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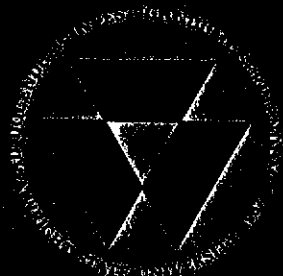

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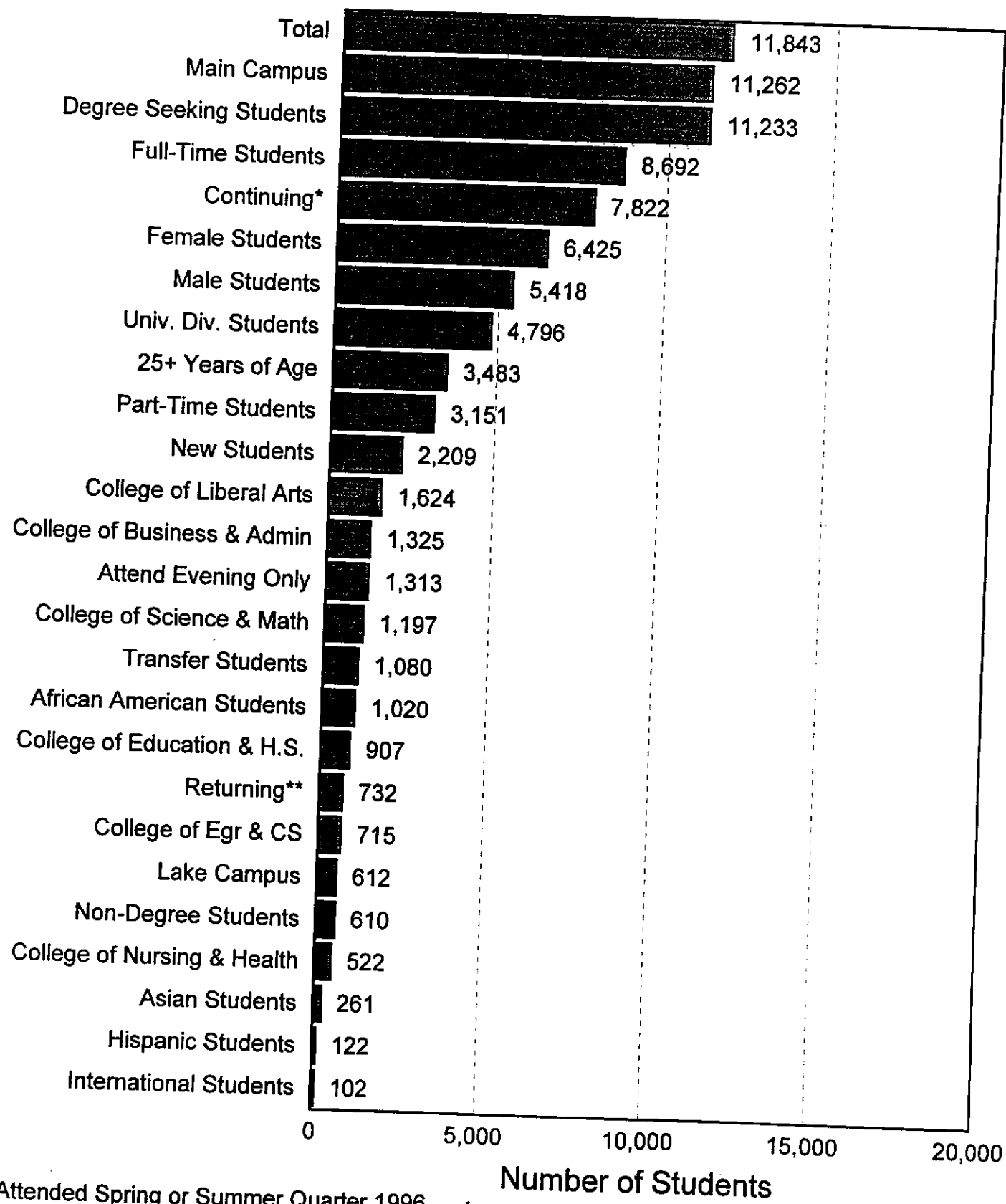
The Twentieth Annual Student Fact Book provides information about students enrolled for the Fall Quarter 1996. Longitudinal information is also provided for the last six years. Only data considered to be of general interest to the university community were selected for publication. Highlights

- . Total enrollment is 15,697
 - . Undergraduate enrollment is 11,843,
 - . Graduate enrollment is 3,370
 - . Professional enrollment is 484
- . 65% of all students are full time
 - . Undergraduate 73%, graduate 31%, professional 100%
- . Women are in the majority, accounting for 55% of the enrollment
- . 59% of all students come from the local counties of Montgomery, Greene, Clark and Miami
 - . 48% of entering freshmen come from these counties
- . 2,130 students live in campus housing
- . Minority students account for 12% of enrollment
- . African American enrollment is 1,268, the highest in the university's history
- . Average age of all students is 26.4 years
 - . Undergraduate 24.2 years, graduate 33.1 years
- . 11% of all undergraduates have all of their classes in the evening (4:00 p.m. or later).
- . 36% of all undergraduates have both day and evening classes
- . 19% of all graduate students have both day and evening classes
- . Undergraduate grade point average is 2.814 and has remained constant for the past 10 years
- . 2,904 degrees were granted during 1995-96

