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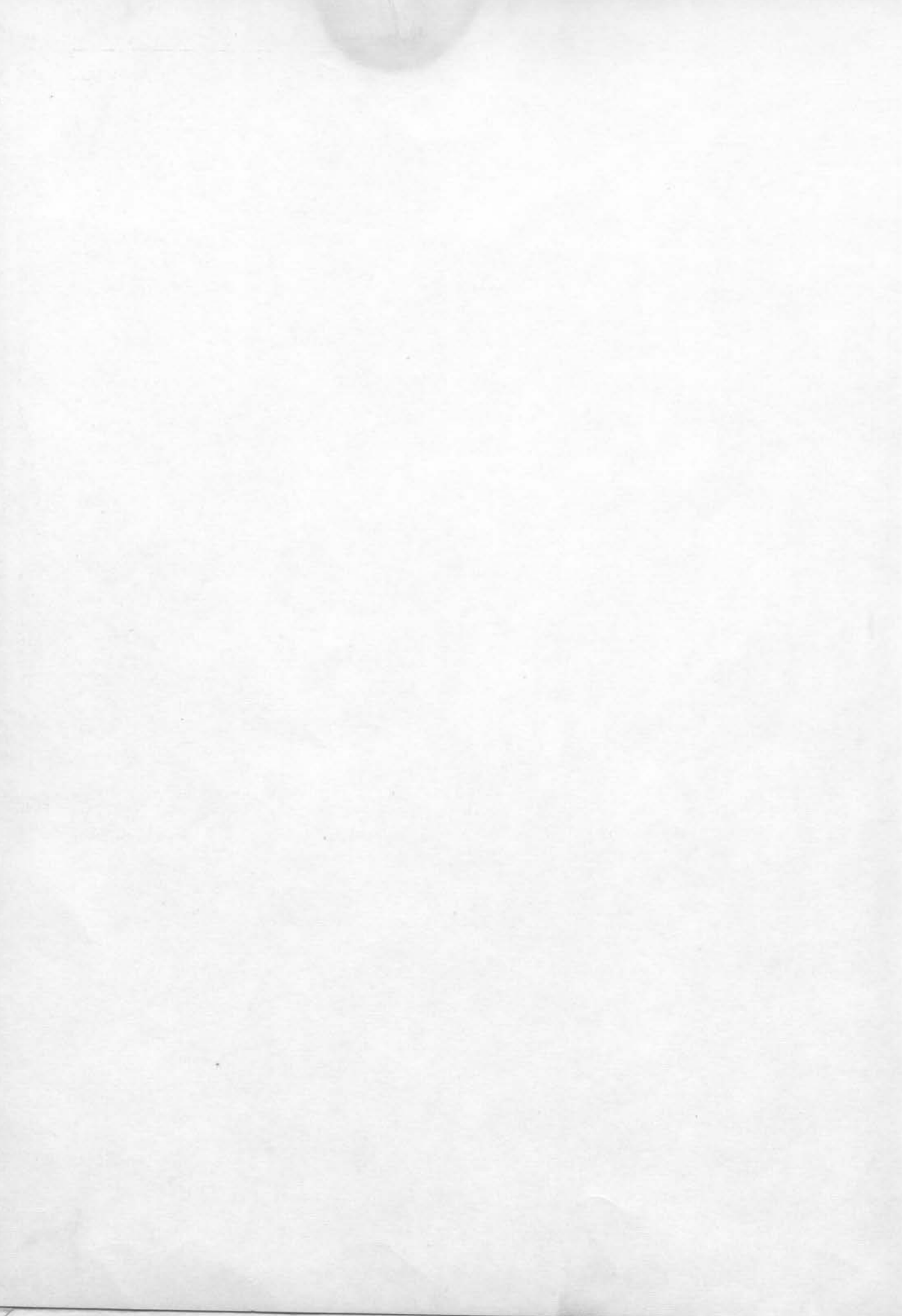

