene: Observational audits are carried out nationally twice per year (May/Jun and October/November), based on WHO audit methodology. The results for the May/June 2012 audit will be available in November 2012.

There was a revised submission for previous quarters with referrals for Q1 now 665 and Q2 639. In Q3 2012 there were 546 referrals made nationally to the elder abuse service. Thus the YTD position is 1850 which reflects a 6% increase on referrals last year. If referral rates stay constant we would predict a year end position of 2467.

In terms of abuse categories the pattern evident in previous quarters is replicated in Q3 psychological remains the main alleged abuse type 29% followed by financial 22%, neglect 15% and physical 11%. There was an increase in the profile of financial abuse

At this time-point the total number of active cases is 1261. The highest proportion is from the West (34%) despite the fact that the yearly referral rate is highest in HSE South (31%). Specifically in the West, Limerick and Galway have the highest numbers of open cases. There were only 5 cases that did not receive first response within the 4 week timeframe.

Mental Health

Child and Adolescent waiting lists

In 2012 there has been a greater demand on the CAMH service with a 21% increase in the number of referrals accepted and a 9% increase on the number of new cases seen when compared to the same period last year.

The Child and Adolescent Mental Health Waiting List is 14% (257 cases) above the projected year end target of 1,799 cases, when taking into account the seasonal peaks and troughs of this metric, the figure has also increased by 8% when compared to the same period last year whilst managing the greater demand the service has experienced.

Greater than 12 months on the waiting list

76% (44) teams have no patients waiting greater than 12 months on their waiting lists although there are 272 patients waiting greater than 12 months (or 13% of the overall waiting list) when also taking into account the seasonal peaks and troughs of the metric the figure has actually reduced by -6% when compared to the same period last.

8 out of the 14 teams make up 88% (239) of the 272 waiting longer than 12 months with the waiting lists this is comprised of one team in DNE, three teams in the South and four in the West this issue is actively being addressed by the Regional Mental Specialists.

The financial report for the HSE for September shows a deficit of €399m (4.4%) against a spend year to date of €9,543m. The main components of this are community schemes €180m, hospitals €207m and community services €22m. Further analysis is included in this report.

September is the first month in which there has been a reduction in the deficit reported. There are indications that the cost containment measures in place are reducing spend rates. The community based schemes continue to run significant deficits which increased by an additional €29m in the month of September.

Primary Care Schemes have incurred expenditure of €2.018m compared to a budget of €1.838m resulting in a year to date deficit of €179m. Expenditure reduction initiatives are underway and will yield €6M cash reduction between September and year end. Additional cash reduction measures amounting to €11m are also being implemented. As these initiatives manifest they will be factored into the year end forecast.

Medical Cards

The number of persons eligible for a medical card has increased from 1,694,063 (as at 1 January 2012) to 1,838,603 (as at 1 October 2012) i.e. growth of +144,540 persons eligible for medical cards year to date. As at 1 October 2012, the growth in the number of persons with a medical card is exceeding the National Service Plan target by +39,540 persons.

This growth beyond service plan levels is putting upward pressure on GMS costs e.g. the number of items reimbursed on the Medical Card Scheme has grown by +3.188m items when compared to the same period last year. In addition to this, the cost per item trend is upwards.

High Tech Drugs (HTD)

The expenditure on High Tech Medicines continues to increase with a year to date expenditure of €300.12M compared to a year to date budget of €219.8M. The reported variance is €80.3M over budget at the end of September.

Human Resources



The health sector is 1,193 WTEs below the current approved employment ceiling of 102,936. September employment census shows a fall of 93 WTEs from August and compares with a decrease of 224 WTEs for the same month last year. This reduction is in the context of continuing upward growth pressures from contingency recruitment post 29th February and ongoing filling of new service developments as well as further enhanced controls on recruitment and cost containment.

The Integrated Services Directorate in overall terms recorded a decrease of -94 WTEs, with decreases in Acute Hospital Services of 21 WTEs and decrease in Primary and Community Services of 106 WTEs.

Human Resources

- Medical/Dental staffing recorded a monthly increase of 79 WTEs (+24 WTEs in YTD).
- Nursing decreased by 74 WTEs, (-1,157 since end 2011). The initial impact of the end of student nurse placements in some locations appears to in many instances to have been more than offset by other increases in staff nurse numbers.
- Health & Social Care Professionals showed a decrease by 48 WTEs (-494 WTEs since end 2011). Management/admin increased by 26 WTEs (-288 WTEs since end 2011) and appears primarily to be due to staff returning from unpaid leave or from career-breaks. It should be noted that this staff category has reduced by 2,726 WTEs (-15.42%) since its peak in October 2007 and are now at levels last seen in December 2002 despite significant subsumed admin staff and the creation of other new posts in this category in the intervening period.
- General Support Staff decreased by 37 WTEs (-389 WTEs since end 2011).
- Other Patient & Client Care decreased by 10 WTEs since August (-345 WTEs YTD).

