Amended Articles Constitution of the Ferningry Columbus 1826. Article 5." Article 5." Art. 5." The Seminary shall be under the immediate charge and superintend ince of the Bishop of the Diocese, for the times being, as President of the institution." Ait. 10. This constitution may be amended by the concurrent vote of the Prishop, a majority of the Board of Functees of the Seminary and a majority of the convention of the Diocese, with the concurrence of a majority of the Bishops of the Protestant Chiscopal Church in the limited State, Providee, that no attention or amendment whatever be made in in this Constitution, whereby the funds of the Seminary, raised in England be appropriated to any other use than the education and theological instruction of students for the ministry in the Proteste ant Episcopal Church. This provise, however, does not preclude The lewfulness and constitutionality of annexing a college to the Seminary, and making provision so far as practicable, for the admission of other students, at their own expense, to the benefit of a College education."
