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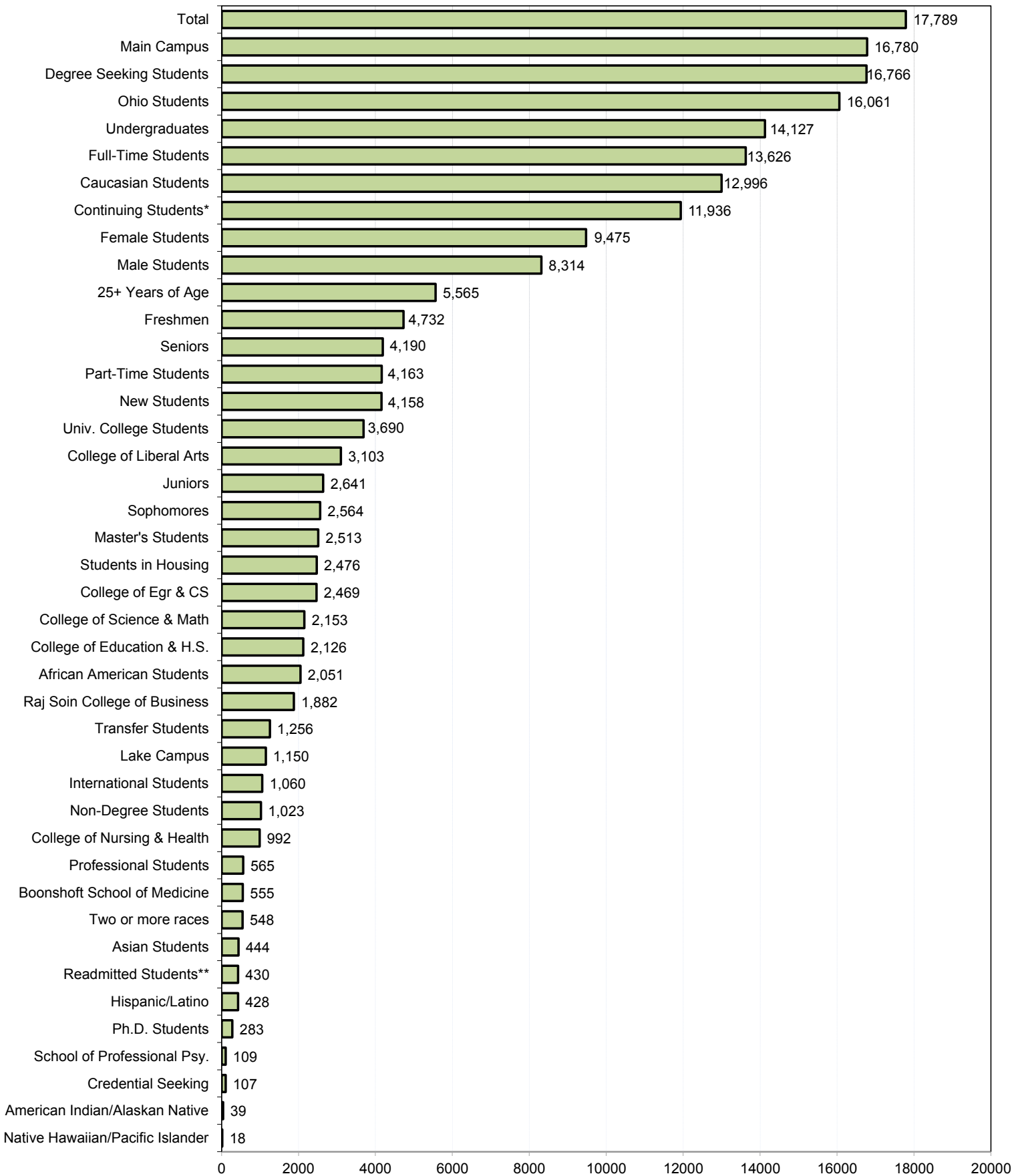

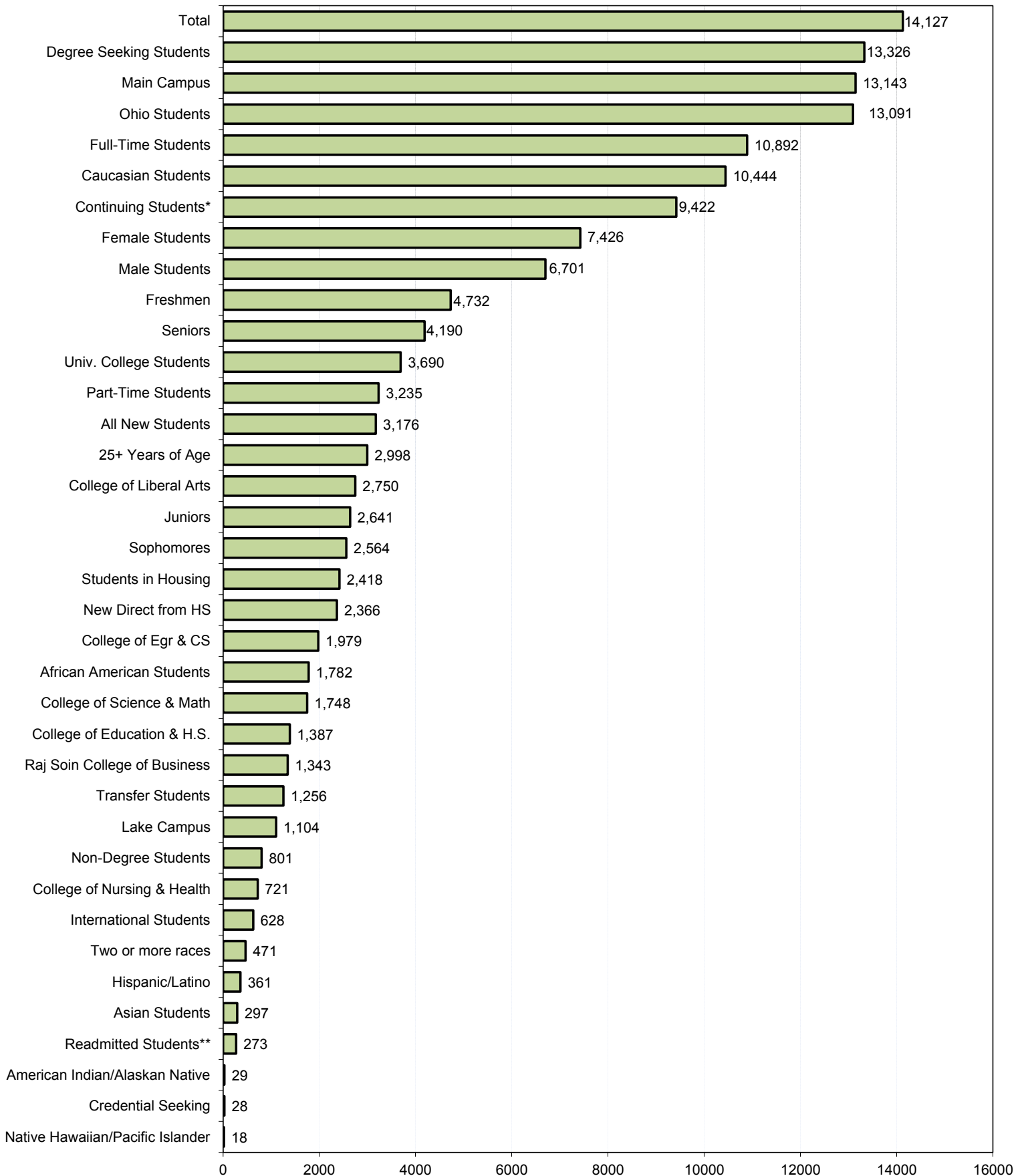

