Prof. Dr. jur. Peter J. Tettinger



It is with sadness that the Dean and Faculty of the Duquesne University School of Law together with the Duquesne Law Review Editorial Board note that since the symposium to which this issue of the Duquesne Law Review is dedicated, Prof. Dr. Peter J. Tettinger of the University of Cologne, Germany, passed away suddenly. Professor Tettinger was an active part of the Duquesne-Cologne partnership and a friend and colleague to members of the Duquesne University School of Law Faculty.

At home in Germany Professor Tettinger was the director of the Institute for Public Law and Administrative Sciences at the University of Cologne, as well as a judge on the Constitutional Court of the state of Northrhine-Westphalia. Since 2002 he was a member of the Northrhine-Westphalian Academy of Sciences. His scholarly work concerned a wide variety of different topics including matters of German and European Public Law, especially in areas of Human Rights, Administration, Law and Economics, and Local Government and Security. Professor Tettinger was also an avid soccer fan and official. He is survived by his wife and family.
