KULLIYAH OF EDUCATION, INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY MALAYSIA

The Kulliyah of Education (KOED) is one of Malaysia's top education schools, delivering a wide range of undergraduate and postgraduate courses in areas such as Islamic Education, Quranic Education, Arabic Language, English Language, Educational Psychology, Educational Management and Leadership, Counseling, and Instructional Technology.

KOED strives for educational excellence by bridging the gap between educational theory and practice, and to inspire its students to develop lifelong learning skills and practical knowledge that will significantly enhance their future career and quality of life. Many of its graduates have gone on to occupy a wide range of leading roles.



BACKGROUND

The Kulliyah of Education (KOED), was established as a Department of Education on July 16, 1987. It was set up to assist in meeting Malaysia's need for graduate teachers. It offered the Diploma of Education programme to prepare teachers to teach in secondary schools.

In May 1997, the Department began offering a limited Bachelor of Education Programme in Arabic Language and Literature for teachers from the Ministry of Education Special Diploma Programme.

Beginning 2003, the Kulliyah began conducting a twinning programme with the Ministry of Education to upgrade the qualification and skills of in-service and pre-service teachers to Bachelor Degree in five (5) programmes – B.Ed Teaching of English as a Second Language (in-service), B.Ed. Teaching of Arabic as a Second Language, B.Ed. Counselling (in-service), B.Ed. Moral Education (in-service), B.Ed. TESL (pre-service).

As of July 2007, the Ministry of Education is again requesting all IPTAs including IIUM to help produce graduate teachers, and KOED begins to offer four (4) B.Ed. programmes for students coming through the mainstream programme. The four (4) B.Ed. programmes, each for a duration of 4 years, are as follows:- B.Ed. TESL, B.Ed. TASL, B.Ed. Counseling and B.Ed. Islamic Education.

In July 2012, four departments were established in the Kulliyah. They are the Department of Social Foundations and Educational Leadership, Department of Educational Psychology and Counseling, Department of Curriculum and Instruction, and the Department of Language and Literacy.

The Kulliyah offers M.Ed. and Ph.D Programmes in Counseling, Curriculum and Instruction, Educational Management and Leadership ,Educational Psychology, Social Foundations of Education, Instructional Technology, Teaching of Arabic to Non Arabic Speakers, Teaching of Islamic Education and Teaching Thinking. It also offers Postgraduate Diploma in Education.

PHILOSOPHY

Programmes and activities of the Kulliyah of Education are founded on the principles contained in the philosophy of IIUM, which was inspired by the recommendations of the First World Conference on Muslim Education held in Mecca in A.H 1398 (A.D. 1977). The spirit of this philosophy is based on the Holy *Qur'an*, in particular the five verses revealed to the Prophet Muhammad, namely, *Surah al-Alaq*, verses 1 - 5. Briefly these principles are:

1. All interpretations of knowledge are based on an Islamic worldview of Life, the Universe and Creation.
2. The basis for interpretation of all forms of knowledge is *Tawhid* and its manifestation in our way of life. Knowledge, therefore, shall be propagated in the spirit of *Tawhid*, which stipulated that Allah is the Absolute, the Creator, the Master and Cherisher of the Universe.
3. The ultimate purpose of knowledge is to lead man to the realization of his position as a servant of Allah and His *Khalifah* on earth, and to prepare him to fulfil these roles and be accountable to Allah with regards to his deeds and action.
4. The interpretation and propagation of knowledge proceed from the recognition of "*wahy*" as divinely revealed which must take precedence over acquired knowledge.

Keynote 1



PROFESSOR EMERITUS TAN SRI DATO' DZULKIFLI ABDUL RAZAK
Rector, International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM)

Dzulkifli Abdul Razak (or for short, Dzul) is currently the Rector of the International Islamic University Malaysia. He was the Vice Chancellor of USM from 2000-2011. He is the immediate past president of the International Association of Universities (IAU), a UNESCO-affiliated organisation, based in Paris. He was the Convenor of the Regional Centre for Expertise on Education for Sustainable Development based in USM beginning 2005. Dzul was awarded the prestigious *2017 Gilbert Medal* by Universitas 21 in recognition of "his long term commitment to a sustainable approach to international higher education." He is a Fellow of the Academy of Sciences Malaysia (FASc), the World Academy of Art and Science (FWAAS) and the World Academy of Islamic Management (FWAIM).