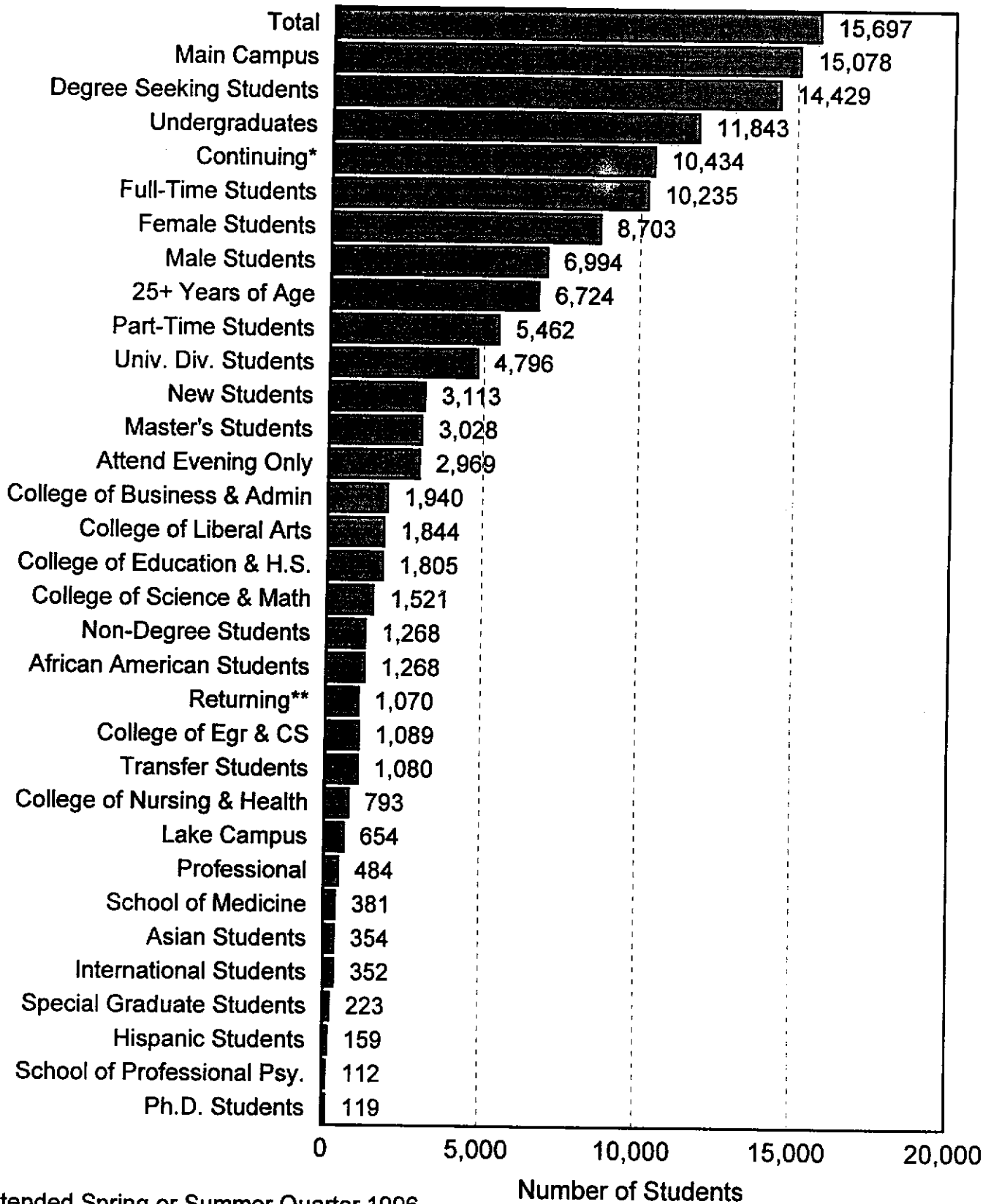

Student Populations

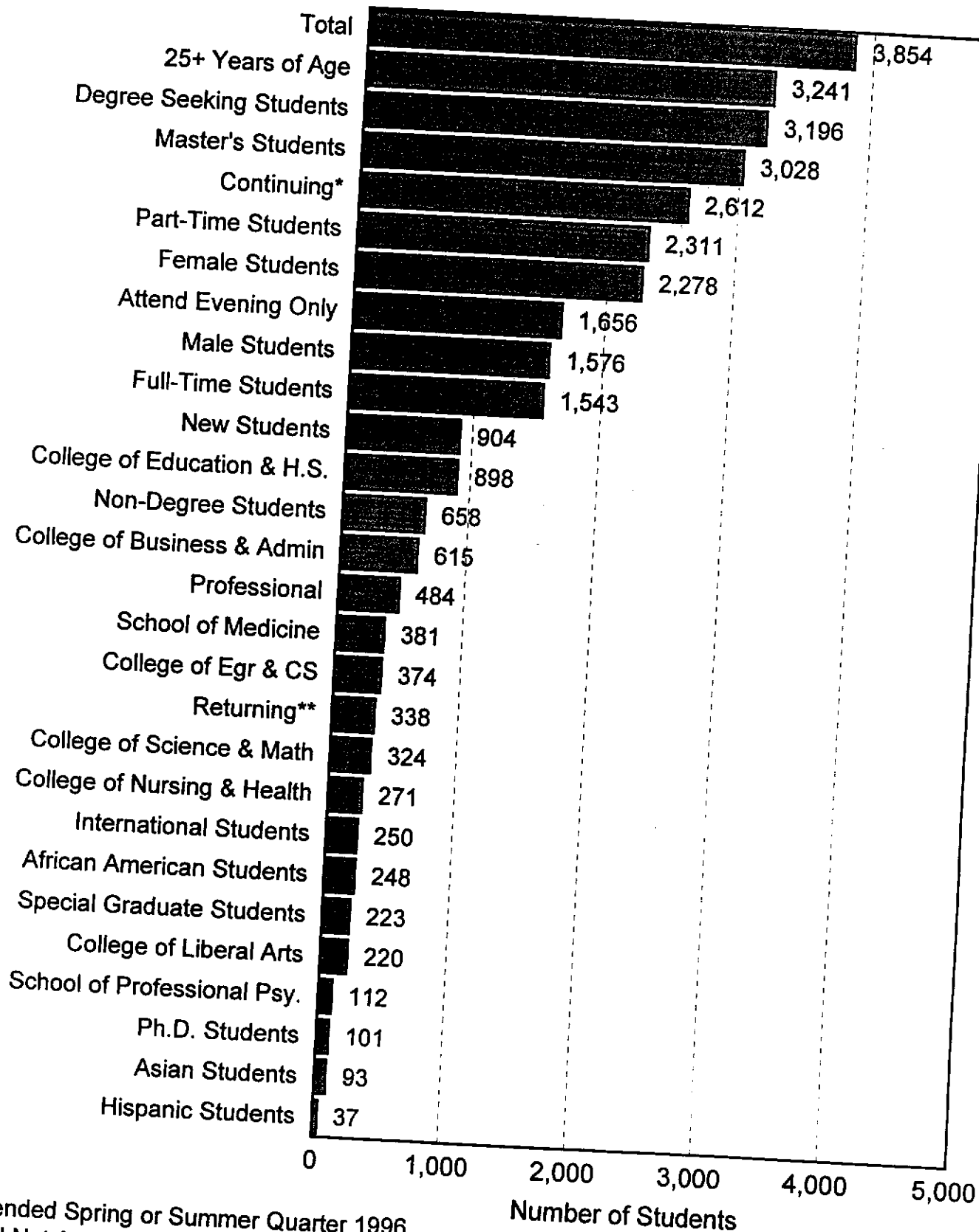

