Multimedia Advocacy

Multimedia Advocacy makes the difference between being included or being excluded.



Multimedia Advocacy enables people who face challenges because of their learning or communications difficulties to use self-made media to get across their preferences and viewpoints.

Using pictures, sounds, video and words they can develop their own multimedia person-centred portfolio to share their interests and aspirations and better explain the ways that they like to be supported.



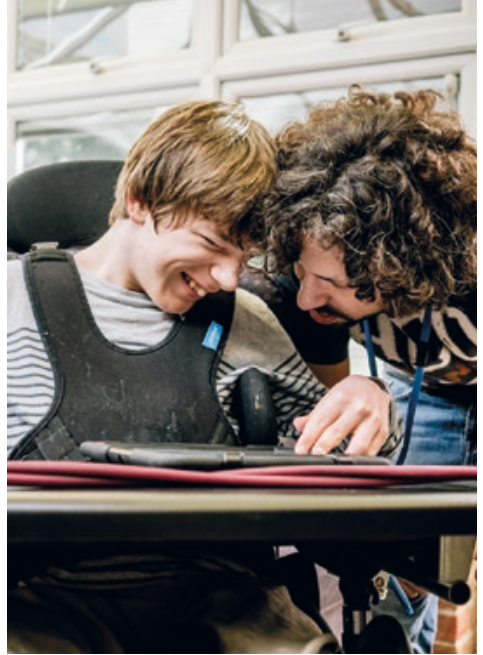

RIX Wikis

Wikis are simple, accessible, secure and easy to build personal websites. They can be used to create multimedia person-centred plans that use pictures, words, video and sound to capture the voice, skills, needs and aspirations of the individual.



The RIX Wiki shows the person and not the label. It helps to build a detailed picture of who they really are as people – what and who is important to them, what they like to do, how they communicate and how they see their future.

Wikis give ownership of the planning process to individuals and families, facilitating genuine collaboration between parents, teachers and professionals.



RIX Wikis are uniquely accessible, having been built with, and for, people with learning disabilities.

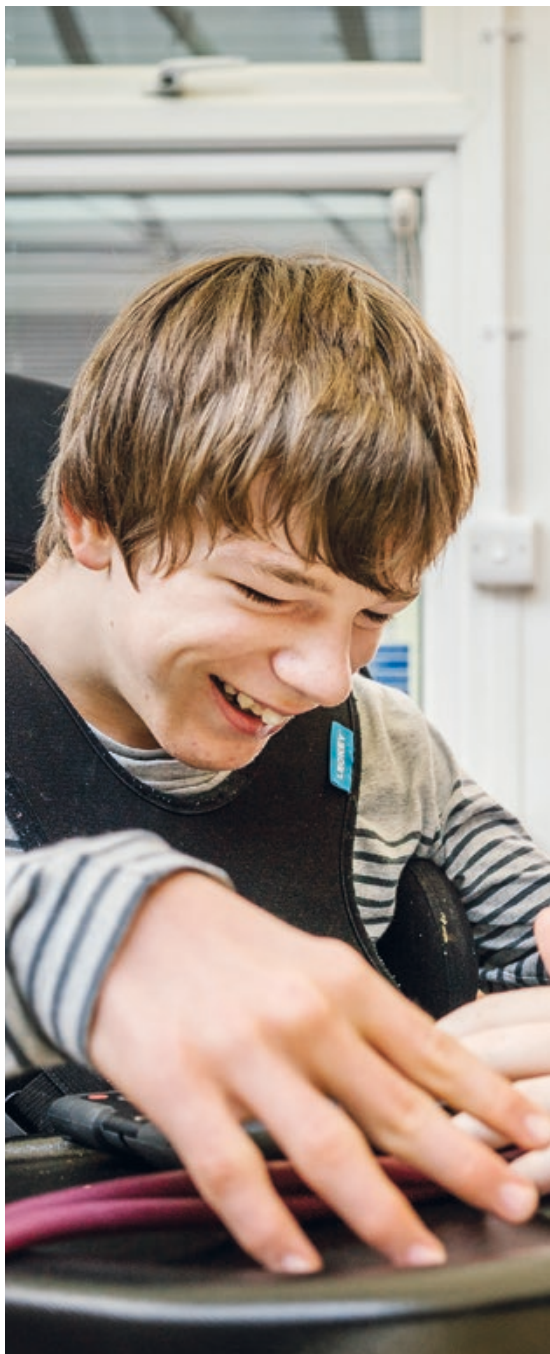
