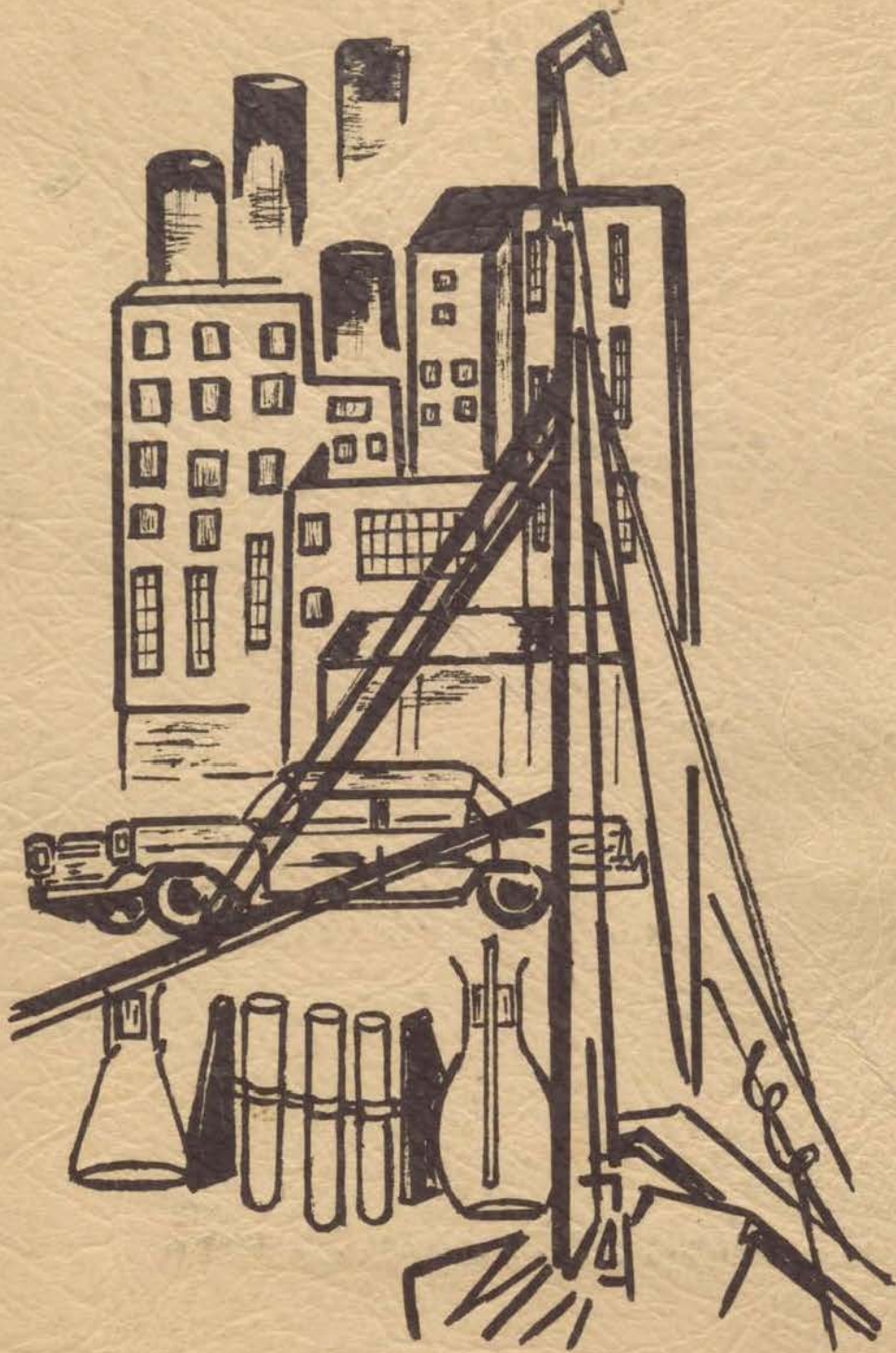



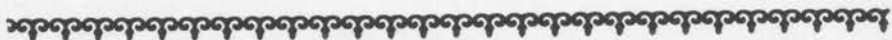
A Message to the Students

Miss Laithwaite, one of our most loved English and Guidance teachers, is leaving us this year. Miss Laithwaite was born in a beautiful town approximately one hundred and fifty miles north of here, on Lake Huron, Goderich, Ontario.