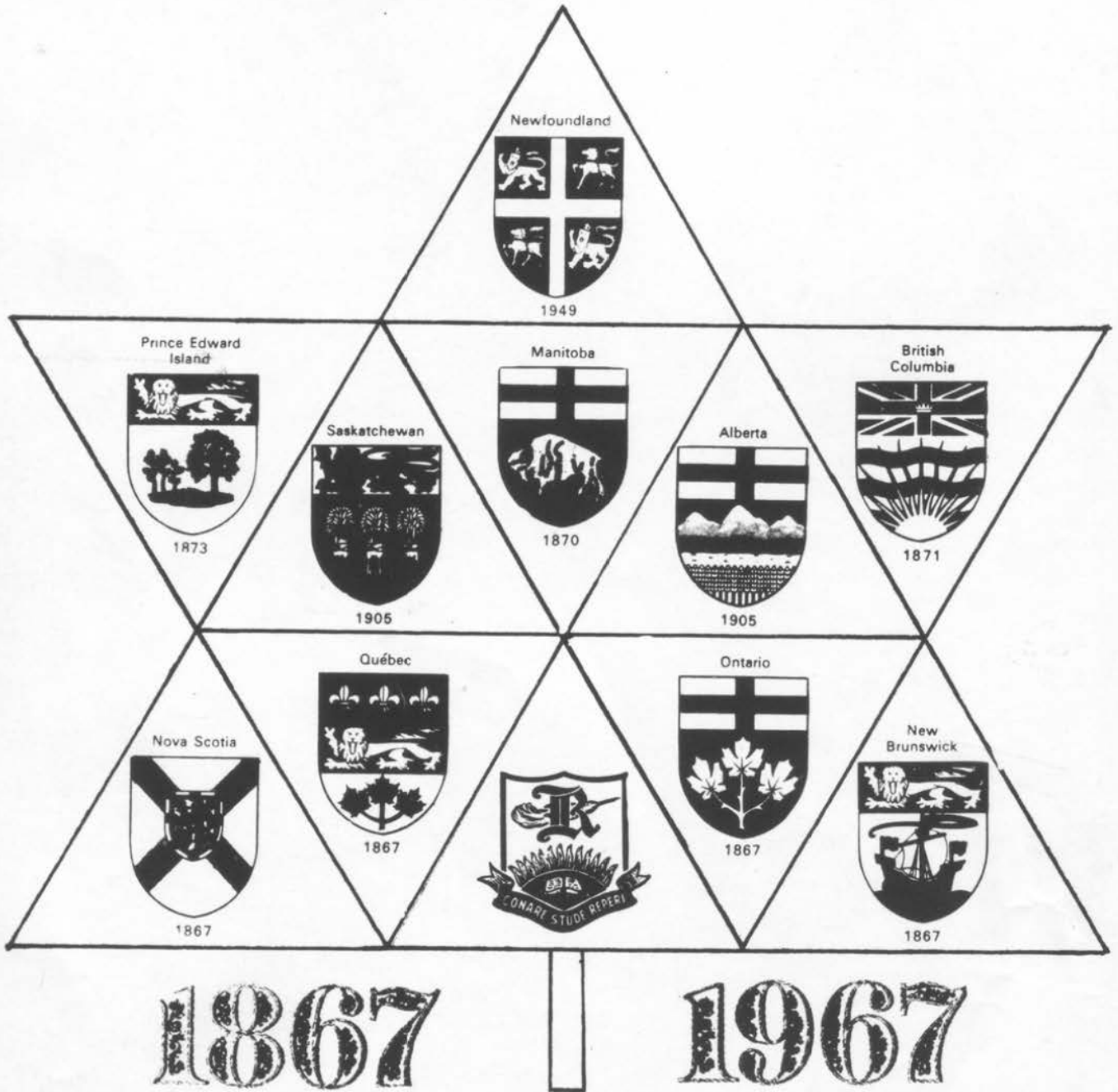

The Roots Of Riverside High

EDITH CAVELL SCHOOL, Nov., 1927.

In order to outline the history of our school we must go back to before the year 1917. It was in this year that construction was started, for School Section No. 2, on a building to house the preliminary grades. For ten years previous classes had been held in an old frame building situated close to the present Riverside Drive west of Reedmere Road. In 1915, the trustees of S.S. No. 2 decided to build a two room brick building in what was then Sandwich East.