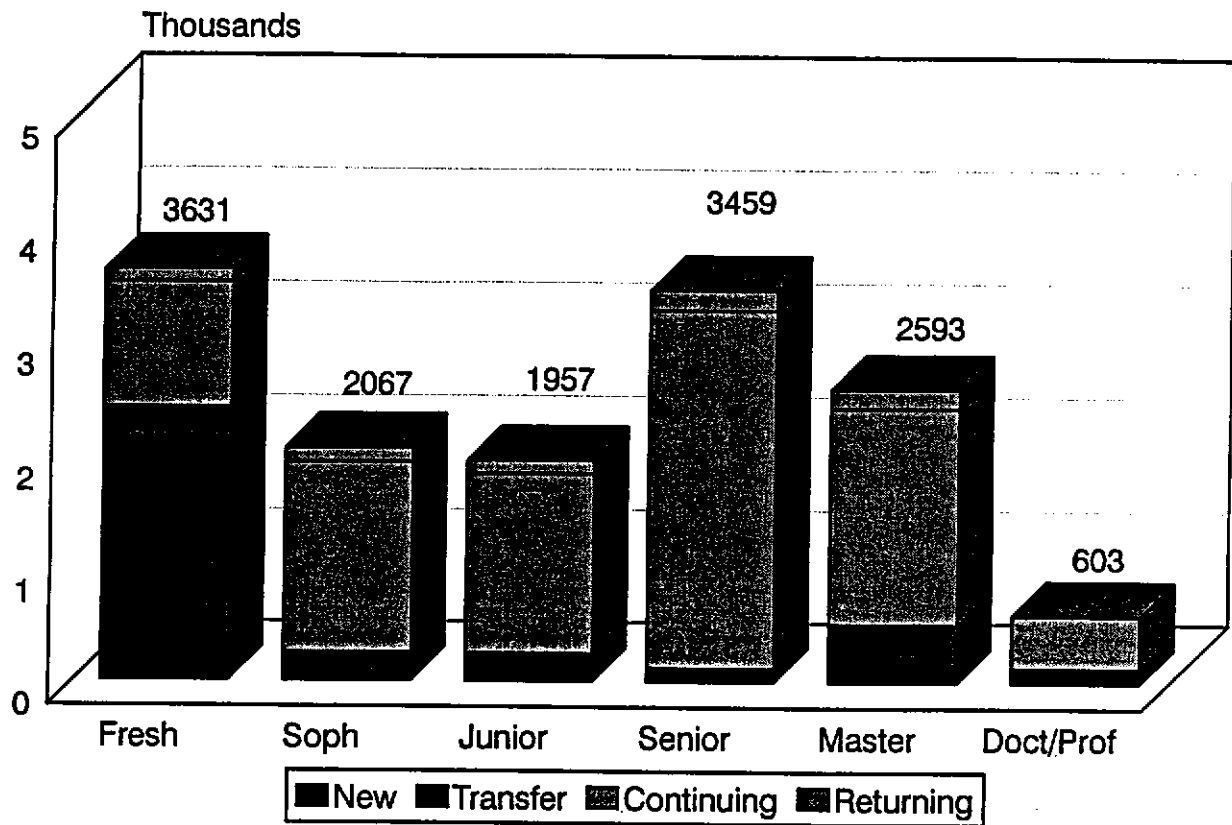

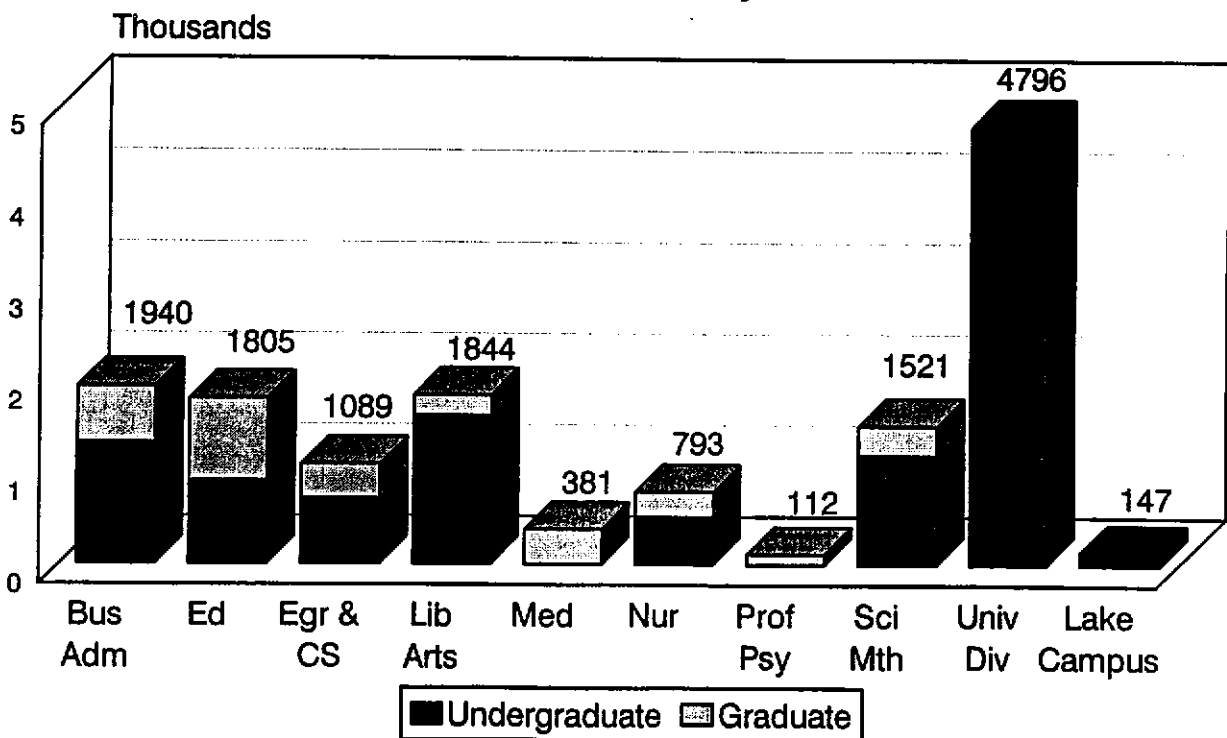