## Student Populations Undergraduate Students

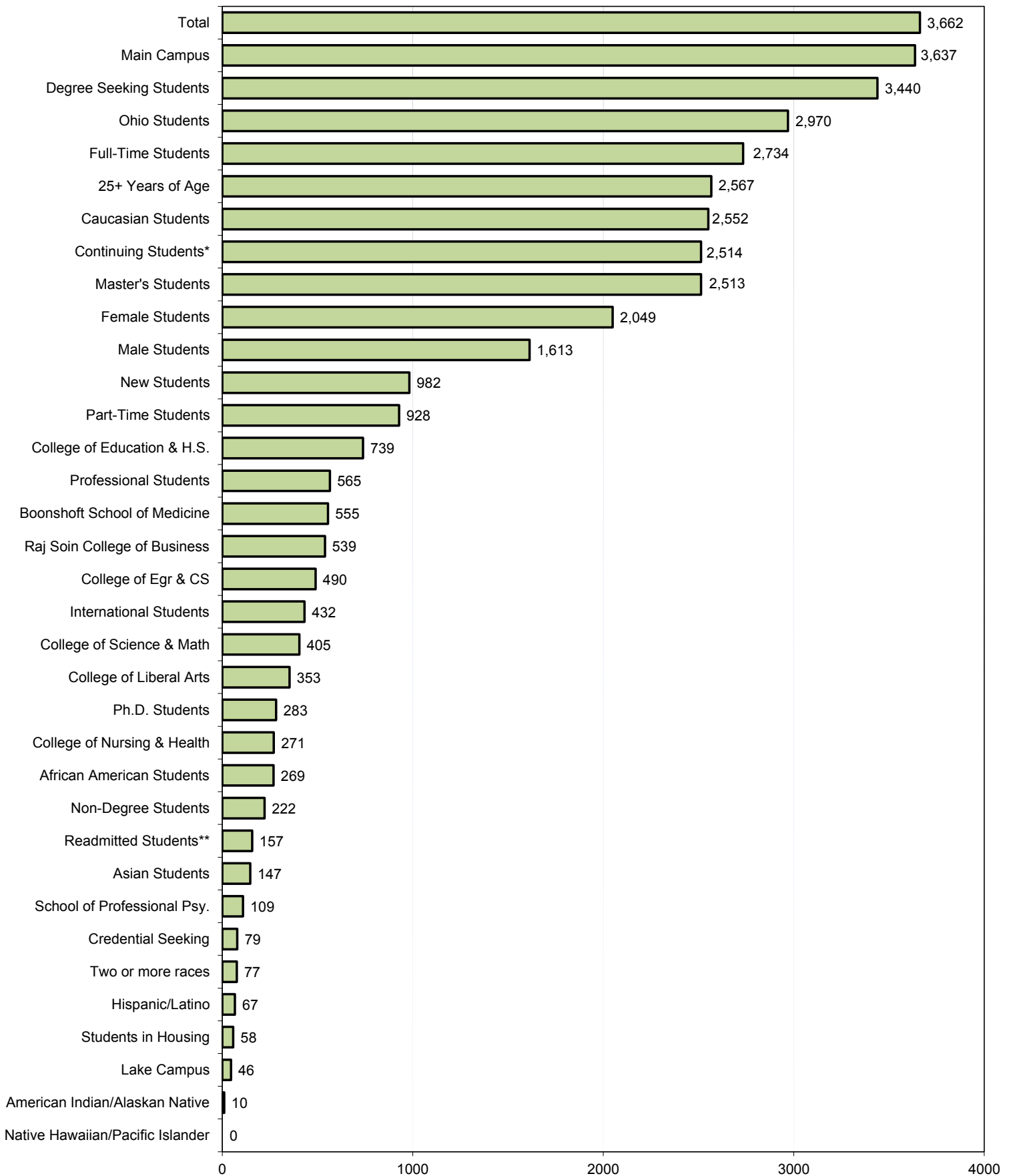