In 1916 land was purchased and the \$35,000 building started. In 1919 the school was completed and ready for occupancy. In 1923, owing to the growth of the district, its separation from Sandwich East, and its incorporation as the Town of Riverside, two rooms were added to the existing structure at a cost of \$30,000. In 1925 the school saw the addition of eight more rooms, a gymnasium and other required facilities. On Friday, November 25, 1927 The Edith Cavell School was officially opened by His Worship Harry Drouillard, the Mayor of Riverside.

About 1934 classes were started for Grades IX and X, but the school still maintained classes for Grades kindergarten through eight and was considered to be an elementary school. In 1944 Grades XI, XII, XIII were added and the official name of the school became Riverside Continuation School. In 1948 legislation was passed by the Ontario Department of Education and the school was given the official title Riverside High School. But the school was not a true high school until 1956 when all elementary classes were removed from the building.

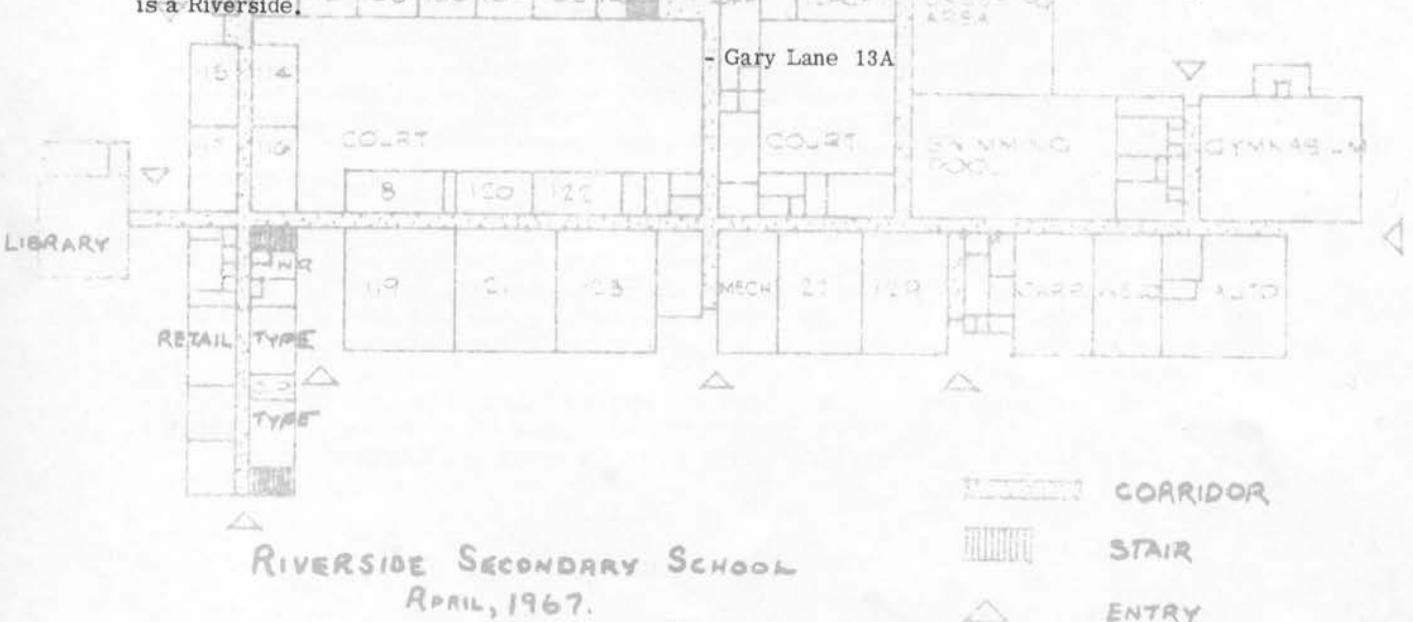
Due to increasing school enrolment, four rooms including two labs and two commercial-courses rooms. The school population at Riverside High increased by leaps and bounds until in 1962 it was decided by the Riverside Board of Education that the old building was just too small for efficient educational operation on the high school level. Addition was out of the question. The idea was impractical from the standpoint of adaptability of the old school for expansion and the cost involved. It was decided that a tract of land comprising twenty-seven acres between Little River Road, Wyandotte St. Little River, and Lauzon Road be purchased and a two-million-dollar-plus education complex be built to meet the needs of the people of the Town of Riverside.

