we received yours of Monch 21st a day or two ago and should have answered it sooner but we were Washing and cleaning house and we thought we would get through and then write and now I hardly know what to write that would be interesting. I leaven from to days paper that the 44th have been in a big fight in Kentucky. The Rebs had two to one but our Ohio Boys whiped them and made them run after four or five hours hard fighting the loss on our side was about thirty there was two other Reg. engaged. The names of the helled and wounded was not given. Cap. Julleys writes home that the 44 th knew nothing about hard times untill they went into kentucky. we have had very unpleasant weather during

the Month of March I don't think there was than three or four pleasant days in the whole Month, and Sprie has come in Cold and rough but I hope we will have pleasant weather after a while. you say you sent us some petryfied wood in a letter but there was none in any of the letters that we got I heard that John Hawkins got one with some in . but I have not Seen it. School commenced yesterday in Antioch and they say there is about Seventeen new Students I don't know whether we well get any Borders this term or not. one of ours said he was a froud he would not get to come back. April 5th you see I did not get to junish this letter the day it was commenced I have not heard any thing more from Dayton I do not know whether they will accept quer proposition or not. Mary went To. Springpeld on Satturday and

was examined for Teacher and got a good Cirtificate. There are is your grades and she got nest to The highest they dont usually give new beginners Certifficates for more 8 than Six Months but they gave her re one for Eighteen Month's dont you think that was rather encourageing. t Ma Seever was over Saturday and says he will do his best to get her the School. Moory went to Malathcarts and staid all night and they t told her that The was at bixburg v in the 41th Oug. and John is Enginneer on one of the Goverment Railroads down there somewhere. the Copperheads have to heep pretty muna at present. Burnbeck has bent a squaid of them off to Fart Safayette we are having very stormy cold weather for the beason. well we did not get our Boarders this Jerm I am borry for it to, for it paid own table expenses

and for our wood. I saw Elen. Kalahan yesterday he is well encepting his hand he said he was looking for a letter from you. well I guess I will close, take care of your Self and write often, from your Mother C.