He is an Honorary Professor at the University of Nottingham since 2014, and more recently appointed Senior Advisor at Asia-Europe Institute (AEI), UM. He is also the Co-Chair of Right Livelihood College Steering Committee based at University of Bonn, and an Advisory Board Member, Institute of Sustainable Development and Learning in Leuphana, Germany. He was an invited speaker at The 2015 Nobel Dialogue in Sweden.

For almost 25 years he writes weekly Op-Ed columns for various Malaysia news media like *The New Straits Times*, *The Edge* and *The Sun*.

KEYNOTE 2

TRANSFORMING OUR GRADUATES INTO PROSUMERS

Professor Dr Mohamed Ridza Wahiddin DSc FASc
Vice-Chancellor of Universiti Sains Islam Malaysia (USIM)

ABSTRACT

The portmanteau 'prosumer' comes from the words 'producer' and 'consumer'. It was first coined by Alvin Toffler in his 1980 book "The third wave". It is about empowering the ordinary consumers. This has the potential to revolutionise the sharing economy by giving control back to consumers. It also means consumers are also producers. Prosumerism is best described by how the media industry is today. Media digitisation and decentralisation have disrupted the incumbents by bringing down prices and increasing share options for consumers. The advent of social media has significantly increased the opportunities for the common people in cities and rural areas to create, distribute and profit from their innovative minds without going through the conventional media company. Living proofs include the international and local celebrities: Justin Bieber and Najwa Latif. They started their career after they were discovered through their videos in YouTube. Today, we can easily download free open source software, courseware and even hardware designs. This means more consumers may leverage on these freebies and their active participation in production having a knock on effect of cheaper products. Our graduates may be transformed into prosumers to alleviate the graduate employment issue. This is possible because of advancement in technology such the Internet of Things, 3-D printers, data analytics and deep learning.

PLENARY 1

SUSTAINABLE TEACHER TRAINING: REVISITING TEACHER EDUCATION IN MALAYSIA

PROFESSOR DR. AINOL MADZIAH ZUBAIRI
Dean, Kulliyah of Education, International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM)

ABSTRACT

The teaching profession is vital for Malaysia to achieve the educational aims and aspirations of enhancing education quality in the public schools. Nonetheless, over the years the teaching profession has also been more challenging. The Malaysian government has continuously put efforts to ensure that highly qualified pre-service teachers are produced, and in-service teachers have the avenues to improve their knowledge and skills in the profession in meeting the contemporary needs and challenges. This paper traces the history of the teacher training in Malaysia, discusses the National Education Philosophy (or FPK) and relates the FPK to the Program Learning outcomes of the Teacher Educations programs. It eventually discusses the issues and challenges that need to be addressed in teacher training programs with regards to the current demands involving Education for Sustainable Development (ESD), the 4IR and Teacher Competency.

PLENARY 2

EDUCATION MANAGEMENT IN FACING THE INDUSTRIAL REVOLUTION 4.0 (IR4.0)

DR. BALASANDRAN A. RAMIAH
Expert Lecturer Special Grade C (Jusa C), Aminuddin Baki Institute

ABSTRACT

The advent of cyber physical systems, internet of things and networks makes things move on and exceed the speed which we have never predicted and thought of before. We are in the era of IR4.0. This era will definitely create new jobs and there are many existing jobs that will be eliminated. It is estimated that there are 75 million jobs in 2022 which will be replaced by automation, and 133 million new roles will emerge as technology advances. Hence, the key to thrive in the IR4.0 century is to produce learners that could solve real world challenges by collaboration. Thus, the curriculum and learning experiences are redesigned to encourage active learning in line with the requirement of IR4.0. The Minister of Education in his mandate, has outlined eight important aspects i.e. the value of human capital, Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics education (STEM), English Language education, Teaching and learning of Science and Mathematics in English, Digital education, Unity, and Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) to the academic sector. To prepare students for the Fourth Industrial Revolution, the ministry is working towards increasing the interest in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) subjects, The Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) which focuses on implementing the country's TVET roadmap to produce holistic, well-balanced graduates with entrepreneurial skills. Besides that, the school transformation programmes (TS25) is initiated to increase student achievement in schools through effective leadership, competent teachers and strong commitment of the community. It is important that these initiatives taken, can build digital literacy students who can think critically about using technology for the benefit of everybody's lives.