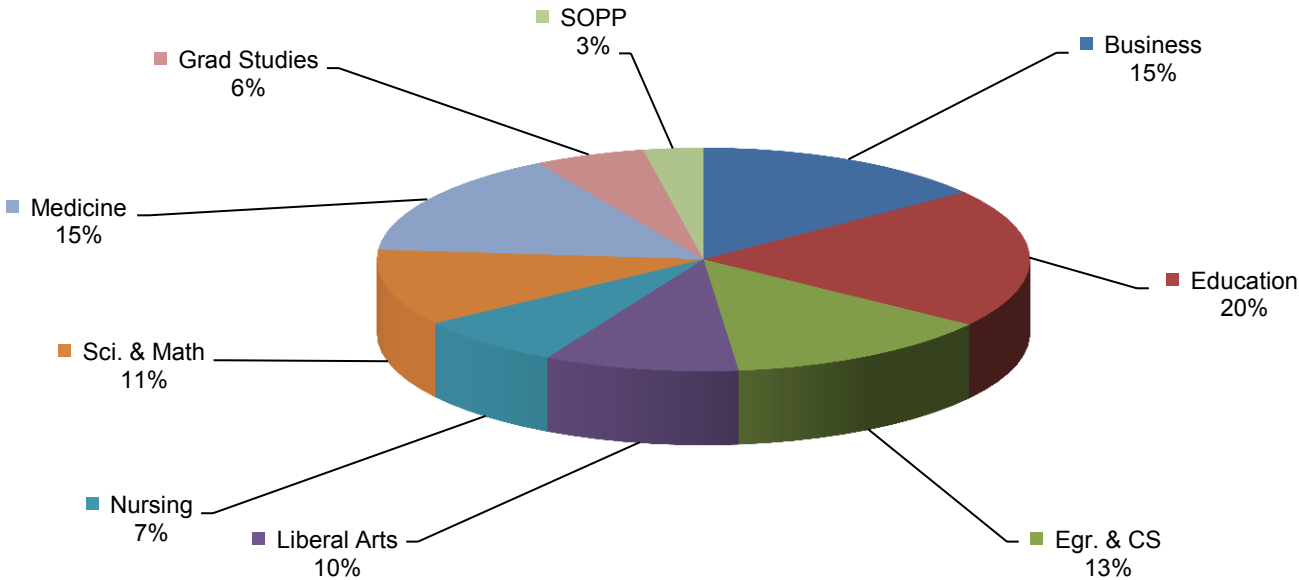

