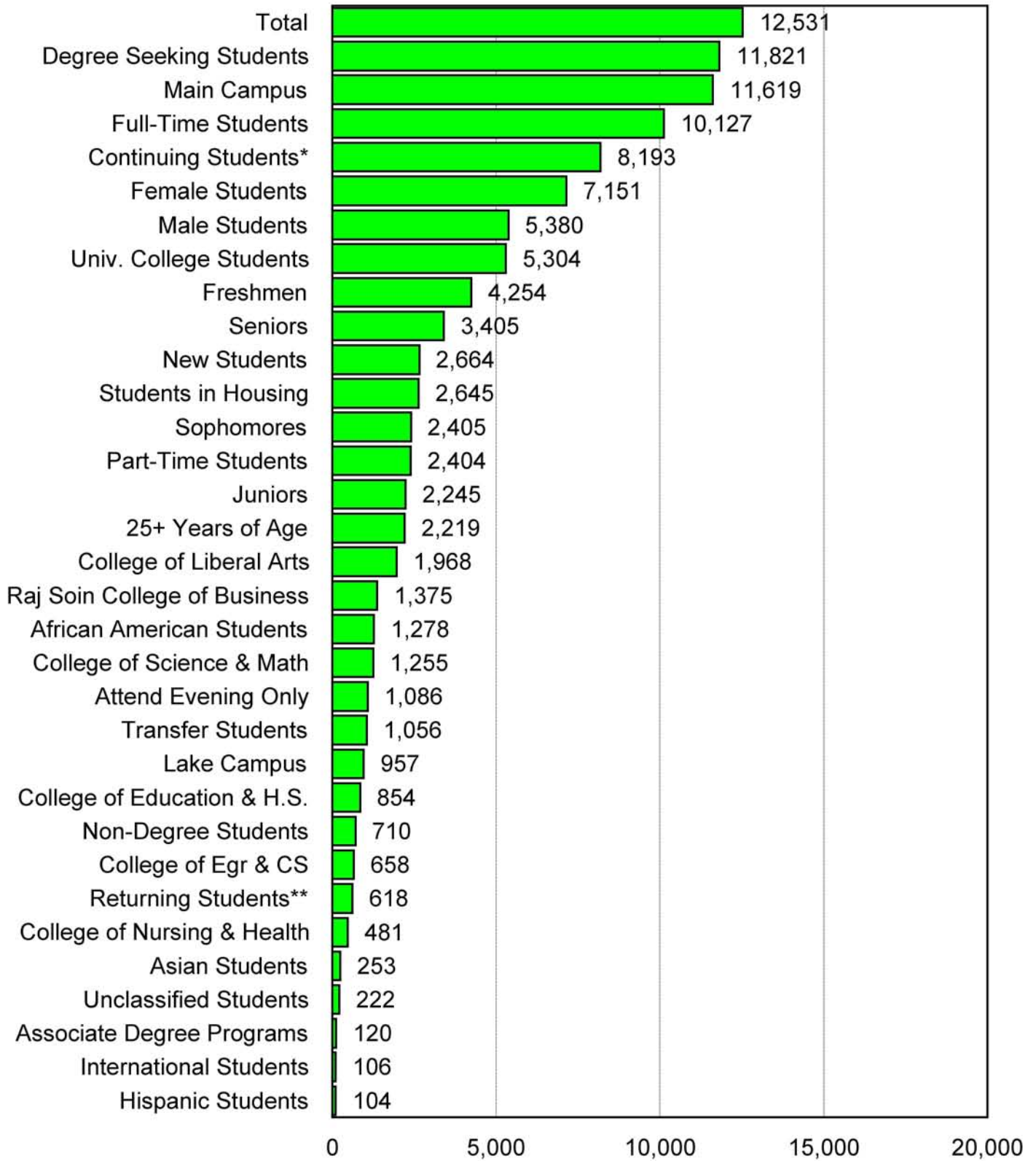

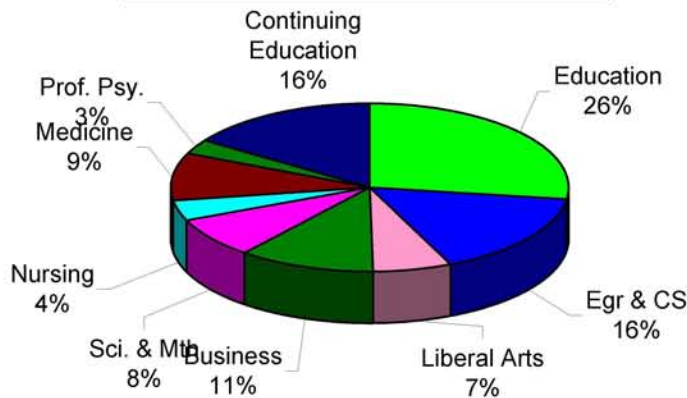