LEARNING HOW TO LEAD

Prof.Dr.Dawood Abdulmalek Yahya AL-Hidabi
Kulliyah of Education, IIUM

ABSTRACT

Leadership is a continuous process and its effectiveness is accumulative. Success in leadership cannot be gained or acquired by having a PhD in educational management and leadership or even being a professor in educational leadership. Mere understanding the knowledge of leadership, attending training on leadership or even holding a leadership position or job might not be sufficient to be a successful leader of an educational institution. A management leader who is passionate, competent in thinking skills, poses the quality of love of learning, has rich experience in educational leadership, exemplary in his/her decisions and behaviour, has accurate awareness about the context and committed to professional ethics might prove to be more successful and effective than others. An attempt will be made present a proposed grass root, hands-on and action-based model of effective educational leadership.

EXPLORING THE EXPERIENCE OF MULTI-CULTURALLY ENGAGED ACADEMICS VIA CULTURAL INTELLIGENCE IN AN INTERNATIONAL CONTEXT.

Assoc. Prof. Dr. Faizah Idrus
Kulliyah of Education, IIUM

ABSTRACT

A setting such as an institution with staff and students from diverse cultural and religious backgrounds can be demanding. It needs a general grasp of cultural understanding to avoid misconception, misjudgement and confusion so as to avoid communication breakdown and frustrations in their daily transactions. Recognising the importance of Cultural Intelligence (CQ) is therefore paramount. CQ is the ability to function and manage effectively in culturally diverse setting with sound reasoning to solve problems. It includes the application of four CQ components which are metacognitive, cognitive, motivational and behavioural dimensions in a person's communication. Thus, this investigation seeks to examine the perceived CQ of academic staff (local and international) at The International Islamic University Malaysia. A qualitative design was employed and semi-structured interviews were carried out with eight academics in relation to their understanding and behaviour towards cultural knowledge and skills. The four CQ components act as predictors of cross-cultural adaptations and metacognitive CQ is predicted to have a better socio-cultural adaptation to the multicultural setting. The results are discussed in relation to the Badura's Socio-cultural theory as well as Festinger's Cognitive Dissonance theory.

LEAD 3

ENGAGING LEARNING VIA STUDENT-FACULTY PARTNERSHIP: A SoTL APPROACH

Professor Dr. Rosna Awang-Hashim
School of Education & Modern Languages, Universiti Utara Malaysia

ABSTRACT

How can students and faculty collaborate and create enhanced learning and teaching experiences? How do students from a high power-distance culture navigate through their new assigned roles of partnership with their faculty? Student-faculty partnership in higher education is emerging as a distinguished practice in the West especially for undergraduates. However, little is known about the impact of such practices in the East, particularly Malaysia. Using a SoTL research approach, the study aimed (1) to describe students' perception of the benefits of partnering with their faculty in co-creating and delivering the classroom instruction and (2) the strategies students use to negotiate their new role to forge a partnership with their faculty. This presentation will report the benefits of a term long collaboration between the students and faculty in designing and delivering classroom instructions through the experiences of faculty–student partnership of post graduate students. Students also provided insightful information on the mechanism of navigating through their newly assigned roles of partnership with their faculty.

