True freedom must have regard for the rights of others for if our rights infringe upon the rights of others then ultimately no one will be free.

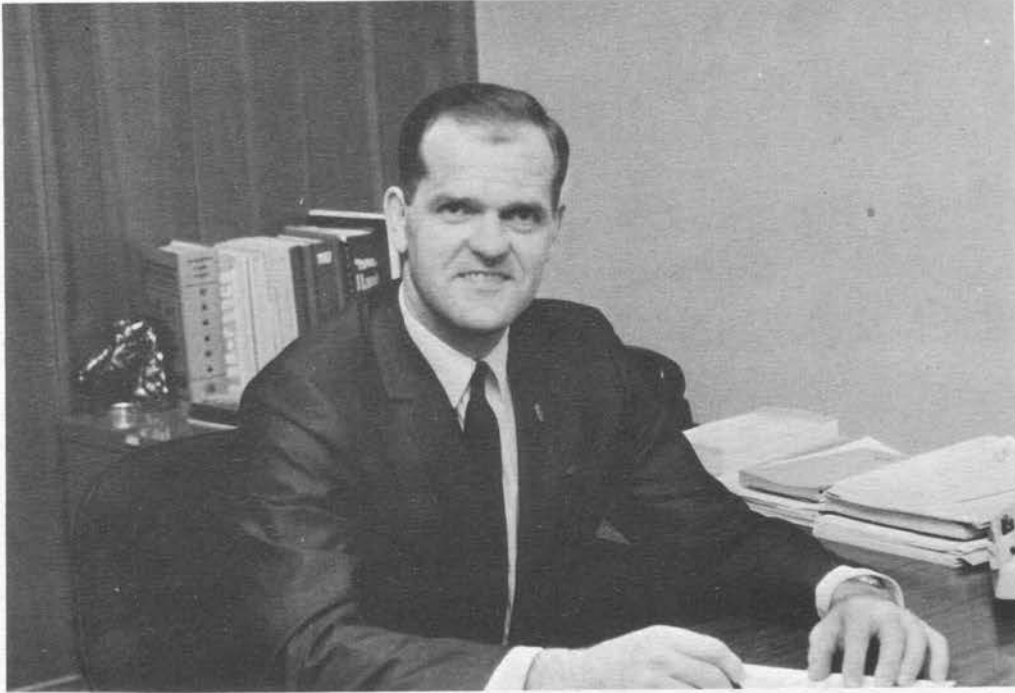

Students' lives at Essex are being graciously fulfilled. Isn't that what education is all about?