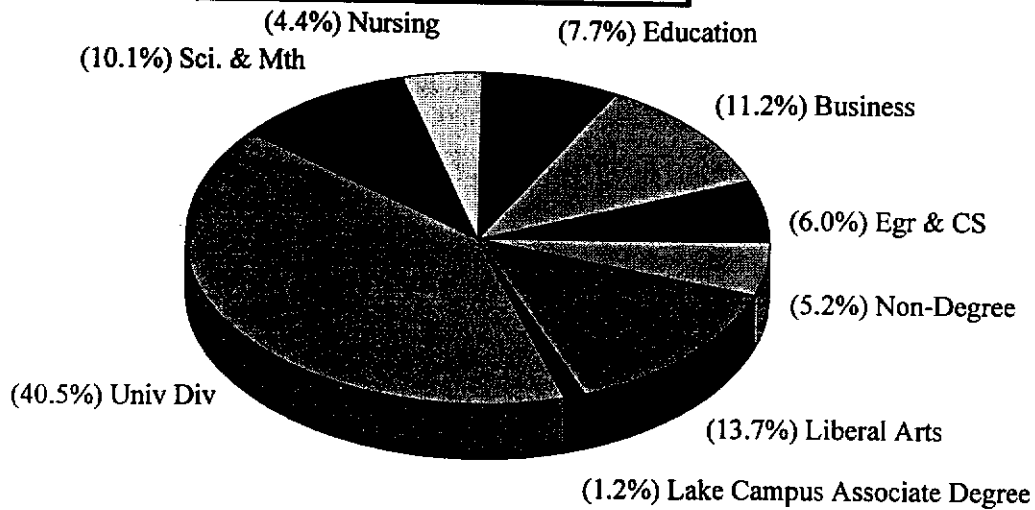

Graduate/Professional