Certainly we have made a name for ourselves since September and we are looking forward to three more years of gaining distinction.

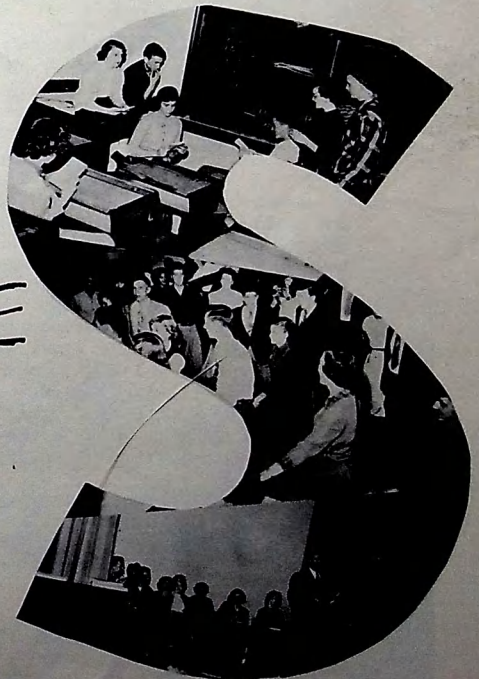

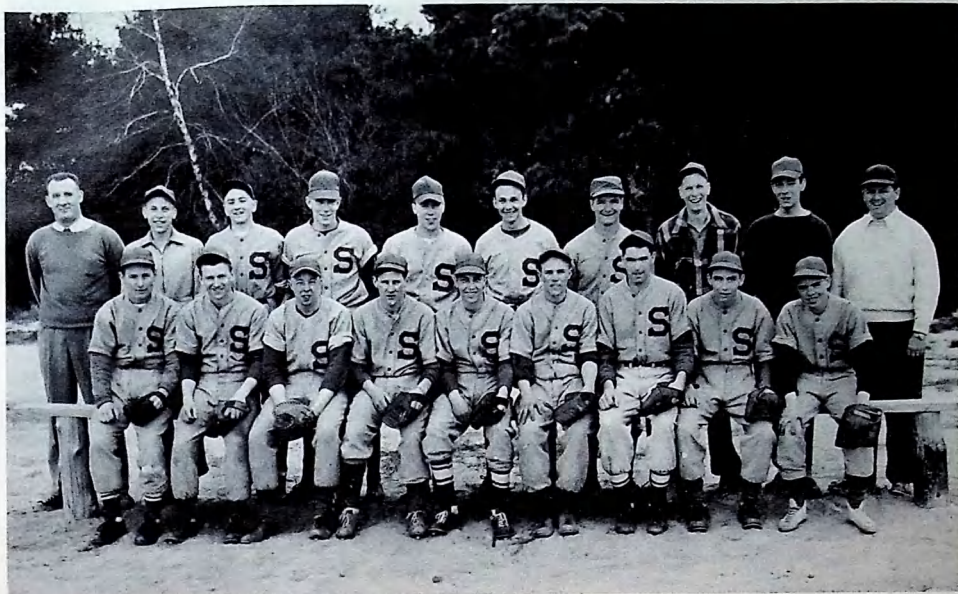
Boys' Basketball

Baseball

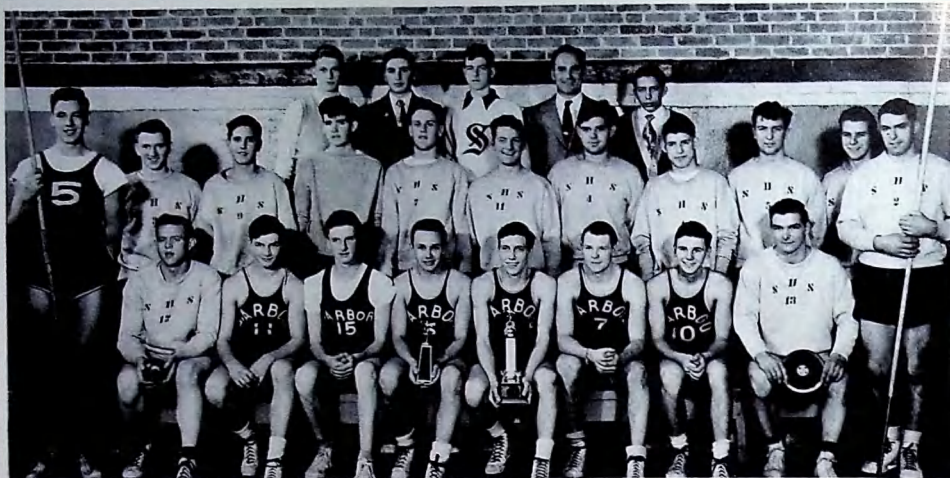

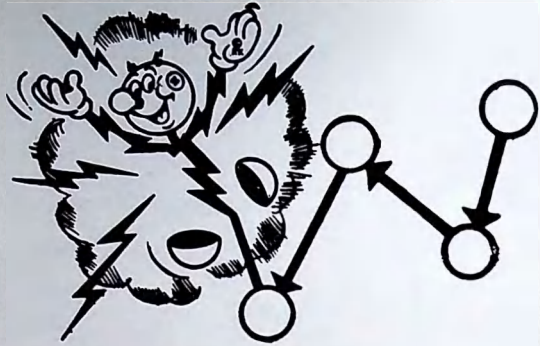

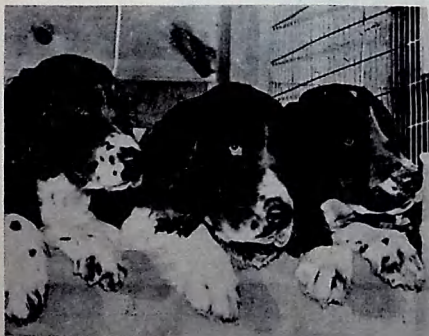
