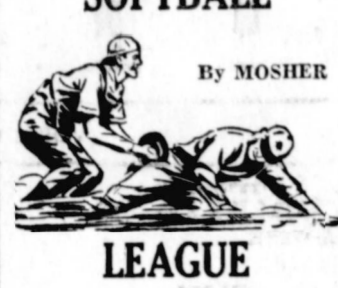

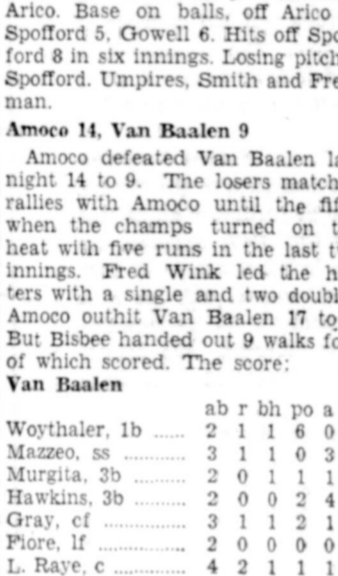

"If Teddy Were Back"

Swastika Would Not Be Flying Over Paris, Broad-bent Told Lions

Results of the recent Time quiz indulged in by members of the Rockland Lions Club were made known yesterday by Judge Frank H. Ingraham who directed the contest with assistance of Capt. Keryn ap Rice. "Duke" Annis was found to be high line with 79 correct answers.

Attention was called to the zone meeting which will be held at The Thornside Hotel at 6.30 p. m. next Wednesday replacing the noonday meeting.

S. Newton Broadbent of Long Cove, New York and Florida, a retired newspaper man, made his second appearance before the club and confirmed the excellent opinion which had been formed on the occasion of his first coming.

"What is America's greatest menace?" asked the speaker. "I will tell you," answering his own question, and in three words. It is the professional politician.

By way of demonstration Mr. Broadbent read from the Saturday Evening Post of Aug. 26, 1939, a story entitled "Boss on the Spot" the case history of Huey Johnson—and he cited the case of two widely known politicians whose salaries were a trifle in excess of \$6,000 each, yet were reported to be worth in the neighborhood of a million dollars.

Mr. Broadbent told of the letter which he wrote to President Roosevelt July 30, last year, stating that he had a simple remedy. Deprive him (the politician) of the power to give out jobs. That will fix him.