Enrollment by College

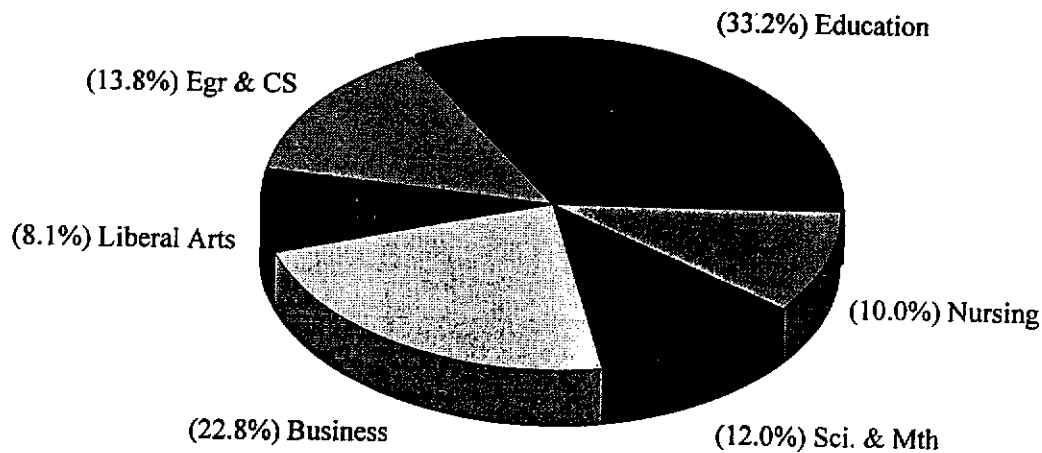