So in September of 1963 the high school students of Riverside moved into the somewhat incomplete building. The school was completed shortly after September and officially opened on Saturday, January 18, 1964. The official title of the school was Riverside Composite High School and it offered courses in all the three branches of educational training: Business and Commerce, Science Technology and Trades, and Arts and Sciences. Outstanding features of the school were an olympic size swimming pool, a double size gymnasium, and a spacious and beautiful cafetorium with kitchen facilities.

The old high school building was renovated and converted to a senior public school. It maintains the title Edith Cavell School to this day.

In January, 1966 Riverside was annexed to the city of Windsor and Riverside High was renamed Riverside Secondary School. The end of this school year, 1966-1967, marks the completion of a million-dollar-plus addition to the present building. This addition gives Riverside High (as it will always be known) the distinction of having the most modern, up-to-date library facilities in Southwestern Ontario. A second gym and three new shops also enhance the school building.

We are proud of our tradition of high calibre graduates and will uphold this tradition as long as there is a Riverside.

Graduates 1966

The Graduation exercises for 1966 took place on Saturday, November 5, at 8 o'clock, and were opened with the singing of "O Canada" and an Invocation by the Reverend Lindsay Howan.

Rabbi Samuel Stollman addressed the graduating class. In his address, Rabbi Stollman contrasted the three R's of our thinking, reading, writing and arithmetic, with reflection, reverence and responsibility. He pointed out how the latter are sometimes overcome by revolution, riot, and rebelliousness and how the Jewish tradition, which consists of learning, worship, and doing good deeds, is a more profitable pursuit than these.

Following this, the Honour Graduation Diplomas, Secondary School Graduation Diplomas and Certificates of Training were presented by the various dignitaries present.

Peter Lapsley then gave the Valedictory Address, the essence of which may be summed up in his closing words: "As I look back on my former High School days and as I look ahead into the future, I come to realize that a person must have not only a faith in himself, but also a tremendous faith in God. We need some sense of direction for our lives, for so often the pathway that does lie ahead of us is doubtful and deceptive. And so it is that with a strong faith in divine providence, we know that each step we make will be the right step. Thus, it is on this note that I would like to close by quoting a verse which has been very dear to me and one which, in my opinion, sums up my philosophy of life:

"Trust in the Lord with all thine heart:
and lean not unto thy own understandings.
In all thy ways acknowledge Him, and He
shall direct thy paths."

(Proverbs 3; 5-6)

Scholarships and awards were next on the programme. Wallace Howick received the University of Windsor Admission Scholarship, the Colonel E.S. Wigle Branch 255 Canadian Legion Award, the Optimist Club of Windsor Award, and the Student Council Award for Scholarship.

Peter Lapsley was then presented with a University of Windsor Admission Scholarship and Cordell Seaby with the Kiwanis Club of Riverside Award. Both Peter and Cordell, along with James Walmsley received Student Council awards for Scholarship.

Other award winners were Christopher Brennan who received the Royal Canadian Legion Branch 12 Award, Dave Loaring, who received the F/O Paul D. McLaren Memorial Award and Sandy Neill, who received the Technical Director's Award for standing in English.

Mr. Pentland and Mr. Krewench then gave out the Class Medals and Honour Pins.

The Graduation Exercises closed with the singing of "God Save the Queen."

"My entire family is very grateful and happy for you all,"

