About the Artists:

Professor Laura Bossert is Setnor School of Music's new full-time professor of violin. Bossert is regarded as one of the most talented and most sought-after professors of our generation. As a violinist, violist, soloist, chamber musician, and pedagogue, she has gained a high reputation of being respected and virtuosic violinist today. Since graduating from Eastman School of Music, Professor Bossert has collaborated with a number of artists from Elmar Oliveria, David Jolley, Joseph Robinson, toured with David Amram and Chuck Mangione, and ensembles such as the Lark, Shanghai, and Muir String Quartet, Amelia, and Mirecourt Piano Trios.

Dr. Dan Sato is making his premier performance at the Setnor School of Music at tonight's performance. As a highly accomplished pianist who studied from the Frost School of Music, Dr. Sato's musical talent and teaching capabilities have gained recognition from both professionals of the industry and audiences alike. Dr. Sato sets himself apart from his colleagues by his incredible range of piano repertory that has ranged from over 35 recitals since college. Taught by some of the greatest pianists, Dr. Sato gives credit to his skill from Peter Coraggio, Frank Heneghan, Andre Watts, Judith Burganger, and Kevin Kenner. He is a frequent guest artist and professor at the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, Indiana University, Bloomington Florida Atlantic University, and the University of Miami.

Matthew VanDemark is a graduating senior from the Setnor School of Music with a Bachelor's Degree in Music Industry with Performance Honors with minors in Business Marketing and Music History & Culture. This will be his second premiere recital on the Setnor Stage. This recital marks the completion of 12 years of violin performance and four years of formal training at Syracuse University. He is also an active participant and leader in many organizations oncampus including Student Association, Alpha Phi Omega, and The Society for Collegiate Leadership & Achievement. In obtaining his musical degree, Matthew has completed/participated in more than five music ensembles at Setnor, over 161 credits of course dedication, 200 hours of community service, and was the winner of multiple scholarships.