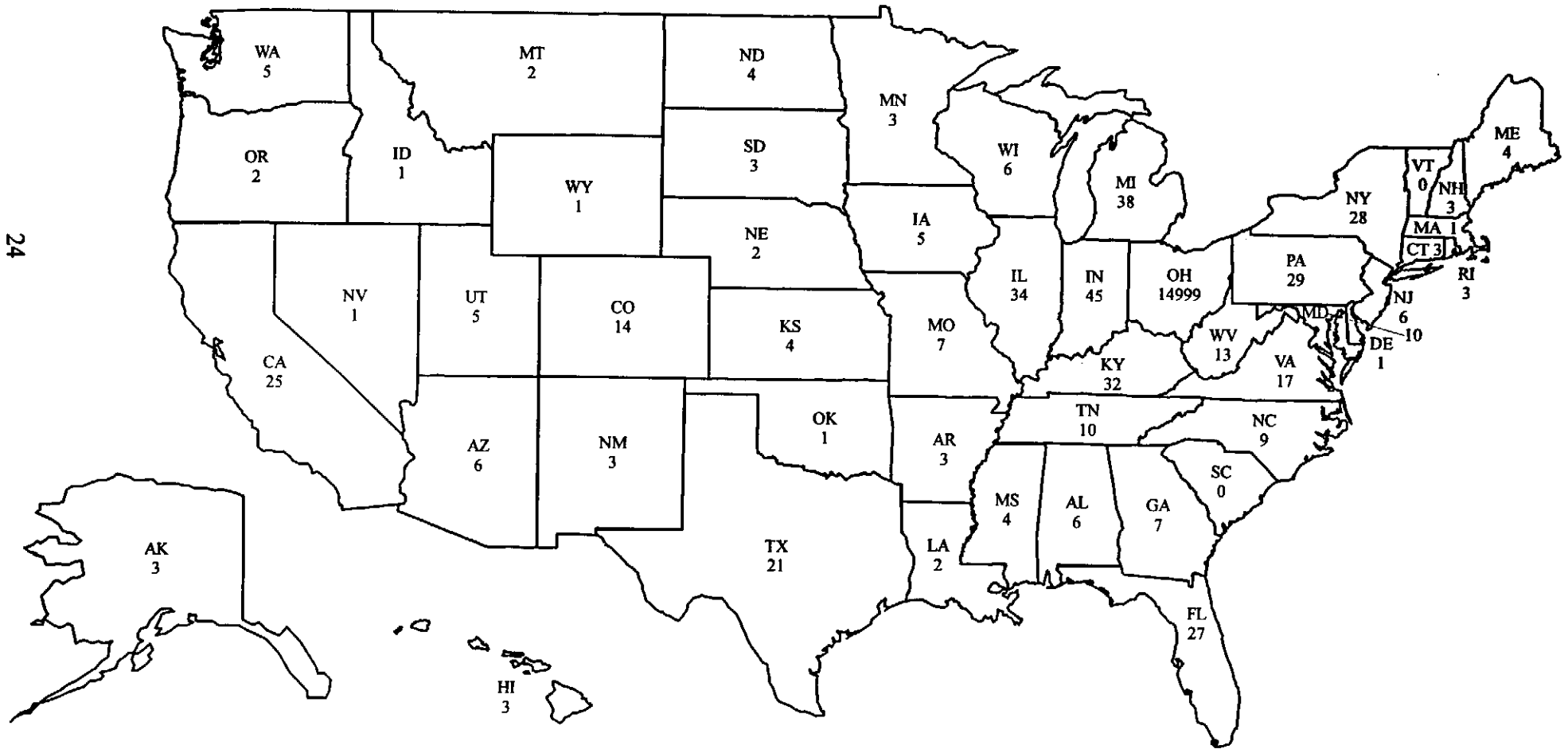

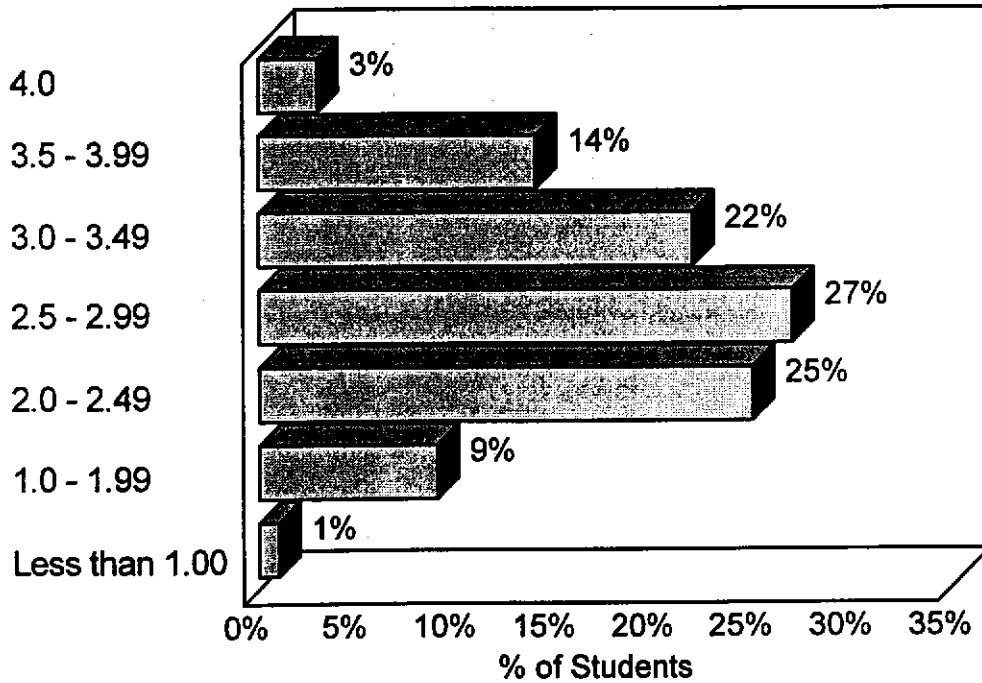

