My dear Governor:

While we cannot claim surprise, it is certainly a satisfaction to your friends outside of the state to note the nationwide attention your progressive action is attracting. Your proclamation against foreclosures is the greatest step in this direction since it became unlawful to send unfortunate debtors to prison.

It is particularly gratifying to me to read that you are working with A. C. and Senator Frazier on a real plan that will enable the people to work and produce without the intervention of bankers and profiteers. You are fortunate in having the Nonpartisan League laws to expedite such a program.
