Dimensions Program to Host Kristan Seaford on Oct. 18

BOILING SPRINGS, N.C.— Wife, mother, former therapist, cancer survivor, and triple amputee will share her story at Gardner-Webb's Dimensions program on Tuesday, Oct. 18 at 9:25 a.m. The event will be in Stewart Hall of Tucker Student Center, located on GWU's main campus, and is free and open to the public.

Kristan Seaford of Matthews, N.C., wife of 15 years and mother of five children, came down with what seemed like a routine flu in 2013. In actuality, she had a life-threatening condition called septic shock. It would take a miracle from God to save her, and that is exactly what happened. Despite being a triple amputee, Seaford is living life to the fullest, and is now a motivational and faith-building speaker.

“Kristan's story demonstrates God's power to bring the good out of bad situations so that others might see God's glory,” explained Dr. Tracy Jessup, vice president of Christian Life and Service and senior minister to the University.

Seaford's experience has increased her own faith in God, and she strives to share His love, power, and grace with every person she encounters. Her speeches have not only uplifted individuals, but have inspired them to go and conquer their own struggles.