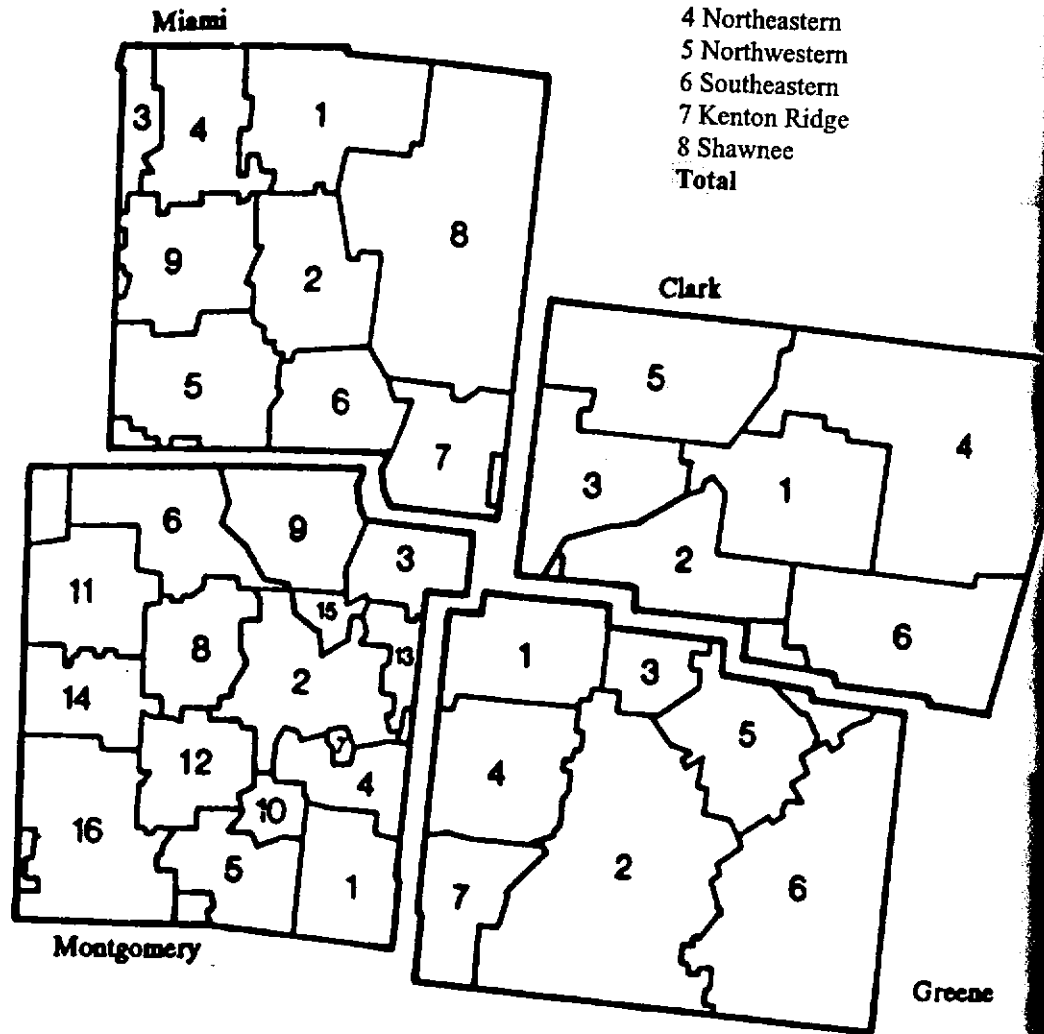

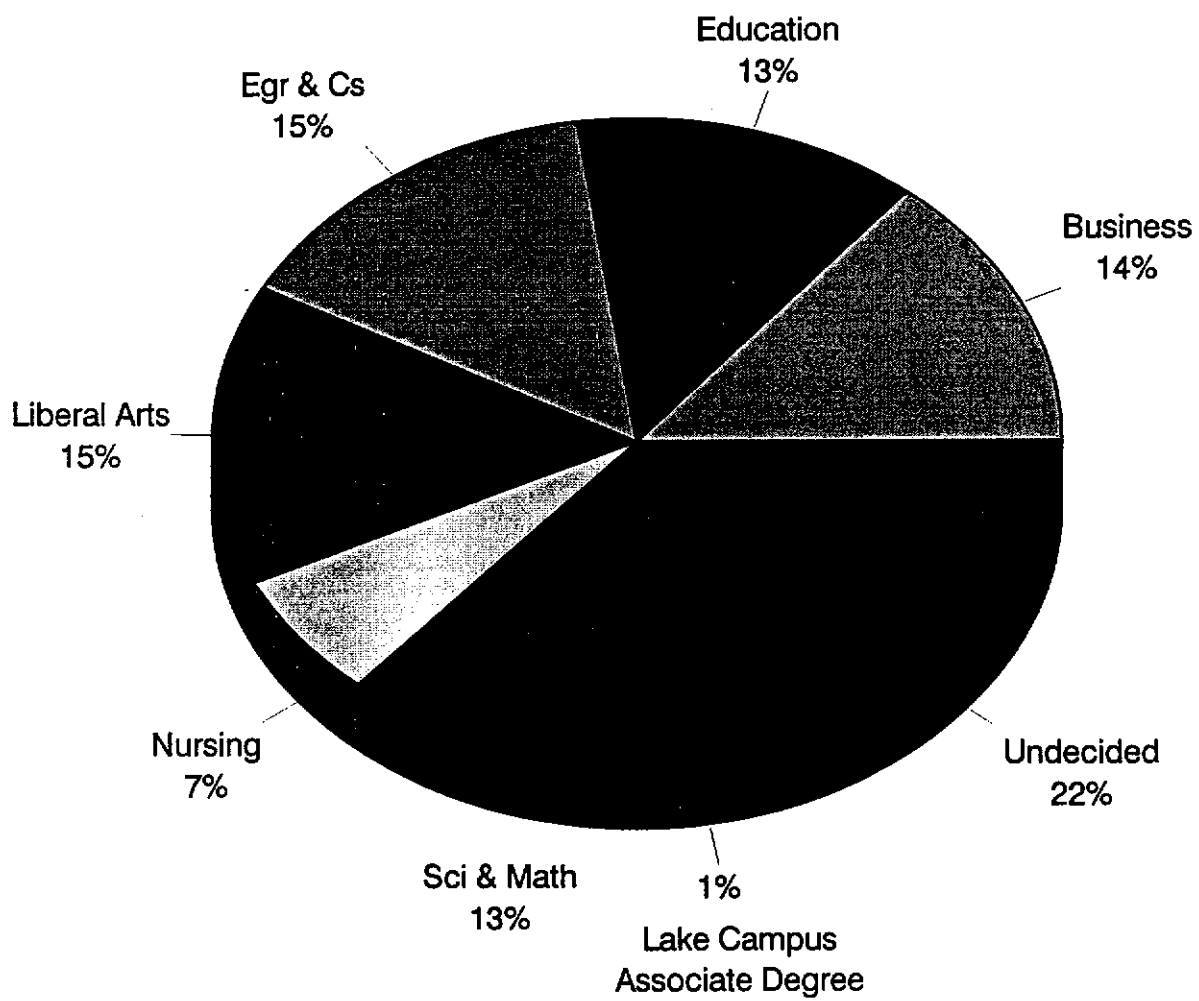