LEAD 4

AGENDA 2030 FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT AND THE FUTURE OF EDUCATION AND THE WORLD OF WORK

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ABSTRACT

The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development adopted in 2015 sets up an ambitious plan to address global issues with broad framework of action for people, planet and prosperity. Education is one of the main drivers in SDGs thus SDG4 is focused exclusively on education based on the principles of human rights and dignity, social justice, inclusion, protection, culture, linguistics and ethnic diversity. Against this backdrop of an increasingly globalised and inter-connected world and amidst the calls for education to promote peace, well-being, prosperity and sustainability, interest in promoting 21st century skills and embedding Global Citizenship Education (GCED) and Educational for Sustainable Development (ESD) in education settings have been growing especially in the era of industrial revolution. The fourth industrial revolution, a term that was popularised by Klaus Schwab (2016; p.12), highlights that “emerging technologies and broad-based innovation are diffusing much faster and more widely than in previous ones [industrial revolution], which continue to unfold in some parts of the world”. The ever-changing pace of technological advances means that the skills learned today may become obsolete tomorrow, thus demanding a very different set of skills and competencies in order for the global workers to function effectively (Ananiadou & Claro, 2009). The changing demand on skills required is further supported by Dede (2010) who argues that mastery in the 21st century skills and competencies is different from that of the previous century largely because of the emergence of digital, information and communication technology. The future of many jobs will depend on the pace of technological development and adoption. (APEC, 2017a). The trends fall into five themes of future skills and competencies, which are economic competitiveness; employability skills; global citizenship and national identity; social cohesion, understanding and valuing diversity, respect and personal growth Lambert (2017). Therefore, these trends and directions should motivate teachers and educators to prepare their students with relevant learning experiences that will be able to prepare them for future skills and competencies for global sustainability.

LEAD 5

THE SECRETS TO SUCCESSFUL SMALL SCHOOL

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ABSTRACT

What makes a successful principal? Of course there is no one solution for successful school leadership, but there are certain strategies that most effective principals share. The purpose of the study was to identify the strategies practiced by three principal in leading rural small school from sinking to success. This exploratory qualitative study used in-depth interviews for data collection involving three excellent principal who was purposely selected because of their experience and trail of excellence in turning sinking schools into success. Data collected was transcribed and analysed thematically. The study found that there were four effective strategies practice by these principals, namely (i) identifying the challenges/problems, (ii) optimize talent and trust among staffs, (iii) cultivate culturally responsive school communities, (iv) maintaining visibility, and (iv) leveraging partnership with experts. The findings should be shared to guide other small school principals facing similar sinking school challenges, and be used to train potential school leaders in troubleshooting such issues. Being pilot, future similar studies are inevitable involving more effective small school leaders as respondents to confirm the effectiveness of such strategies.

**COMMON ITEM LINKING PROCEDURE AS A SOLUTION FOR DEFICIENCY IN JUDGING PLAN AND
DOUBLE RATING OF ESSAYS**

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ABSTRACT

The purpose of this study was to explore the use of a common item linking procedure using multiple-choice grammar items to link subgroups of examinees' essays scored by independent pairs of raters. This procedure was tested as a means to provide a more equitable way to address deficiencies in essay judging plans as well as to evaluate the possibility of using a single rating for valid assessment of students' essays. A total of 2449 examinees' essay ratings, scored by 40 raters, and their responses to 40 MCQ grammar items were used as the data set in this study. The data were analyzed using FACETS version 3.48. The findings showed that the common item linking procedure using MCQ items provided not only the necessary links but also strong evidence that single ratings can yield similar measures as double ratings with these links in place. The use of this procedure can help resolve some of the issues surrounding essay scoring, particularly in large scale testing. The common item linking procedure has considerable promise as it has the potential to resolve some practical issues, such as time constraints, and the use of a large number of raters; as well as more serious validity issues such as rater errors and rater drift.

**NURTURING COMPETENCE IN TEACHING INTERMEDIATE AND LOWER INTERMEDIATE ESL/EFL
LEARNERS THROUGH R.E.S.E.T**

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ABSTRACT

Learning a second or foreign language is a complex process as learners are required to cover all aspects of a new language such as vocabulary, structures and culture of the target language (Brown, 2007). To facilitate and promote learning, teachers' roles, learning methods and strategies are vital (Mohammed, 2017). However, we cannot deny the fact that some ESL/EFL teachers fail to carry out their roles effectively due to a number of factors. Some of them have to face numerous challenges in making sure learning takes place in their classrooms. Their teaching challenges are heavier when they have to teach lower intermediate ESL/EFL learners who possess very limited English vocabulary and low motivation. This paper will highlight an approach that has been embraced by the researcher; R.E.S.E.T (Reflect, Explore, Stop, Execute, Test), to deal with challenges teaching lower intermediate learners. This acronym is a five-step approach that has been guiding the presenter to address many learning and teaching issues as well as developing numerous innovative strategies to promote learning among intermediate and lower intermediate ESL/EFL learners.

