It is important that all residents of Tile Lake who are registered in the Selective Service make sure that they have complied with all of the provisions of the Federal Law. The law requires that the local Draft Boards be notified of any charge of address. Anyone who came have from any other center whould notify the Draft, Board "back home" of the change of address, if this had not been done before.

The law also requires that all male citizens register when the reach the ge of 18. If there are any here who have no Legal Aid.
