## The Shelton Cemetery

A letter from Mr. C. W. Riffle, dated March 21, 1937. He said the old Shelton record was at Wilson's just west of Ridgeland Cemetery. He says an Ed? Shelton run the Wilson saw mill in Guyandotte, had some family trouble about 1909, joined the Coast Artillery of the U. S. Army and he hasn't heard of him since.

There is one marker with only S. S. on it.

He said there is a big beech tree - five feet in diameter that has on it "a group of carved initials dated back as far as 1800," some far up the tree. He says he has the names of the men who carried stones for the C. & O. R. R. They carried stones for James Dundas and a Childers - John? or Sam?