- In relation to "exempted grades"; Consultant WTEs increased by 7 and are showing a 43 WTE increase, year-to-date despite the impact of grace period retirements. They are 200 WTEs above the end 2009 levels. Increases in Consultant WTEs seen in recent years have resulted in them now constituting some 2.47% of overall health sector employment. NCHDs WTEs increased by 50 WTEs (+11 WTEs in YTD) in September and are +146 WTEs ahead of 2009 levels.
- Physiotherapists have increased by 8 WTEs, Speech and Language Therapists have decreased by -5 WTEs and Occupational Therapist have remained unchanged.
- Social Worker grades recorded a decrease of -3 WTEs, but are still some 174 WTEs above the 2009 levels. No
 additional posts under Children and Families 2010 (Ryan Report) were filled in September. The recruitment process to fill
 the 64 outstanding posts approved in the National Service Plan 2010 is still ongoing, as are the remaining 2.25 WTEs
 development posts set out in the National Service Plan 2011. Psychologists and Counsellors decreased by -6 WTEs this
 month.

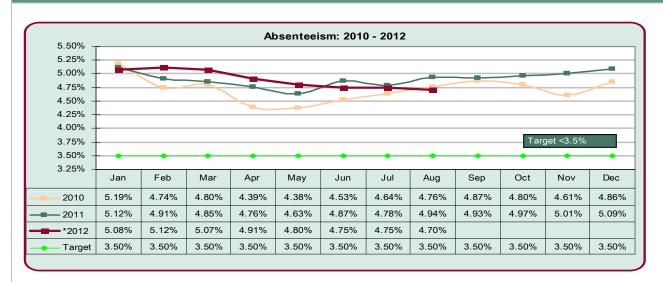

Service Arrangements and Grant Aid Agreements

Agencies with whom the HSE has a Service Arrangement / Grant Aid Agreement in place (Q)

- In the Acute sector 15 of the 16 voluntary Hospitals, have completed Service Arrangements with sign off imminent on the final, St. James.
- Of the 27 Non Acute Agencies in receipt of over €10 million in the non acute sector 14 have completed with the remainder all indicating that they will sign with the exception of a single provider who is in negotiations on whether they will continue to provide services.
- While the over all position is somewhat less favourable than at the same time last year, the changes made to the service specification requirements, together with the cost containment issues, in particular with the disability agencies, has increased the negotiation and validation process for the completion of the Service Arrangements. It is envisioned that the majority of larger agencies will have completed by the end of October.
- Agencies providing services across care groups, areas and regions will have a more complex contractual relationship than
 an agency providing a single care group service in a single area.
- The Service Schedules (Part 2) are in the process of being negotiated with agencies, with the completion of Part 1
 dependant on the prior completion of these schedules.
- The regional implementation plans had given the end of April as the due date for the completion of Part 1& 2 where the Agency is operating in a single area, however the changes to the level of detail required has resulted in this target not being achieved, some Agencies are still outstanding with end of October now the target completion date for them.
- Where Agencies are operational in multi areas the completion date for Part 1 had been targeted as end June, as this requires the coordination of all service schedules and is dependant on their completion, however again the timeframe for completion is now moved out to the end of October.
- An implementation plan to cover Agencies in the "For Profit" / Commercial sector not previously covered by Governance Documentation has been agreed. A communication strategy is being developed and a successful information session was held in DNE. The operational system are working to identify and communicate with all relevant agencies, the national register will have a complete picture of the scope of the funding and separate arrangements this year, but it is likely, given the scale of what is involved that work on progressing the individual governance arrangements will need to be approached on a phased and prioritised based and will therefore continue into 2013.
- Work is also underway to establish a working group to consider the broader issues of effective management of the significant resources expended, and the HSE's requirements in compliance with it's own internal financial regulations, and the wider regulatory environment including EU procurement legislation in this category.
 The commercial/for profit agencies are not included in the monitoring statistics below.
- Our Legal Advisors have given assurances that there is an implied continuity of contract, with Agencies that have previously completed Governance documentation, operational until such time as the new Governance Documentation is completed.
- At the request of the ISD Management team a group has been established to review capacity /competency requirements and gaps which are impacting on the systems capability to fully implement the governance framework in an effective manner.

The funding percentages detailed below will not reflect the totality of funding for 2012 as the register figures may be recorded as "not yet known" where negotiations are ongoing with service providers.

Gross current vote expenditure is €319m over profile, while current appropriations-in-aid collected directly by the HSE are €92m under profile resulting in a **net current overspend of €411m** (€374m at the end of September, 2012).

Gross capital expenditure is €25m under profile and capital appropriations in aid are €2m under profile.

Gross current vote expenditure is €304m over profile, while current appropriations-in-aid collected directly by the HSE are €70m under profile resulting in a **net current overspend of €374m** (€329m at the end of August, 2012).

Gross capital expenditure is €26m under profile and capital appropriations in aid are €2m under profile.

Actual delivery of these measures may vary from the figures stated, for example it is anticipated at this stage that the cash collection from private income may yield €111m though both HSE and the Department will continue to seek the full amount due. The HSE has further proposed measures totalling €130m in place and is pursuing the delivery of these.

In light of the above the vote outturn is heading for a figure of \in 293m. The achievement of the \in 130m in the last three months of the year in cash terms would see a vote outturn of \in 163m. The vote reports for the remainder of the year will report on the performance against these targets.

The return which accompanies this report has been prepared on the basis of a balanced vote at year end to avoid declaring the need for a supplementary estimate at this stage. In light of the fact that there is a €200m projected deficit in community drug schemes the HSE is at present reducing services in the community to compensate for the excess demand on schemes.