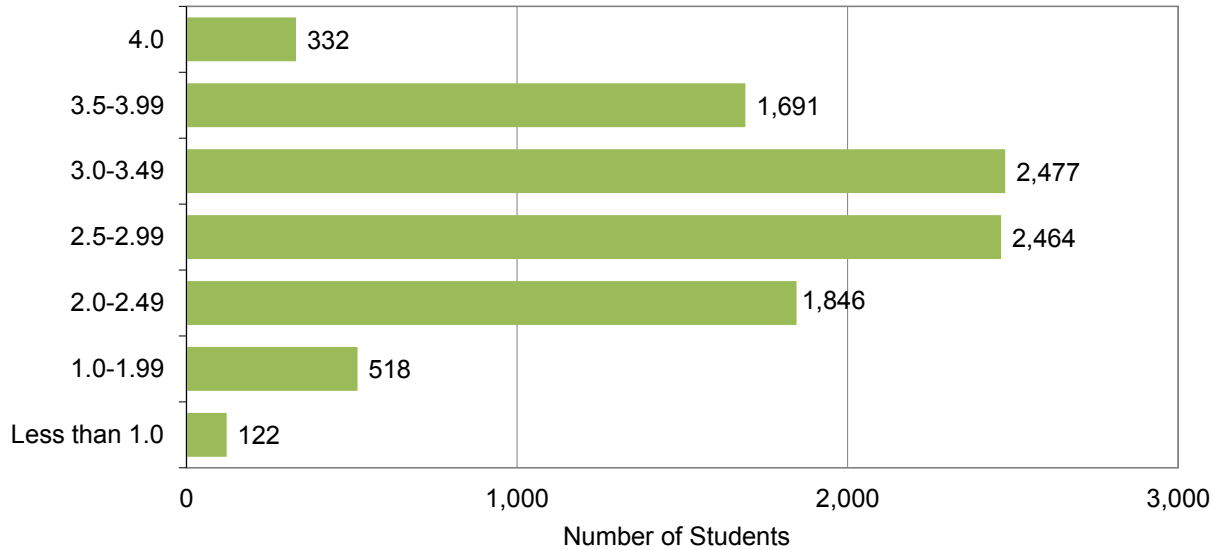

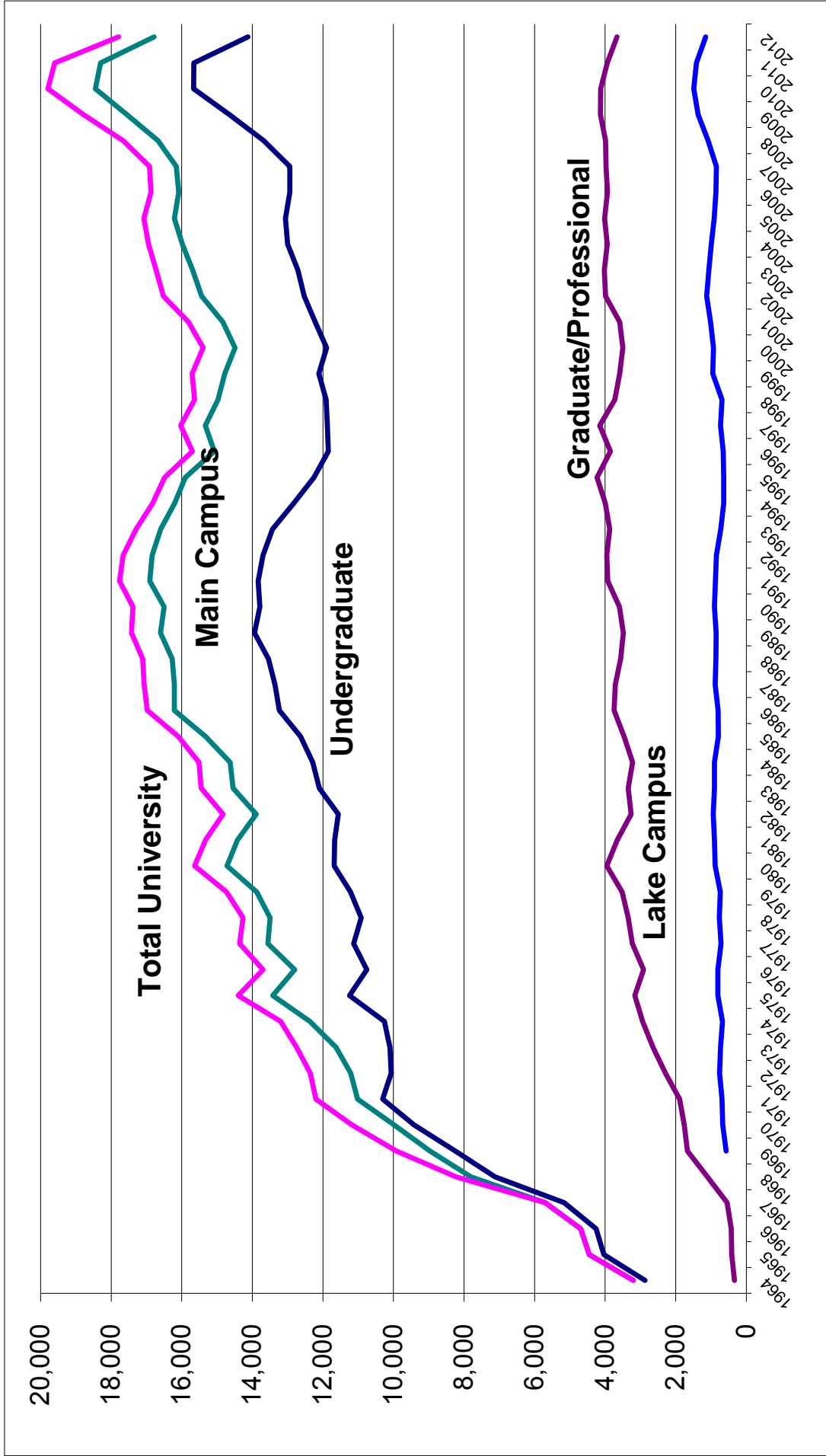

