Jon Robertson, dean

Jamaican-born maestro Jon Robertson, dean of the Lynn University Conservatory of Music, enjoys a distinguished career as a pianist, conductor and academician. He began his piano studies with Ethel Leginska at 7 years old and made his Town Hall debut in New York City at age 10. A graduate of The Juilliard School of Music, he studied piano performance

under Beveridge Webster, choral conducting with Abraham Kaplan at Juilliard, orchestral conducting with Richard Pittman of the New England Conservatory of Music and Herbert Blomstedt, former director of the Gweandhaus Orchestra (Germany). His conducting career spans the globe from symphony orchestras in Norway, China, Egypt, South Africa and Austria to the Redlands Symphony Orchestra in California, where he has been principal conductor since 1982. Robertson is former chair of the Herb Alfred School of Music at UCLA. He continues to guest-conduct and to perform in concert as a member of the Cole-Robertson Trio.

About the performers

ANDREW ANGELIN, bass

Born in New York City and raised in New Jersey, Andrew Angelin has enjoyed an exciting career as both contemporary and classical bassist. His performance credits range from the Vans Warped Tour to Carnegie Hall and his recording credits include Sony Music Studios, Magic Shop Studios and Portrait Studios. In 2008 Andrew earned his Bachelor of Music degree at Rutgers University-Mason Gross School of the Arts, studying under Tim Cobb, principal double bassist, Metropolitan Opera. Currently Andrew is pursuing his Master of Music degree at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music, continuing with Tim Cobb.

DELCHO TENEV, violin

Delcho began his music education in the Dobrin Petkov School in his home town of Plovdiv, Bulgaria. He later attended the Idyllwild Arts Academy and Indiana University. He has participated in several prestigious music festivals such as the Round Top International Music Festival in Texas, Spoleto Festival in South Carolina and Castleton Music Festival in Virginia. Delcho has appeared in numerous master classes and has collaborated with important music persons, most recently with the world renowned violinist Elmar Oliveira. Currently, Delcho is pursuing his master's degree at Lynn University in the class of Carol Cole.

CHIEN-I YANG, piano

Born in Taiwan and beginning her studies at the age of five, Chien-I has had a remarkable career as a classical pianist. She was admitted to the music department her senior year of high school and received her Bachelors of Music degree at Soochow University. She received her Masters of Music degree in solo piano at Lynn University and is pursuing her professional performance certificate also at Lynn. Her achievements include winning first prize at the Collage Byrd Piano Ensemble Competition and she was the winner of the Chamber Music Competition in Soochow as well as other prestigious competitions. She heads an accomplished 3 piece combo and plays a mean keyboard.

DANIEL LEON, French horn

Daniel was born in Costa Rica in 1984. He began his studies of horn performance at the age of 13. Daniel joined the National Concert Band, and worked as principal horn for four years. He also has worked at the National Institute of Music as assistant professor, and as horn player of the Costa Rican Brass Quintet and the Costa Rican Symphony Orchestra. Daniel graduated from Loyola University magna cum laude with a Bachelor of Arts degree in music as well as French horn performance. He has performed in music halls in Europe and South America. He is completing his master's degree in music performance at Lynn University under the tutelage of Gregory Miller.

RAUL RODRIGUEZ, French horn

Raul is a native of Honduras and started his musical studies at age 6. As a student, he won several competitions including the National Chamber Music Competition in 1997. Raul has an extensive orchestral experience touring the world, playing and teaching horn in the Americas, Europe, Australia and Asia. He has worked as a horn coach at the Youth for Youth Music Festival sponsored by UNICEF in Thailand. Raul also was a guest at the Mozart's International Festival and plays with Broadway Across America shows as well as the Miami Symphony and the Miami City Ballet. He is a full-time student at Lynn University studying with Gregory Miller.

JENNA McCREERY, cello

Jenna is a recent graduate of Swarthmore where she earned a Bachelor of Arts degree. She was introduced to the cello at age 6 by her mother, a Suzuki violin teacher. Jenna made her solo debut with the Hendersonville Symphony Orchestra playing Vivaldi's "Double Cello Concerto" with her father, Carlton McCreery. Jenna summers at the Brevard Music Festival, and served two seasons with the National Repertory Orchestra as assistant principal cello in 2009. Recently Jenna toured with Handel's Messiah Rocks and the Philharmonia Orchestra of the Americas. She is currently pursuing a master's degree in performance at Lynn University.

DARREN MATIAS, piano

A native of Tarlac, Philippines, Darren received his Bachelor of Music degree from the University of Santo Tomas Conservatory of Music. A sought-after soloist, he has performed with orchestras such as the Philippine Philharmonic, the Summit Music Festival and the UST Symphony Orchestras. Darren was the recipient of many awards such as the prestigious Benavides Outstanding Achievement Award and the Presidential Medal on Culture and Arts. He won first prize at the Widerman Piano Competition, National Music Competition and others. He is currently a graduate student at Lynn University under the acclaimed pianist Roberta Rust.

MARINA LENAU, violin

Marina completed secondary education in the Lysenko Music School for Gifted Youth in Kiev, Ukraine. She is the winner of The International Competition, XXI Century Art, in Kiev; The International Competition in St. Petersburg and the International Chamber Music Competition in Moscow. She has performed many recitals in Russian, Ukrainian, European, and American cities as a soloist. Marina has had solo appearances with the Kiev National Symphony Orchestra. She is currently completing her Bachelor of Music degree at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music with the world-renowned Elmar Oliveira

MATTHEW DAVIES, viola

Hailing from British Columbia, Canada, violist Matthew has been described as "thoughtful, deeply honest and a superb musician with intensity." He received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He has a master's degree from the New England Conservatory of Music, where his string quartet was the NEC honors quartet for 2008-09. Matthew led the viola sections of the NEC Philharmonic and the Boston Philharmonic. He also performed and brought classical music to schools in the Boston area.
