## In-class Exercise: Conducting Survey Analyses in JMP

Goal: To develop students’ ability to conduct survey analyses using JMP® software.
Lab type: Instructor demonstrates software followed by hands-on exercises for students.
Time allotted: 90 minutes.
Data: SurveyData.jmp (see appendix for survey instrument).

## DEMONSTRATION

1. One-way goodness-of-fit (Analyze $>$ Distribution)
(a) One nominal variable
(b) triangle > Test Probabilities
(c) Fill in probabilities to test
2. Contingency tables (Analyze > Fit Y by X)
(a) Two nominal variables
(b) Mosaic plot
(c) Tables
i) Turn on/off row, column, total percentages
ii) Show expected counts and/or cell chi-squared values
(d) Pearson and likelihood ratio tests of independence
3. Simple linear regression (Analyze > Fit Y by X)
(a) Continuous $Y$ and $X$
(b) triangle > Fit line
i) Note other options: Fit mean, Fit polynomial
(c) Output to data table
i) Residuals (triangle next to Linear Fit > Save Residuals)
ii) Predicted values (triangle next to Linear Fit > Save Predicteds)
(d) Residual plot: triangle next to Linear Fit > Plot Residuals
(e) Delete fitted line: triangle next to Linear Fit > Remove Fit
4. Multiple regression (Analyze > Fit Model)
(a) Continuous $Y$ and one or more continuous or discrete $X$ s
(b) Enter Xs using "Add" button
i) Can delete using "Remove" button
ii) Iterative model fitting easy using same Fit Model dialog box
(c) Change "Emphasis" to Minimal report to hide extra output
(d) Note that all observations with one or more missing values in the $Y$ or any of the $X$ s are ignored
(e) Tabular output:
i) Summary of Fit table
ii) Parameter Estimates table
iii) Effects Tests table
iv) Residual plot
(f) Output to data table
i) Residuals (triangle $>$ Save Columns $>$ Residuals)
ii) Predicted values (triangle > Save Columns > Predicted Values)
5. Logistic regression (Analyze > Fit Model)
(a) Same as multiple regression except $Y$ must be a nominal variable with only two levels
(b) Tabular output:
i) Whole Model Test table
ii) Parameter Estimates table
(c) Estimated probabilities
i) triangle > Save Probability Formula

## EXERCISES

1. Goodness-of-fit
(a) Test whether it is reasonable to assume the probabilities of the responses to question 7 are homogeneous.
i) Remember to change the variable type to nominal.
ii) What do you conclude: reject the null hypothesis and conclude that they are not homogeneous, or fail to reject the null and conclude they are homogeneous?
iii) What does that mean in terms of the survey question?
(b) Test whether it is reasonable to assume the answers to question 1 came from the following distribution. What do you conclude?

2. Contingency table
(a) Create a contingency table of respondent's gender (Sex) vs. school (CurricNumber).
(b) Which school has the largest fraction of female students? Did you determine that from the mosaic plot, or the contingency table, or both?
(c) Reduce the contingency table down to just a table of counts. That is, remove the total percent, row percent, and column percents from the table.
(d) Based on the hypothesis test results at the bottom of the output, is gender independent of school? That is, can you assume that the distribution of men and women are the same in the schools?
(e) Do you need to be concerned about the warning at the bottom of the output?
3. Simple linear regression
(a) After fielding the survey, based on some written comments, it was hypothesized that the respondents didn't distinguish well between questions 2 and 3. Examine this question as follows:
i) Create two new variables Sum2 and Sum3 which are the sums of the answers to questions 2a through 2 i and 3 a through 3 i respectively.
ii) Regress Sum3 on Sum2. What is the:
(1) R-square value? $\qquad$
(2) What is the slope for Sum2? $\qquad$
iii) Save the residuals from the model in a new column in the data table.
(1) Create a histogram of the residuals.
(2) Highlight all the residuals that are between -10 and +10 and exclude the rows corresponding to those residuals.
iv) Are there any obvious differences in the demographics of those with large residuals and the distribution of demographics for all the respondents?
v) What do you conclude from this analysis?
4. Multiple regression
(a) Regress Sum2 on school (CurricNumber), gender (Sex), and Military Branch.
i) Are any of the variables significant? If so, which one(s)?
ii) Drop the insignificant variables and re-run the model.
iii) Which Service is most satisfied overall with NPS in-processing? Which "Service" is least satisfied?
iv) Why doesn't USN show up in the Parameter Effects table?