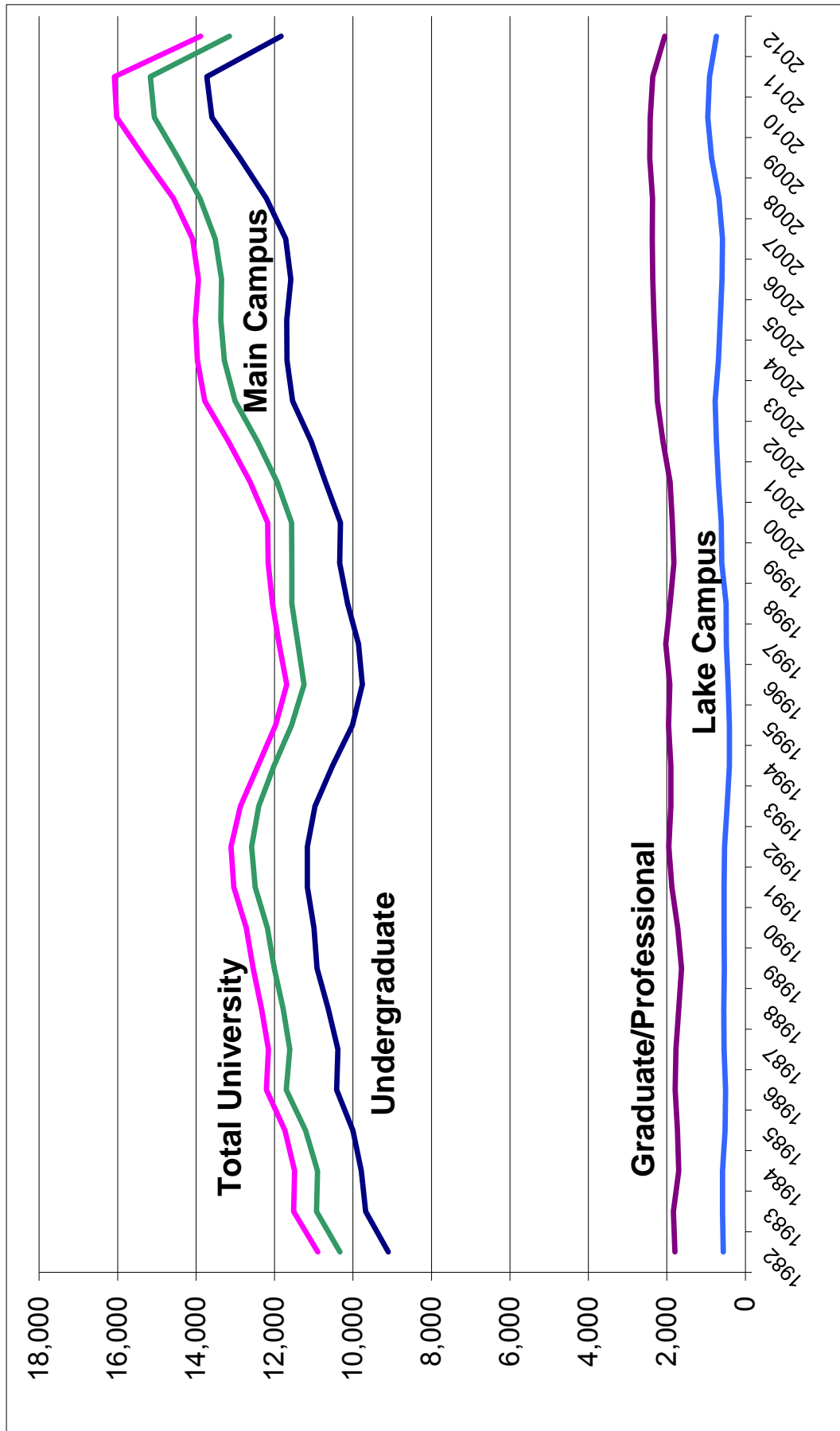

## Fall Term Full-Time