Way back when

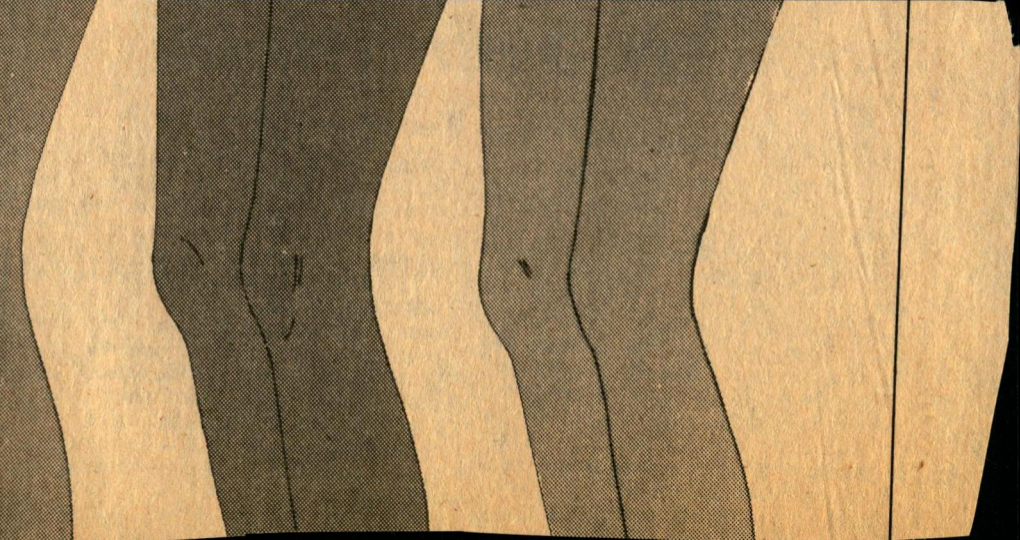
25 Years Ago Today — '55

"An armed bandit this afternoon held up a clerk at Leblanc's Cleaners and Dyers office at 6 Spruce St., and escaped with \$40.95. The gunman, according to Police Capt. James F. Murphy, held a nickel-plated revolver at Mrs. Hector Blanchette and forced her to turn over the money to him. When last seen the bandit was heading, on foot, towards Lisbon and Cedar Sts. Police were alerted throughout the city to be on the lookout for him."

"Two pieces of metal which police say could have caused a serious train derailment were found on the Maine Central Railroad tracks in Auburn late yesterday

afternoon and four young boys have admitted putting them there. Auburn Police Chief Alton E. Savage said he learned that one of the boys reportedly said they 'wanted to see a train wreck.' "

"Twin City gasoline dealers today began taking a hand in the battle against the proposed one cent increase in the State's six cents gas tax. Nap Binette pointed, in a photo which appeared in The Journal, to a poster in the window of his Court St. filling station in Auburn. In his hand he has the 'ballots' which customers will be urged to fill out and send to their representatives and senators.



50 Years Ago Today — '29

“Whether it is the board of Aldermen or the School Board that is entitled by law to select a site for a school building was a topic of much discussion about the city on Saturday. According to reports there are members of the School Board who feel that it is the privilege of that body to choose the location. Other members questioned on the matter feel that nothing can be said until the aldermen have submitted to the School Board the plans for the proposed building.”

“A. G. Legendre of Lewiston, director of naturalization in Lewiston and Auburn expects that the increase in fees for citizenship applicants will not diminish their number. He

advises them however not to forget that these fees must be paid early in January at the county building in Auburn if they wish to be admitted in April.”

“Some 1,500 officials, employes and their guests gathered at the Lewiston Bleachery and Dye Works last night for a dance at the opening of the new sheet factory recently constructed. The annex built during the past months is situated on Willow street with entrance near Knox Street.”

“The proposed cut in the appropriation for State Aid road construction for 1930 and the sale of Auburn hall were two chief topics of discussion at last night’s public hearing on the budget.”

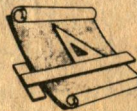