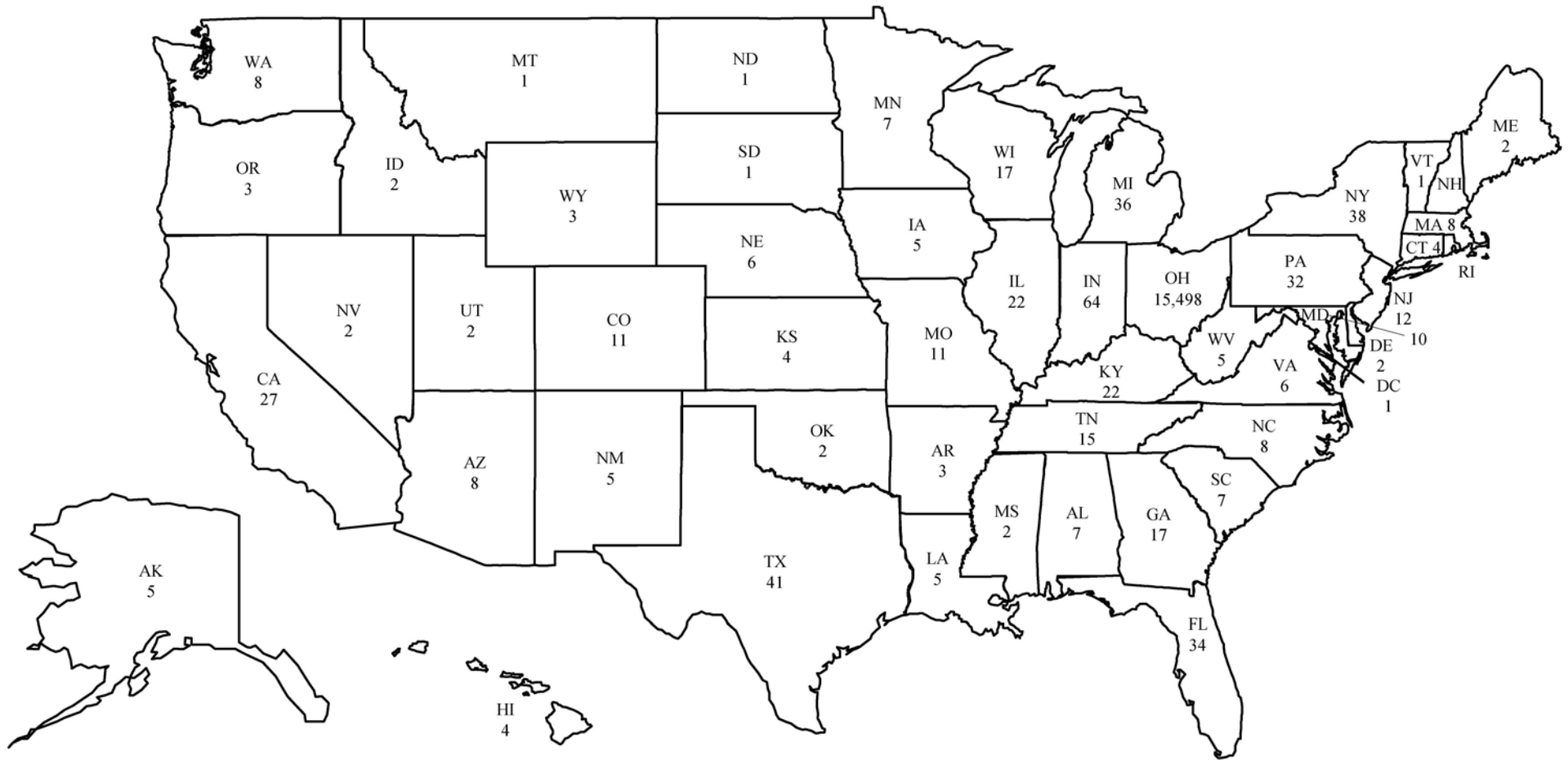

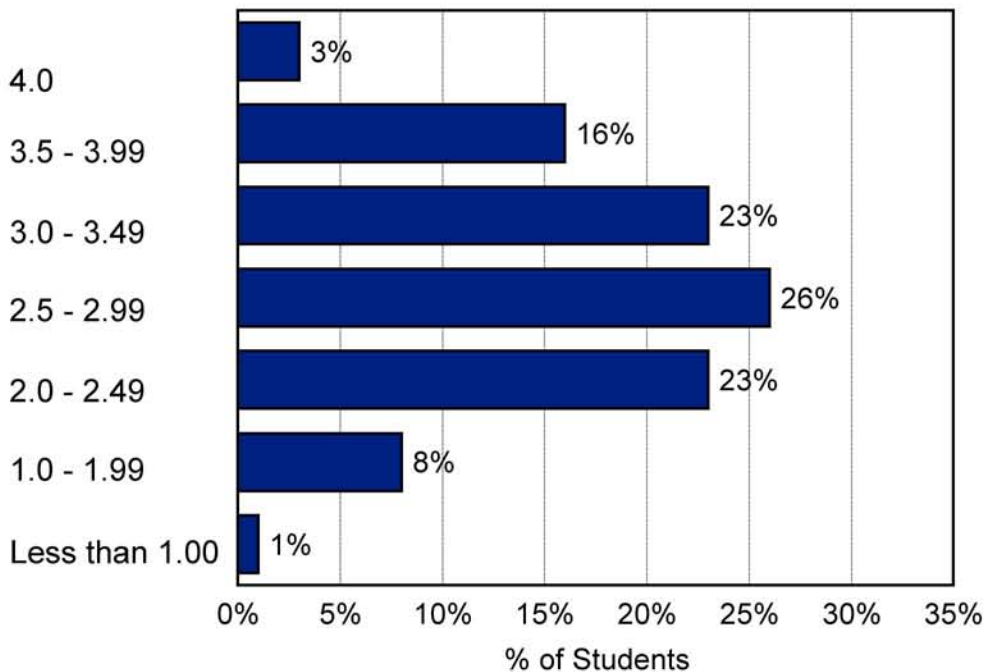

