Liverpool Poets



Heliotrope

Clive Gillman's interactive installation takes its title from the heliotrope flower, a plant indigenous to Europe and North Africa, named after its tendency to follow the sun. Just as the heliotrope itself has its roots in ancient legend, Gillman's lucid and beguiling installation strikes a similar mythopoeic chord, combining iconic elemental imagery with a series of short but reverberant quotations from the French/Algerian writer, Albert Camus. The whole piece explores the intimate interplay between image and text, as well as the interplay between the natural landscape, and our attempts to reflect it, and rationalise it in language.

Before Foot & Mouth

My family is a farming family and I wanted to record our way of life before it was lost. Even before the outbreak of foot and mouth disease, farming was in difficulty. In the wake of the BSE crisis of 1996, farmers' lives had become harder. Some went bankrupt, some committed suicide, some could not afford to retire, most had greatly reduced incomes.

The photographs in this exhibition were taken from December 2000 until February 2001 when the Lancaster Auction Mart was closed due to the outbreak of foot and mouth. One of the main sources of inspiration for this work was Alastair Watson: the manager of the Auction Mart, who has constantly striven to bring a sense of hope back to the farming community.