After completing her high school education at Goderich, she went to teacher's college at Stratford and obtained her teacher's certificate.

Miss Laithwaite taught in rural schools in Southwestern Ontario, teaching different grades. So you see it wasn't too long ago that we had little red school-houses in Ontario.

In a school in Norfolk she became coach of the hardball team. You would be interested to know that her team became the Champions of Norfolk that year.

While teaching she studied extramurally and received her B.A. degree from Western Ontario. Four years later she was successful in getting a Master of Arts degree from Syracuse University in New York State.

After obtaining her degree she left elementary school teaching and went to Forster Collegiate here in Windsor for four years.

Miss Laithwaite taught Commerce students first at Lowe; she was then transferred to the new school, Harry E. Guppy.

This year, Miss Laithwaite, after forty years in the teaching profession will retire. It is hard to see a teacher of her high standards retire from teaching, but we hope it will lead to bigger and better things.

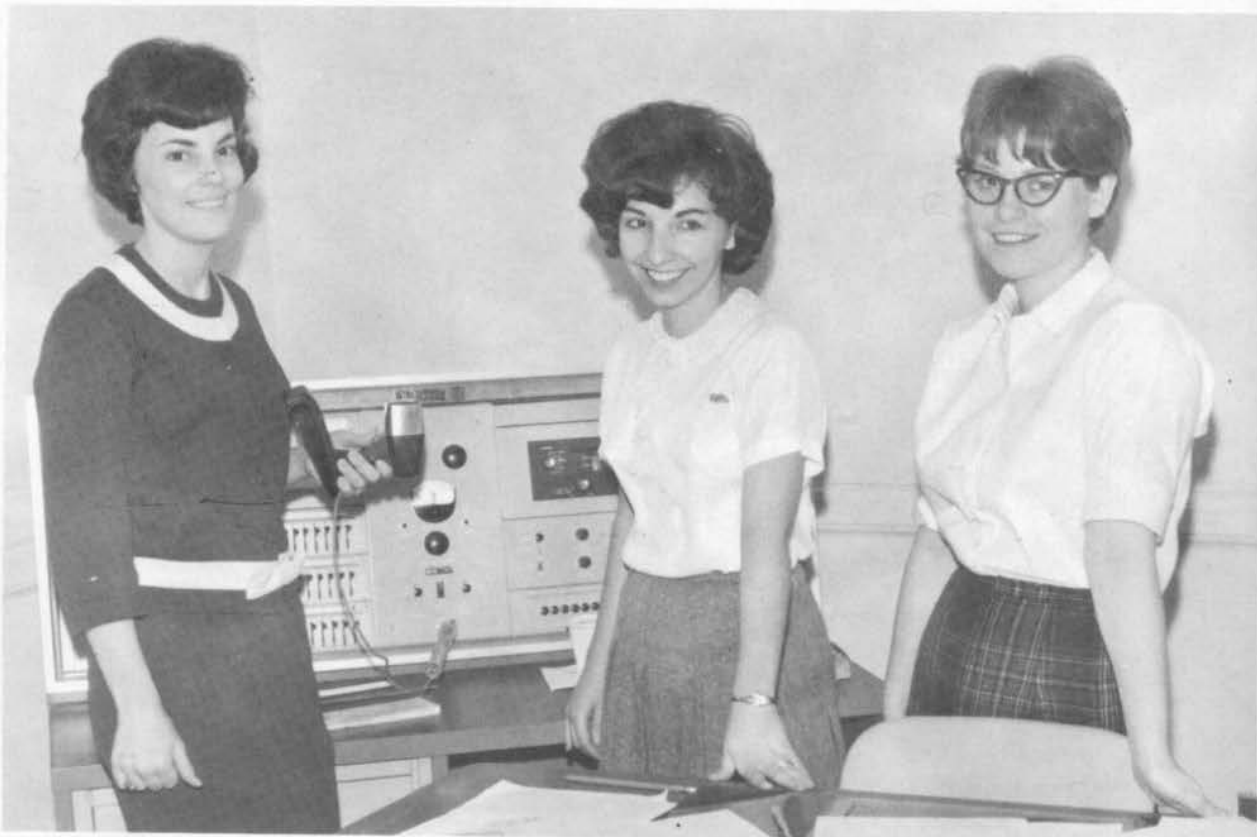

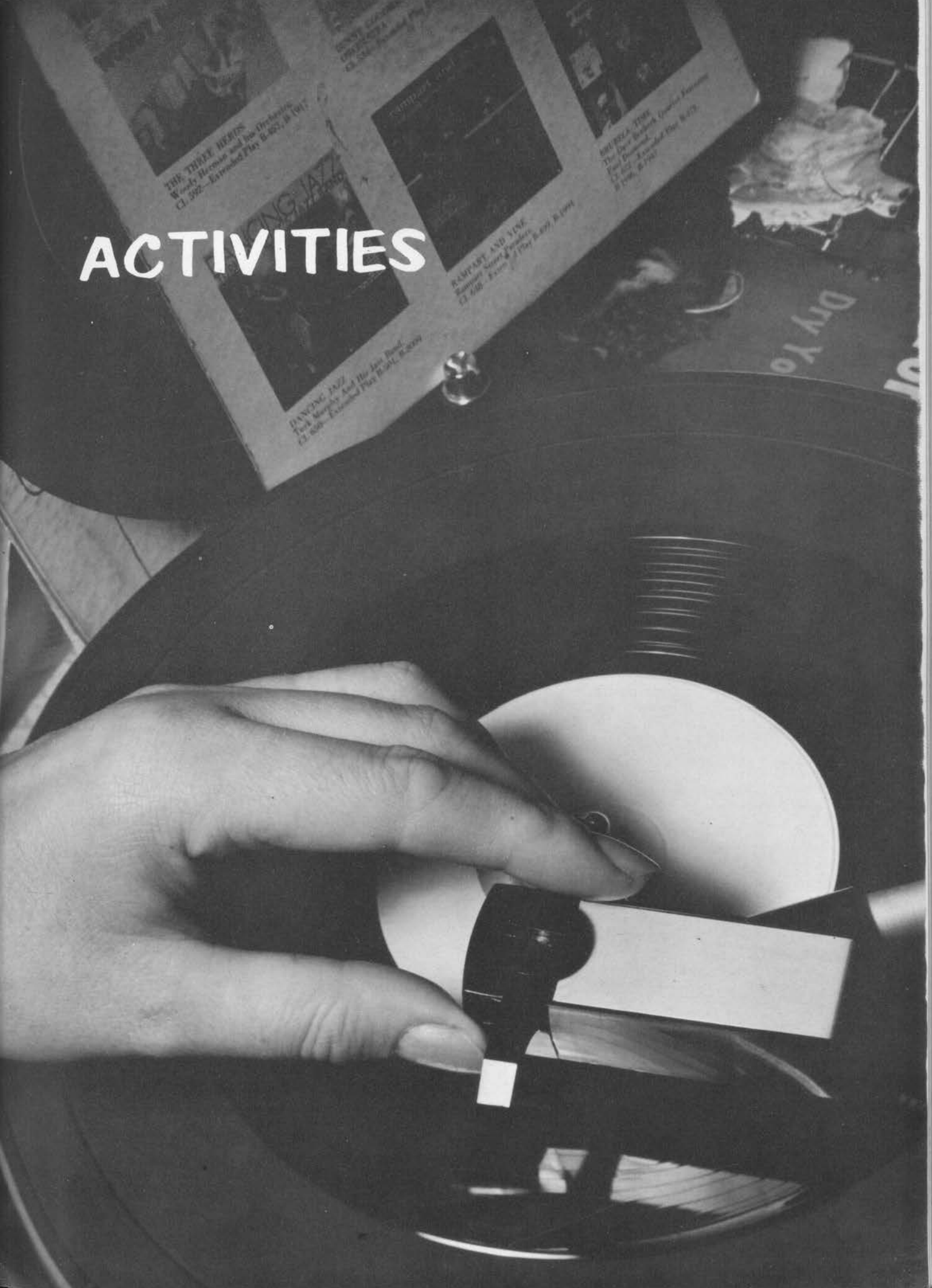

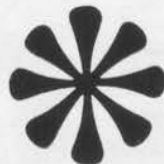
Many thanks are in order also for all the teachers who gave their own personal time to help us in extra-curricular activities and also those who helped us in our school work outside the classroom.