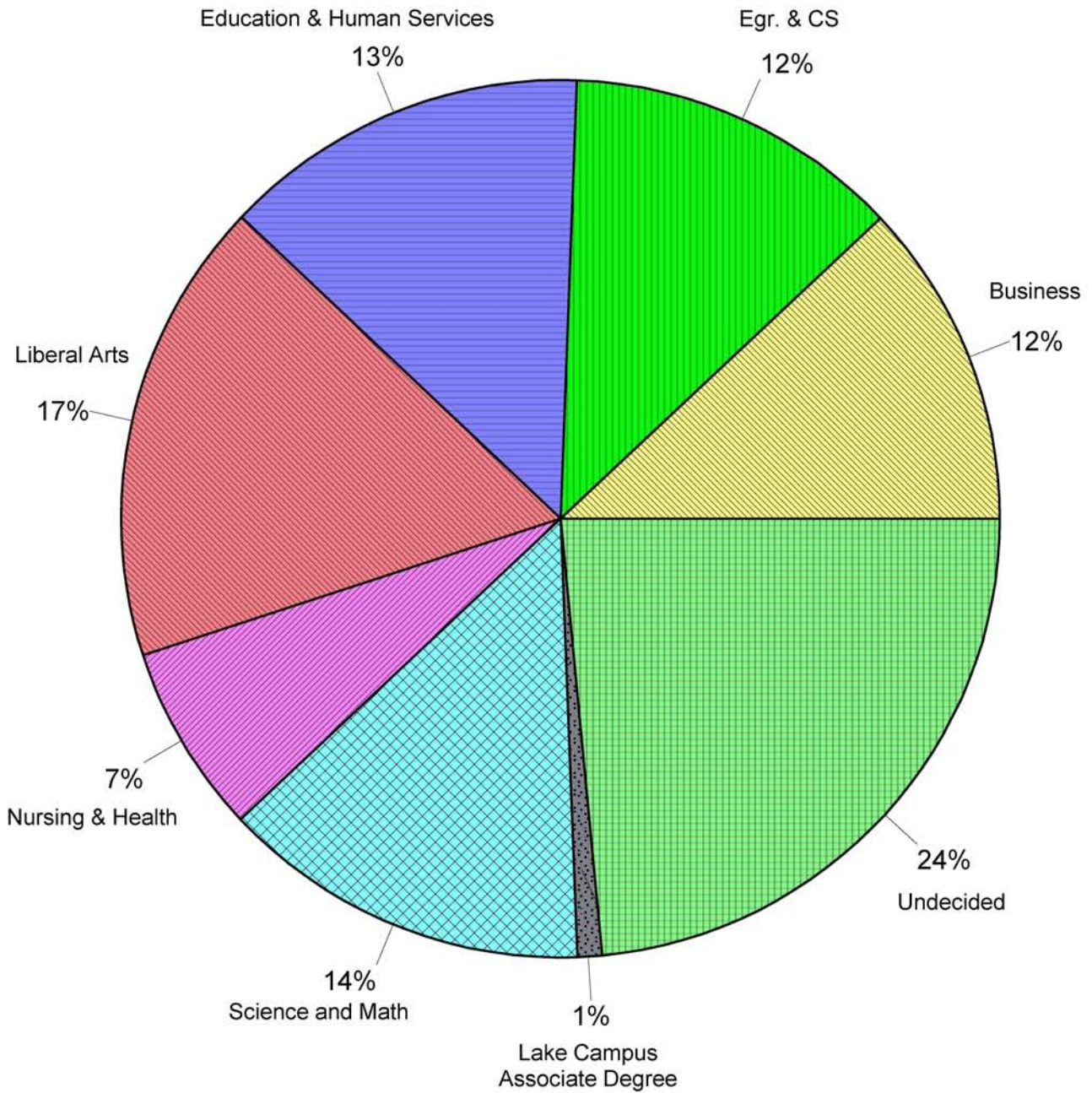

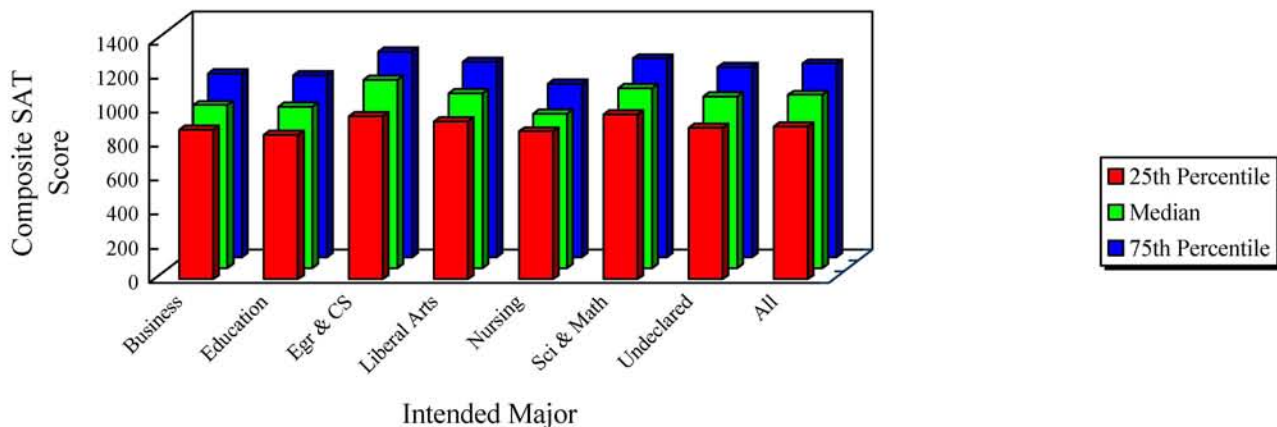

