

Two Fughettas

These two fughettas utilize traditional common-practice counterpoint, but the subjects feature syncopated rhythms atypical of the baroque style. The result is a baroque sound with a distinctly modern flavor.

Scenes

This suite for percussion ensemble was written with the help of Visic, an online open-source program that converts gaze-tracking data into music. The program keeps track of where the user's eyes fall while looking at an image on the screen, then maps this data to note pitch and duration. While attempting to preserve the integrity of the program's original output for each image used, instrumentation and musical structure was chosen to reflect the content of each image.

Gabriel's Oboe

Renowned for writing the music of classic Western films of the 1960s such as *The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly* and *Once Upon a Time in the West*, Ennio Morricone has scored hundreds of films over a career spanning more than sixty years. The much-beloved main theme of his acclaimed score for the 1986 film *The Mission*, "Gabriel's Oboe" frequently appears in concert programs worldwide and has been arranged for instruments and ensembles of all kinds. An arrangement for cello was recorded by Yo-Yo Ma in collaboration with Morricone in 2004.

Fratres

According to the online Bachtrack database, Estonian composer Arvo Pärt is today's most frequently performed living composer. *Fratres* is based on Pärt's signature technique of *tinntinnabuli* (from the Latin for *bell*), which entails a well-organized relationship between a melodic line and a continuously articulated triad. Originally published in 1977 for violin and piano, *Fratres* has also been arranged for cello and a wide array of solo instruments and ensembles. Along with other key Pärt compositions from the 1970s, *Fratres* has been featured in dozens of movie and documentary soundtracks for the powerful atmosphere of stillness and mysticism it invokes.

Cello Concerto in C

Erich Wolfgang Korngold was a remarkably gifted child prodigy, composing fully mature works in the complex late-Romantic style by his early teens; his first ballet was staged at age 11 and his first opera was staged at age 19. After a highly successful career in Vienna through the '20s and '30s, Korngold was forced to emigrate to the United States during World War II. Settling in Hollywood, he wrote groundbreaking scores for Warner Bros. films and contributed significantly to the art of film composing. His Cello Concerto is the musical centerpiece of *Deception* (1946), one of the last films he scored for Warner Bros. Not only is music from the concerto featured in the underscoring, the work functions as a key plot device and is given an in-film performance during the final scenes.