**CHALLENGES OF PUBLISHING IN SSCI AND SCOPUS INDEXED JOURNALS: WHAT CAN A POSTGRADUATE
STUDENT DO?**

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ABSTRACT

In this session, the presenter will highlight some of the challenges that are faced by postgraduate students in terms of writing and publishing articles in SSCI and SCOPUS indexed journals. In a somewhat interactive session, the presenter will attempt to address those challenges and suggest strategies and techniques (research wise and writing wise) that the postgraduates students could apply and implement.

PLACING LEARNING AND THE LEARNERS FIRST

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ABSTRACT

As universities move beyond the third platform era, the task of sustaining meaningful learning is an arduous task. To sustain simply means to strengthen or support and maintain at length without interruption or weakening. It also means growing and maintaining the pace and scale of change. With the looming changes and disruptions, higher education practitioners need to stay abreast and to understand the dynamics of learning in a VUCA state and technology rich environment. Research addresses this concern and promotes new knowledge, values and strategies in relation to the field. Thus, research and evidence based practices must be duly implemented to improve learning in higher education. This session deliberates on designing relevant and significant research for the purpose of advancing delivery and learning in higher education. In doing so, several current and innovative research practices will be shared.

LEAD 11

SIMULATION-BASED LEARNING: TURNING SCIENCE INTO ACTION

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ABSTRACT

Simulation-based learning is one of a teaching and learning approach where learners undergoing activity as though they would experience in the actual scenario through a simulated situation. This approach had been widely applied in several education field such as medical, biology, physics and engineering. It has the advantage of allowing learners to increase their understanding and skill through repetitive practice. Apart from that, it enables educators to implement various learning strategies to enhance student's skills and learning outcomes. Several studies had proven that this approach is able to link theoretical aspects into real world situation. Educators in the field of science face challenges to deliver their topic which could not be practically acquired through traditional classroom activity due to time, facilities and un-control factors. Hence there is a need to adopt alternative approach in the effort to allow learners to attain the intended learning outcome and required skills. Implementing simulation-based learning requires development of teaching materials and proper instructional design. A properly designed simulation-based learning not only brings to the redesign of teaching and learning activities, but it could also be extended to benefit the society. We report here how simulation-based learning can be developed and implemented which can turn science into action.

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ABSTRACT

Educational technology could be understood as the use of emerging and existing technologies to improve learning experiences in a variety of instructional settings, such as formal learning, informal learning, non-formal learning and lifelong learning. 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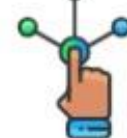

The Centre for Teaching Thinking is the new name for the former Centre for Philosophical Inquiry in Education (CPIE) that was established in January 2006 under Kulliyah of Education (KOED), International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). The change was necessary to adapt it to Malaysian context.

With the view of developing and promoting the practice of Islamic philosophy education, the Centre has conducted studies in the practice of this pedagogy for different levels – primary, secondary and tertiary education and has found it to be very stimulating and meaningful to students. In addition, the Centre has also organized numerous training programs relating to the Hikmah pedagogy to various groups, ranging from primary school children to educators and has since received positive feedback from the parties involved.

VISION

To revive the Islamic spirit of philosophical inquiry and intellectual tradition.

To become an excellent Centre for the development and practice of Islamic philosophy education.

The process of learning is equally important as its product.

The Centre for Teaching Thinking in IIUM promotes these skills through its **Hikmah (Wisdom) Pedagogy** based on Lipman's Philosophy for Children Programme and the Socratic method. Using these as the framework, CTT developed the community of inquiry-based programme that incorporates common, central and contestable concepts and ethical values appropriate for any society.

OBJECTIVES

To enable students to:

1. Be curious about themselves and nature, and develop inquisitive minds as manifested through questions
2. Be more critical, creative and ethical in their thoughts which help in solving problem and in making good judgements.
3. Be more clear in presenting their views and in supporting them with sound arguments.
4. Improve their communication skills and develop better self-confidence.
5. Be more open-minded towards different ideas, cultures and religions.
6. Deliberate over issues rationally through a Community of Inquiry that will foster personal and inter-personal skills.
7. Develop their imaginative, creative, intuitive and innovative abilities.
8. Find meaning in experience and apply them in their daily lives