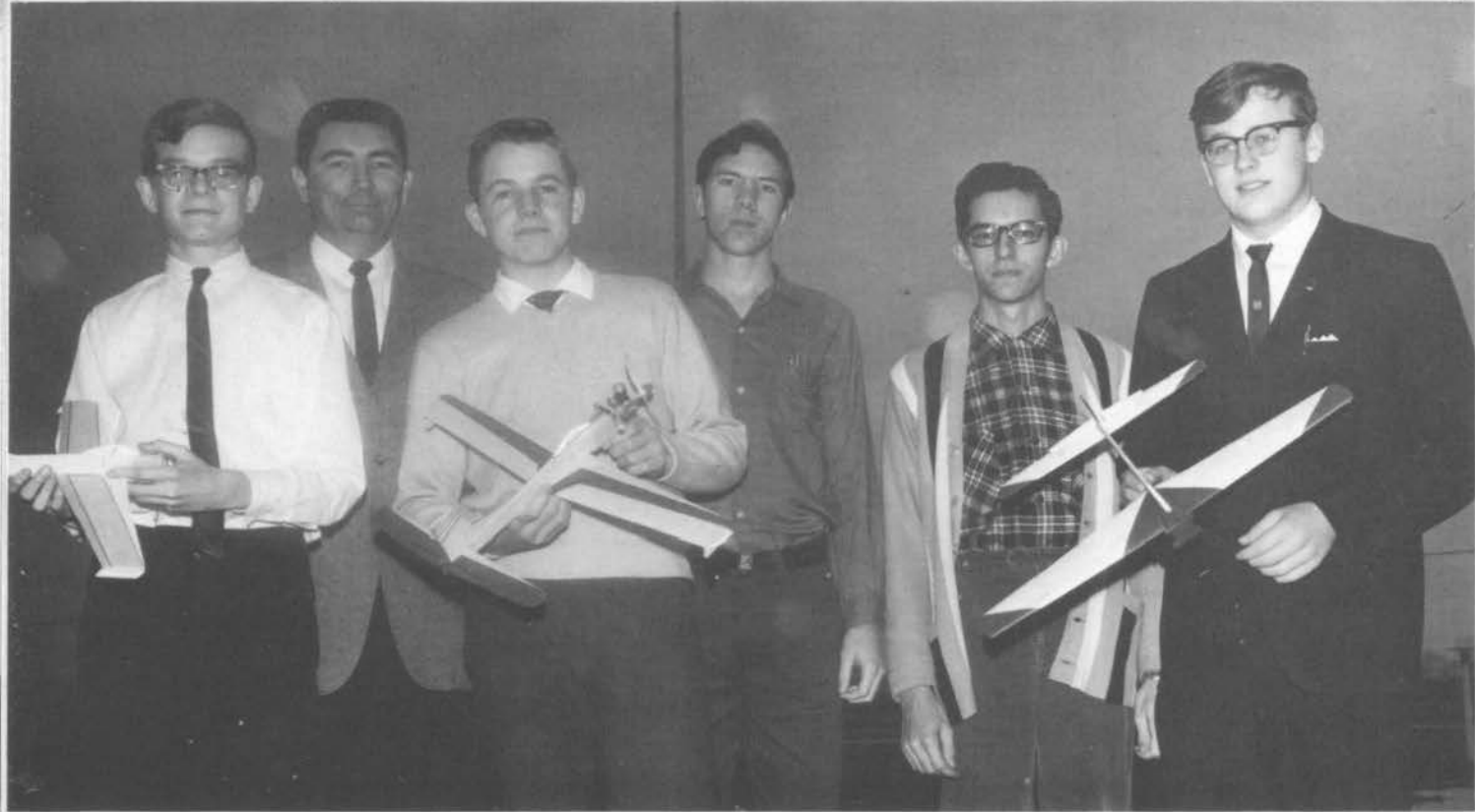

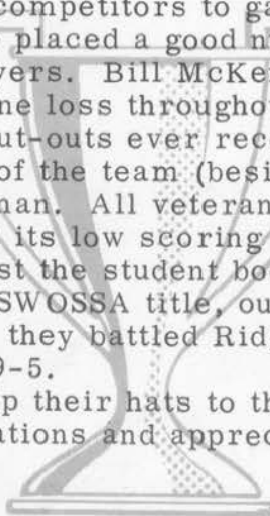
Hockey Team

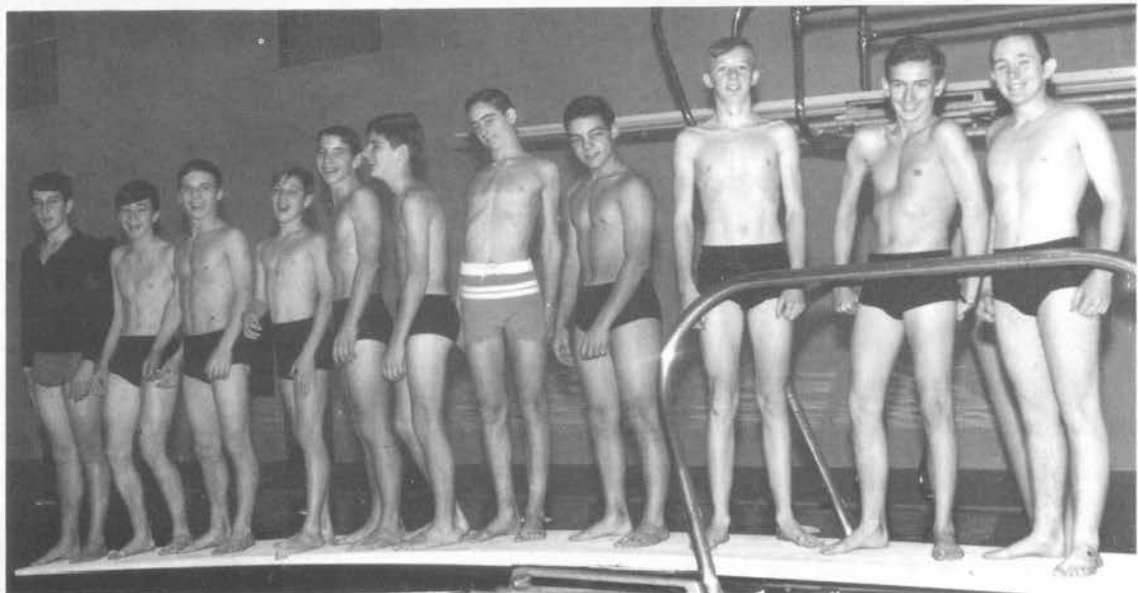

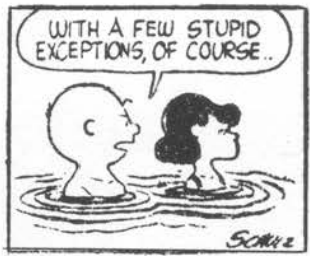

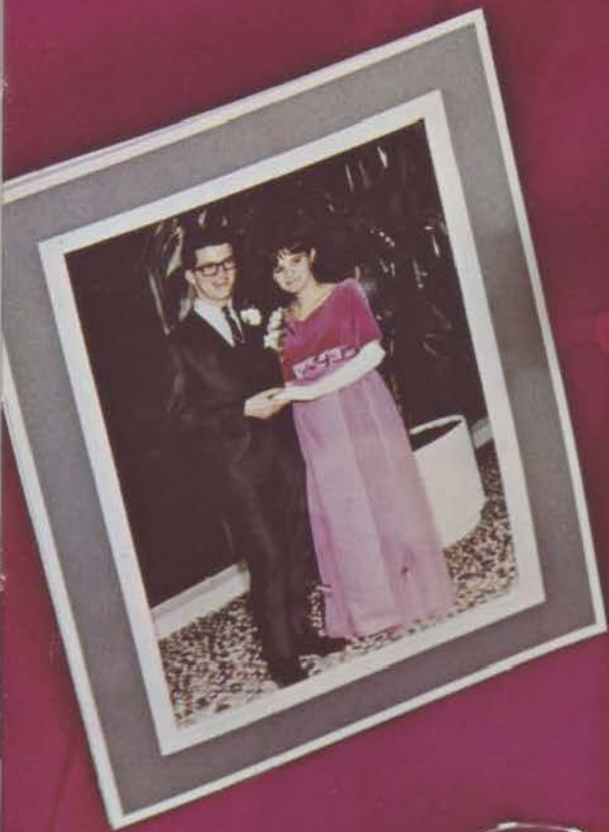

DEC. 22: With the participation of the grade 13's, the cheerleaders and the debut of the school band the Christmas assembly was a great success.

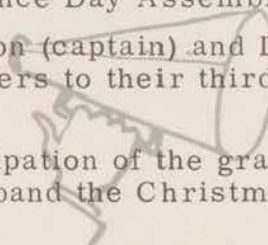
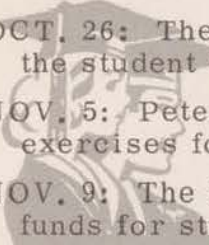
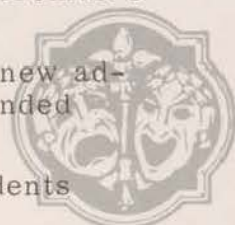
