The business course trains either for immediate employment in nearby firms or for further study in business colleges.

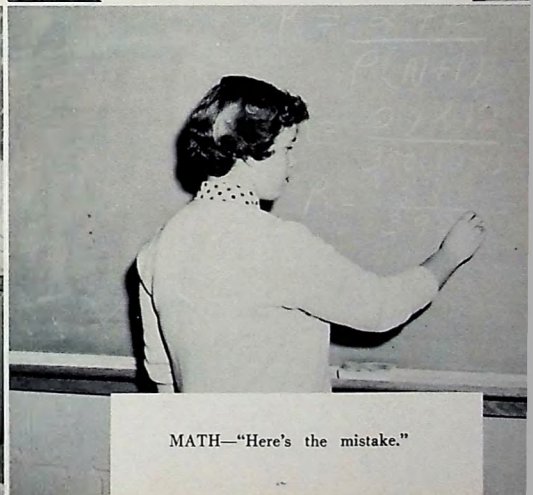