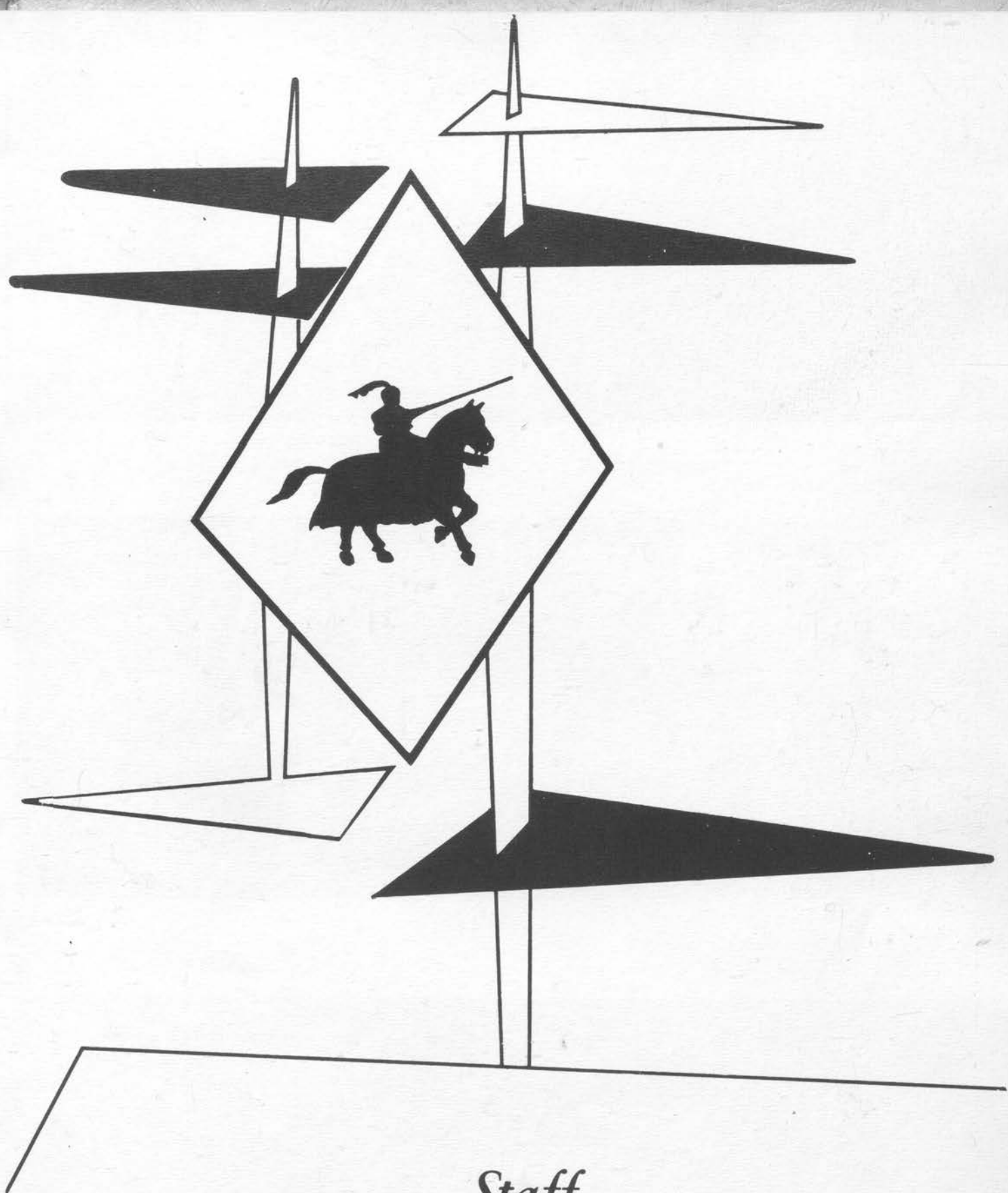

Of course this could not have resulted if the stage crew, lighting, advertising, make up, and management would have been excluded.

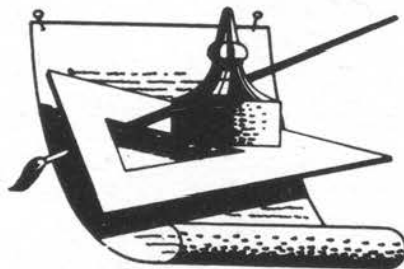
The enthusiasm of the club will not stop here for it intends to present another spectacular in the spring.

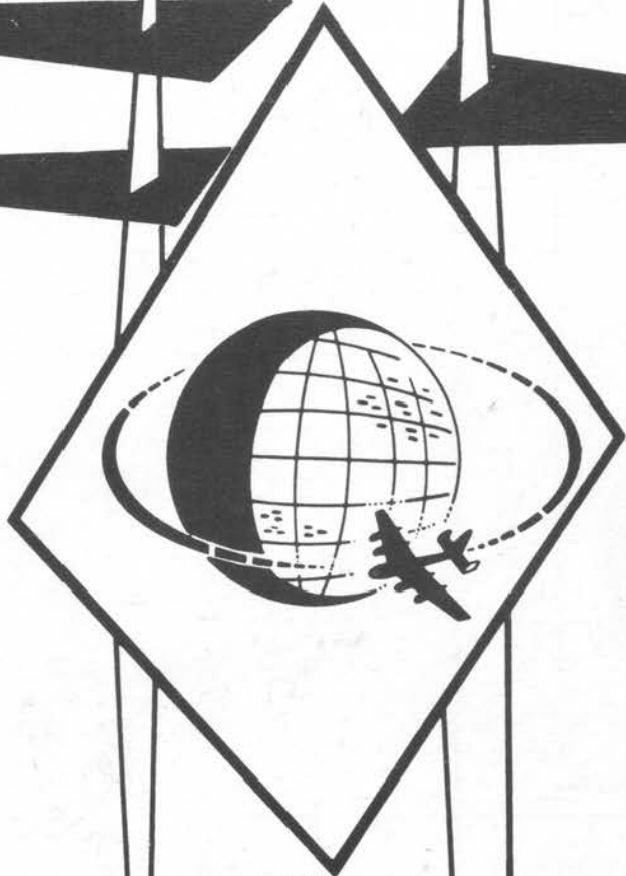

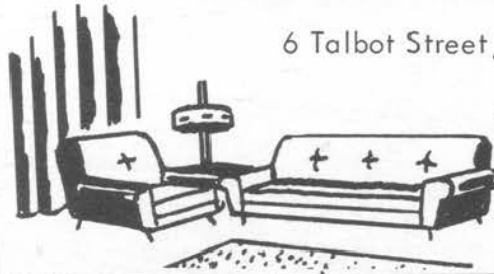

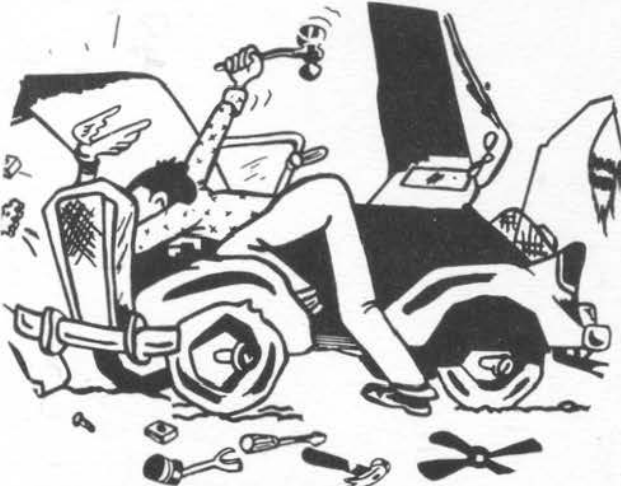