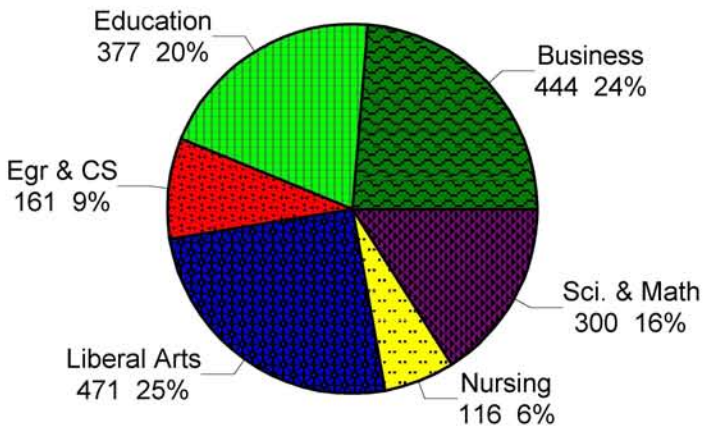

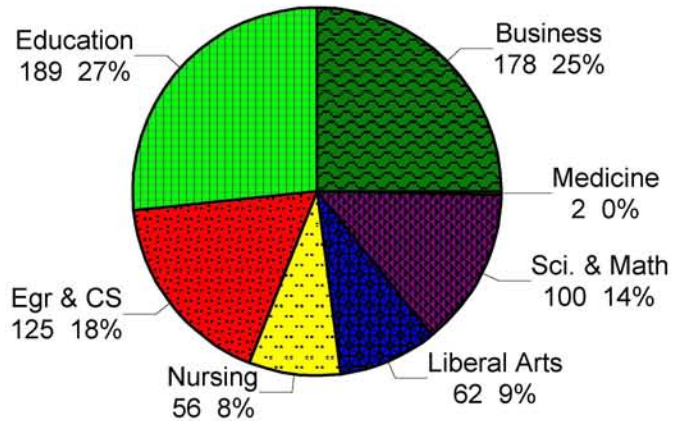