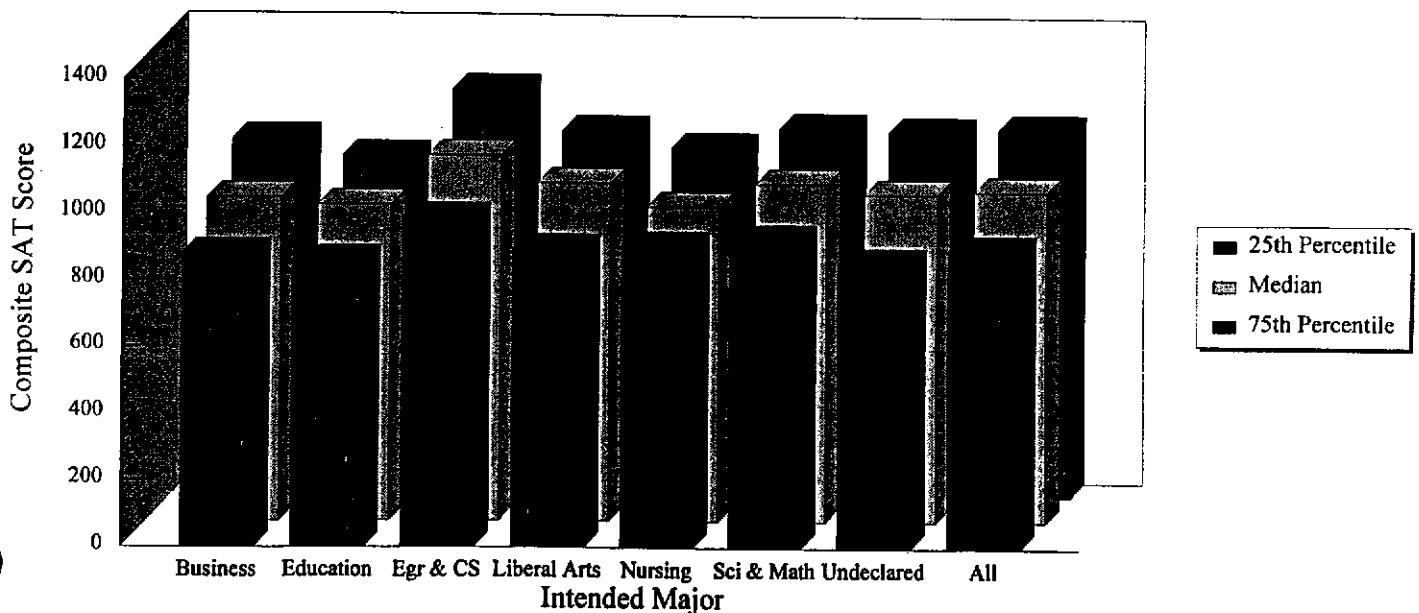

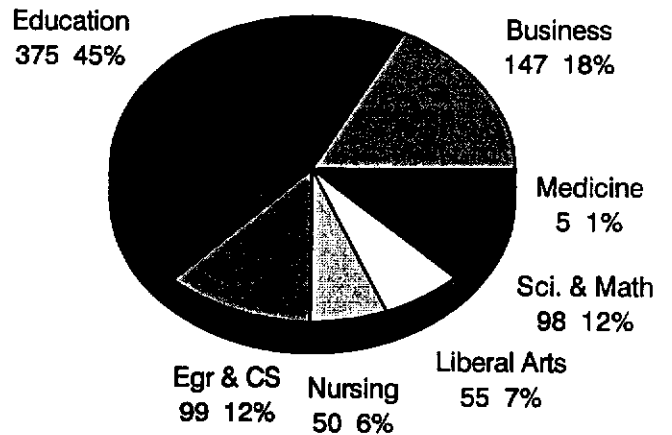


Bachelor's Degree
