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Special Reminders

Since the last newsletter, there have been several changes within the Office of Sponsored Programs (OSP). In June 2019, Mr. C.J. Smith accepted the position of Assistant Director of the Office Sponsored Programs. That same month, Ms. Jennifer Cook-Johns joined us as Grants Specialist.

Policies and Forms used by OSP have been changed and updated. An updated version of the <u>Proposal Review and Compliance</u> (PRC) form is posted on the SWOSU OSP website. Old PRC versions will be accepted **until September 30, 2020**. After that, OSP will <u>not accept old versions</u> and will request an updated version. Please visit the OSP website to view our updated <u>Policies and Guidelines</u>. For other <u>Research Related Forms</u>, please visit the website.

Supplemental Assistance will be awarded on a first-come-first-serve basis, as usual, and will be earmarked until the travel restrictions are lifted. Requests for Supplemental Assistance will be handled as follows:

- 1. Faculty members and/or students making a presentation at a virtual conference may apply for OSP funds. OSP funds can be used to cover the cost of registration for the virtual conference.
- 2. Faculty members and/or students planning possible travel to present scholarly work for Spring or early Summer, please complete the OSP Financial Assistance Form, which will be on Etrieve by October 1. Once received, the faculty member will receive an award letter and funds will be earmarked. Once travel restrictions are lifted, faculty members will need to process the university travel form, along with the OSP award letter attached.

Supplemental Assistance information **NOT NEEDED** at this time:

- 1. The University Travel Form
- 2. Copy of approved hotel(s) with rate(s)
- 3. Quoted airfares

What **MUST** be submitted:

- 1. Completed OSP Financial Assistance Form
- 2. Letter of Acceptance identifying presenters

Signatures *are still required* from the applicant, chair, associate dean, and dean. Once all signatures are collected, please submit the form to Ms. Jennifer Cook-Johns. An updated version of the "Request for Financial Assistance" is being created in Etrieve, and OSP will make it public once it is finished.

The 2020 Principal Investigator Recognition Reception will not be held inperson this year. We will make a Special Edition Newsletter showcasing all of the Principal Investigators of FY20 and all the projects on which they worked so hard.

CESU Membership

SWOSU was recently accepted into the Great Plains Cooperative Ecosystem Studies Unit (CESU). This is an agreement between the U.S. Department of the Interior, the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the U.S. Department of Commerce, the U.S. Department of Defense, and 23 universities, the Western Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies, and the World Wildlife Fund Northern Great Plains Program. The overall CESU network is composed of 17 biogeographic region and includes more than 465 nonfederal partners and 16 federal agencies.

The objectives of CESU are to:


- Provide research, technical assistance and education to federal land management, environmental, and research agencies and their potential partners
- Develop a program of research, technical assistance and education that involves the biological, physical, social, and cultural sciences needed to address resources issues and interdisciplinary problem-solving at multiple scales and in an ecosystem context at the local, regional, and national level
- Place special emphasis on the working collaboration among federal agencies and universities and their related partner institutions.

This partnership allows SWOSU to pursue additional funding opportunities that are reserved for CESU members. The lead on this agreement is Mr. Eric Pritchard, Instructor, Parks and Recreation Management/Wildland Firefighting. Oklahoma Research Day 2020

For the second year, SWOSU hosted the Annual Oklahoma Research Day (ORD) on March 6. Nearly 1,000 students and faculty from Southeastern Oklahoma State University, Northeastern Oklahoma State University, the University of Central Oklahoma, Southwestern Oklahoma State University, East Central University, and Cameron University attended and presented 554 poster presentations ranging across the board of research.

Departments represented include Allied Health Sciences; Art, Communication & Theatre; Biological Sciences; Business; Chemistry and Physics; Computer Science; Engineering Technology; Language and Literature; Mathematics; Music; Pharmacy; Psychology; and Social Sciences. It is an honor and a pleasure for SWOSU to be able to showcase the remarkable research in which students and faculty are involved.

The Twenty-Eighth Research and Scholarly Activity Fair will be held on Friday, November 13, 2020, as a virtual conference. The company providing the virtual format is Forager One. Presenters will be able to present their research, make oral presentations, and present music and/or theatrical performances live or by way of recording. Dr. Blake Sonobe Lecture Series



Last Fall, the Office of Sponsored Programs launched the Dr. Blake Sonobe Lecture Series. In honor of Dr. Sonobe's tireless commitment to the promotion of undergraduate research, the lecture series provides a platform for student researchers to share their experiences. At the first event, Dr. Sonobe shared memories of his time as an undergraduate researcher at the Air Force Academy. Dr. Sonobe encouraged students and faculty in attendance to continue to prioritize research opportunities.

The first featured presenter was Ms. Elisabeth Allbritton, an undergraduate researcher performing chemistry research under the mentorship of Dr. Tim Hubin, chair of the SWOSU Department of Chemistry and Physics. A senior from Tulsa, Albritton began her research career through Oklahoma-Louis Stokes Alliance for Minority Participation (OK-LSAMP), a program aimed at increasing the number of students from underrepresented populations who receive degrees in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) disciplines. During her time at SWOSU, Allbritton has presented her research at multiple venues and, most recently, spent 12 weeks working alongside fellow researchers in France. Albritton said that her research has provided her with once-in-a-lifetime opportunities that would not have otherwise been possible if not for the support of her mentors at SWOSU.

The second event in the series featured Mr. Dillon Martone, a senior Language & Literature student under the mentorship of Dr. Denise Landrum-Geyer. Mr. Martone led an interactive discussion that explored common themes and techniques applied to world building. Martone spoke indepth about his research processes and the methods employed to bring the fantasy genre into a more modern mold.

The goal of the Blake Sonobe Lecture Series is to create an opportunity for students and faculty to come together to enjoy a meal and learn about what research looks like in
