Dear Mr. mur, I am writing to you on the advice of your old Greend, John Burroughe, whom I am also fortunate mongle to clame for a friend. I was expecting to visit mr Burroughs this spring and be introduced to his sylvan and pastoral dimites, but a severe illness in Desember has left me on the verge of a breakdown and I may need to seek a more favorable climate to haster my recovery.
