WHEN the Western frontier was here or when the Western frontier was here or hereabouts, there lived in Wayne county a matron named Jenny Wiley. History records that Jenny Wiley was captured and carried into and how, after a time, she escaped and made her way back to Wayne county. Jenny's Creek was named for her. She left children and her descendants keep her





wiatt smith lice of Huntington but no-body I have been able to reach knows just when. Even a search of the records by Fred L. Perry and City Clerk George R. Heffley failed to disclose the in-formation. Those boys didn't look back far enough. I remember Pete Wiley as chief of police—sometime in the eighteen nineties.

SAMUEL BIERN remembers that when Mr. Wiley headed the police force, the Wiley family lived in a big white house where the city building now stands on the corner of Fifth Avenue and Eighth Street. where the city building now stands on the corner of Fifth Avenue and Eighth Street. The Bierns were neighbors and Sam plaved with the Wiley children about the Wiley barn. But Sam doesn't remember when it was or who was mayor. After exhausting a long list of possible informants, I decided to write these paragraphs anyway. I heard a good deal about Pete Wiley. He was a native of Wayne County and when he was young and youngish, would fight upon any provocation. Once, on election day, he had words with George Davis. Pete, by the way, was a Republican. George was a Democrat. They wanted to fight, but were not permitted to do so. Then and there they agreed to meet at a fixed hour the next morning at Fifth Avenue and Ninth Street. Both, appeared on schedule and they were having a lively catch-as-catch-can scrap when the police came and arrested them, together with several not-so-innocent by-standers.

PROBABLY Don Russell knows when Pete PROBABLY Don Russell knows when Peter Wiley was chief of police. I couldn't reach Don, but did learn from B. G. Dunkle that the 79-year-old Mr. Russell attended the Bridge Street Methodist Church last Sunday, and that he recalled to fellow-worshipers that he had attended Sunday School at that church 72 years before, to the day.

EVEN with the war time gasoline short-EVEN with the war time gasoline shortage Wayne County does not seem distant. There was a day when it seemed a far piece to me, but Huntington must not have seemed remote to the Wayne Countian of whom Samuel W. Perry tells, It was soon after Mr. Perry came to this region and located in Wayne County that a mountaineer came and said. "Mr. Perry, how would you like to go to Huntington tomorrow and see the circus?" "How," asked Sam, "will we get there?" "Just step over the hill," was the reply. DR. ERSINGTON also rebuked me about the Jeany Wiley reference here yesterday. He said; and proved by Hardesty's history, that Jenny Wiley lived in Tażewell County, Virginia, and not in Wayne County, when she was carried off by raiding Cherokees.