Bachelor's Degree

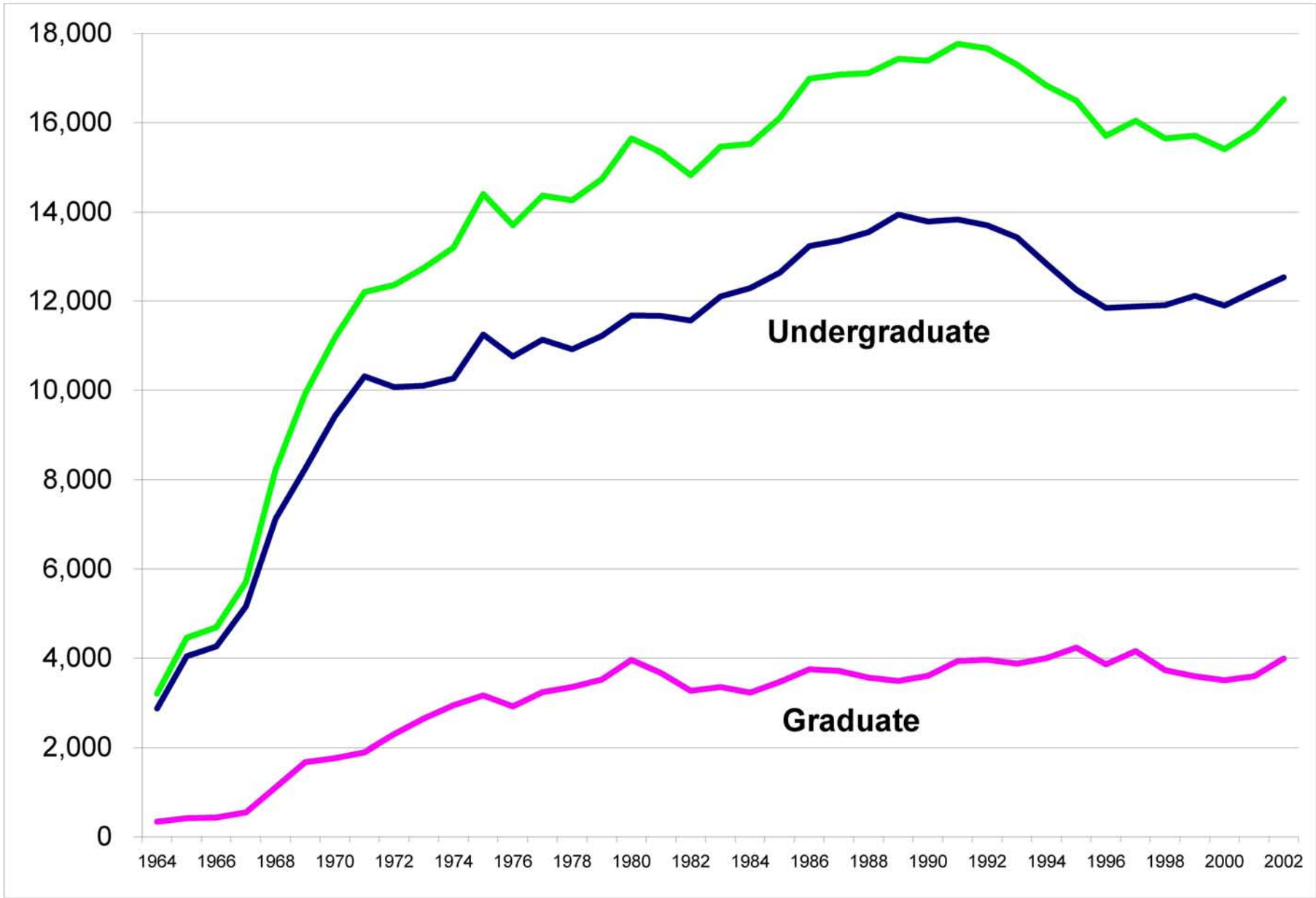
