Born in 1975 in Córdoba, Argentina, Laura Cmet started to play the piano at the age of four. At the age of seventeen, she was awarded the degree of Conductor of Choir at the "Niño's Cantores" school. She studied orchestral direction with Mr. Carlos Giraud. She studied the career of "Musical Composition" at the University of Córdoba. When she was twenty-two years old, she was awarded her degree and got a prize for reaching the best average in her promotion.

She has conducted the *String and Wind Orchestra* from the Conservatory Superior of Music since 2005, having there an intense musical activity. Between 2010 and 2015 she was sub director of the *Symphonic Orchestra of the National University of CBA*, performing many concerts of symphonic repertoire from the XIX and XX centuries.

She has been working for twenty years as Instrumentation and Orchestration professor at the University of Córdoba in the career of Musical Composition.

She has been invited to direct the *Town Council's String Orchestra* and the *Symphonic Band of Córdoba*.

In 2015 she created the *High School Mark Twain Orchestra* where together with her team of musicians, she has implemented a completely new methodology for teaching string instruments. Today, the orchestra has four different levels and 180 students have found their place.

She has composed orchestral and camera pieces and arrangements of vocal and instrumental works.

In 2008 she was distinguished by "Bolsa de Comercio de Córdoba" as one of the *"Ten Outstanding Youngsters in the year"* because of her brilliant musical pathway and for being one of the only women director of Orchestra in the city of Córdoba.