Equivalents 1982 - 2012



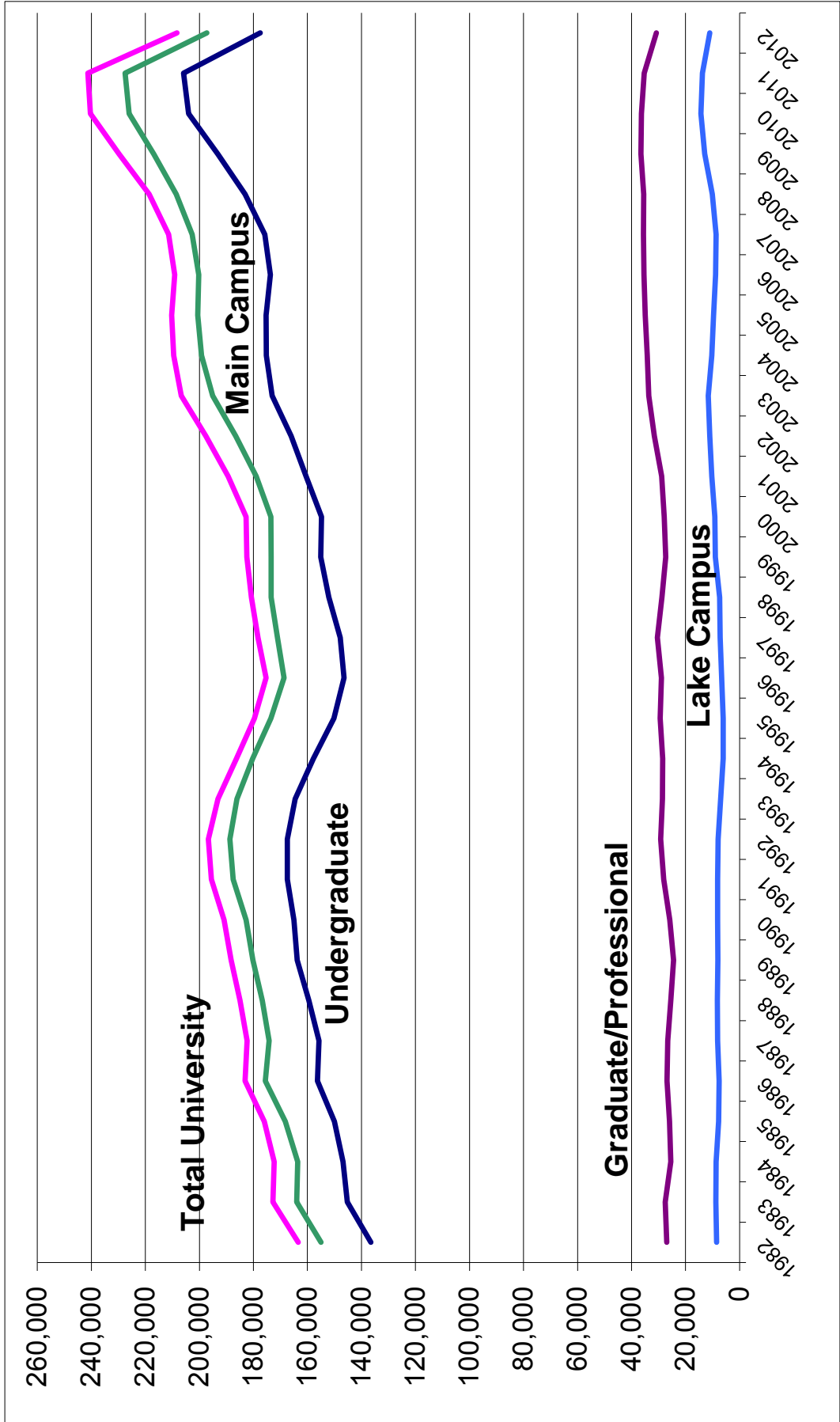
