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

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
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
PHILOSOPHICAL TRANSACTIONS OF THE ROYAL SOCIETY

• Open for whom?

- Intent of *Phil. Trans.* was to make the scientific knowledge produced by the Royal Society available to all scientists
- 1787, Caroline Herschel is the first woman published in *Phil. Trans.*



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




